



## COMMISSION'S STATEMENT OF ACCREDITED STATUS

Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary has been accredited by the Commission on Accrediting (COA) of The Association of Theological Schools since 1940. The school's accreditation was last reaffirmed in summer 2021, based on an institutional self-study report and an onsite evaluation visit by a committee of peer and public reviewers. The school's current period of accreditation expires July 31, 2031.

The school's current status of *Accredited in Good Standing* means the school meets all applicable COA Standards of Accreditation. The school demonstrates educational quality and financial stability and provides evidence that its student learning outcomes are appropriate, rigorous, and being achieved. The school has no public sanctions (i.e., warning, probation, or show cause).

The school is approved to offer the following degree(s): MDiv, MA (Theology), MA in Biblical Counseling, MA in Christian Education, MA in Church Music, MA in Missiology, MA in Worship Leadership, Master of Music in Church Music, Master of Music in Worship Leadership, MTS, ThM, DEdMin, DMA, DMin, EdD, PhD

The school is approved to offer distance (online) education at the following level: Comprehensive (Half or More of a Degree)

Beginning June 2015, the Board of Commissioners approved the school to offer coursework in all its PhD program specializations (except music) through synchronous online delivery; initially approved as a three-year experiment, the Board has since granted ongoing approval (June 2018).
