



COMMISSION'S STATEMENT OF ACCREDITED STATUS

Alliance Theological Seminary has been accredited by the Commission on Accreditation (COA) of The Association of Theological Schools since 1990. The school's accreditation was last reaffirmed in winter 2022, based on an institutional self study report and an onsite evaluation visit by a committee of peer and public reviewers. The school's current period of accreditation expires March 31, 2029.

The school's current status of *Accredited on Warning* means the school substantially meets the COA Standards of Accreditation but is at risk of not meeting one or more standard(s), specifically those dealing with the following issue(s): Resources (Financial). The school must demonstrate within two years that it fully meets all standards or the Board will place the school on probation.

The school is approved to offer the following degree(s): MDiv, MA (Biblical Literature), MA (Biblical Studies), MA in Intercultural Studies, Master of Professional Studies, DMin

The school has notified the Commission that the following approved degree(s) will be discontinued (i.e., to be deleted when the last student has exited the program): MA in Counseling

The Board has granted approval for the school to offer distance (online) education at the following level: Comprehensive (Half or More of a Degree)

The school is approved for the following additional location(s) offering half or more of a degree:

Hato Rey, PR

The additional location at Hato Rey, PR is approved to offer full master's degrees and the full Doctor of Ministry degree.
