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THE ASSOCIATION OF THEOLOGICAL SCHOOLS

The Association of Theological Schools in the United States and Canada is the established accrediting agency for graduate theological education. Tracing its origins to 1918 when formal consultations on theological education were begun, the Association now numbers almost 200 institutions reflecting the diversity of the religious communities and university relationships in the two national communities. Its purposes include, within a general mandate for the improvement of theological education, the establishment of standards and the accreditation of institutions, serving as a forum for shared interests, and the consideration of issues among members and between members and related agencies. In the exercise of its standard setting duties, the Association has maintained a list of accredited schools since 1936. The Association also publishes annually a Directory of Theological Schools.

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INTRODUCTION

This is the twelfth Fact Book published by the Association of Theological Schools in the United States and Canada. The data are supplied by the member institutions, which this year number 194. The enrollment data, employment statistics, and salary information are current -- for the 1980-81 academic year. The financial data and library information are the latest complete year audited reports, 1979-80. The per student revenue and per student and per faculty expenditure information utilized Fall 1979 enrollments and employment for Fall 1979. This student information is reported in Table A, and the faculty data are available in last year's Fact Book.

The basic format of these Fact Books has remained unchanged, although some additional data have been sought from time to time. Hence some tables will be new, reflecting these changes. The most recent additional information is enrollment for Native American students. These data have not yet been computerized, but they are reported in summary form in the text. Additional sex/race/minority data are also included across the years.

Table A lists all member schools and identifies the basis for the classifications in the appendices. Table B reports enrollment at regular intervals since 1956.

This year a new table has been added, Table B-2. It provides membership information in each of the biennial periods since 1936 when the Association was incorporated. The dates when individual institutions either joined or left the membership are provided. Parallel information and analysis of trends in membership also appear in the text for the first time.

Certain arbitrary definitions have been necessary with respect to these classifications. For example, a seminary is classified as part of a university only if the larger institution possesses at least two other professional schools or departments. Schools are classified as related to a cluster only if the

relationship includes at least two other seminaries. Denominational groups of schools are sorted and reported publicly -- in the Fact Book -- only if the denomination maintains at least four institutions which are members of the Association. Because the computer cannot accommodate dual denominational relationships of some schools, each has been classified on the basis of the primary student body membership. Thus, Louisville Presbyterian is included in the United Presbyterian category, Andover Newton in the United Church of Christ, and Trinity Lutheran in the American Lutheran group. Neither Bexley Hall nor Berkeley Divinity School, Episcopal seminaries, are included in the Protestant Episcopal data because of their relationships with Colgate Rochester and the Yale Divinity School respectively.

In 1980 the Association divided its Associate Member category into two classes of membership. Those moving toward accreditation at a rate which has been confirmed officially by the ATS Commission on Accrediting are now known as Candidate for Accredited Membership institutions. The remaining group continues to be designated as Associate Members. In all tables presenting size/status data both the Candidates and Associates are identified as "Other."

Finally the text has been prepared to report and emphasize the most important data. Factual description is the purpose. No value judgments about size, mode of financing, patterns of expenditure, or other matters are intended. Each reader is invited to make his/her own judgments on these matters in the light of the data presented in reference to his/her own perspectives on theological education.

As in the past, all salary scales have been edited to preserve confidentiality. Hence, any category with less than three persons has been eliminated.

Those included herein have been abbreviated to provide the most essential data--per student income and expenditures on a size/status basis and for denominational groups of schools. ENROLLMENT

Fall 1980 enrollment data demonstrate once again that theological school students do not necessarily conform to the patterns implicit in the demographic statistics. It has been anticipated for some time that the falling birthrate would bring significant reductions in undergraduate student populations, inevitably having a negative influence on schools of theology. Thus far none of this has come to pass. The Chronicle of Higher Education sampling for Fall 1980 shows a probable +3.8% increase in total higher education enrollments over the preceding year, compared with the National Center for Education Statistics' estimate of +3.2%. And, even more surprisingly, the increase is primarily in undergraduate level students, since the Council of Graduate Schools reports only a +1.0% growth in graduate enrollments this year.

Table 1 provides these data for theological schools in the years since 1969.

While the 1980 increase of +2.4% is the second smallest in the eleven year period, it nonetheless exceeds the growth of all graduate schools noted above. Table 1 also contains the number of member institutions covered by these reports in successive years, and it is obvious that the ever increasing size of the

membership diminishes the import of these total enrollment numbers. However, in only one year -- 1972, when the growth was at its lowest ebb, +0.7% -- did the inclusion of two new member schools totally account for the total increase, and more. Without those two new members, the enrollment would have actually decreased in that year.

Tables 2 and 3 do provide precisely comparable enrollment information. Despite some mergers during the 1970/1980 decade and nine institutions closing

operations, the same 161 member schools showed a +51.6% growth in the period. Since total ATS enrollment in the decade grew only +59.7% -- including the new member schools, it is obvious that more than eighty-five percent of this growth is real. It has happened in the long-time member schools. Table 3 provides parallel data for the five-year period, 1975 to 1980, in the same institutions. Here the growth indicated is +20.3%.

The above comments pertain solely to total enrollments. Please examine the appendices, particularly Tables C-1, D-1, and E-1 for the distribution of

these persons across the several different degree programs offered by theological schools. C-1 presents the information by size and status of the seminary (accreditation, university and cluster relation, black/white). D-1 provides the same degree level/program categories for denominational groups of schools, and E-1 for the eight regions -- seven in the United States and Canada.

Table C-6 in the appendices provides "full-time equivalency" enrollment information, in contrast with the "total person count" approach. In 1978 the FTE average was 78.0%; in 1979 it was 76.0%. This year it is down to 75.0%. This undoubtedly reflects the trend toward more part-time students evident in all of higher education. As noted last year, the part-time student is a new phenomenon for theological seminaries, one that will require some adjustments. However this trend toward more part-time students does not appear to characterize the basic ordination degree, the M.Div. In the three successive years, 1978 to 1980, the FTE figure is 88.3%, 89.9%, and 89.2%, well above the total institutional averages. In contrast the two-year masters degree FTE figure is 70.1% this year. It is only 60.0% for the Th.D. and Ph.D., the two academic doctorates, and 39.2% for the in-ministry D.Min. programs. Thus it is clear that the M.Div. does continue to enroll far more full-time students than is the case with any other degree program. Since the M.Div. is not only the basic ministry degree but also the primary institutional function of most theological schools, this is perhaps to be expected.

Professional Degree Registrations

Table 4 presents the year by year data for the professional degrees enrolling the largest numbers of theological students for the preceding twelve academic years. The greatest growth continues to be found in the D.Min. degree, rising from only 201 registrants in 1969 to 5,551 reported this year. Eighty-five member schools now offer the degree in one or both of its forms. The 5,551 number includes both the in-sequence and in-ministry students, with Table 5 providing a more detailed distribution.

The two-year masters degrees exhibit equally remarkable growth, especially in recent years. For example, while the D.Min. has risen +49.6% since 1975, the two-year masters increase is +43.5% in the same five years. These persons now constitute 16.6% of the total professional enrollment. This growth stems from two sources. Schools with long established degree programs are attracting more

students, but the two-year degree program idea is also attracting more schools. The greater majority of new degree programs begun in the past several years are this type. Some are devoted exclusively to academic theology with no professional training goals. Others -- masters in religious education, as well as the other ministry specialties -- are designed to prepare church workers for non-ordained employment in parishes. This appears to be a phenomenon which has not yet reached its peak. Even the non-degree enrollees -- certificate, diploma, short course, special -- continue to increase in numbers.

M.Div. enrollment, however, does not parallel the D.Min. and two-year masters record. Since 1975 it has increased only +13.0%, far below the others. Last year's actual reduction in numbers of M.Div. students was reversed somewhat in 1980. Yet the total did not rise sufficiently to equal the peak reached in 1978. Thus, while the M.Div. remains the basic degree from which most theological schools derive their primary institutional identity, it obviously is not growing in proportion to other programs.

Table 5 provides the detailed information on the D.Min. degree. While it

exists in two forms, a four-year "in-sequence" replacement for the M.Div. and a one-year post-M.Div. program, more than ninety percent of the enrollees are found in the latter type. And year after year this percentage increases. Since 1975

the number of schools offering the in-sequence mode has diminished from twenty-five down to only thirteen, with the students electing an in-sequence degree dropping to an all time low of 364 in Fall 1980. Only two institutions offer only the in-sequence type, while eleven others carry on both. In the present circumstances of expanding enrollments it seems apparent that the in-sequence degree pattern is not especially attractive to a substantial majority of the persons coming to schools of theology to obtain educational preparation for ordained ministry. This year the 364 enrolled represent only 1.4% of the pre-ordinands. Details regarding the distributions of enrollment by size and status, denomination, and region are available in the appendices, tables C-1, D-1, and E-1.

Graduate Student Enrollments

The Association defines graduate degrees as those built on an M.Div. prerequisite foundation. Included are three masters degrees (M.A., Th.M., S.T.M.) and the academic doctorates (Ph.D., Th.D., S.T.D.). The "in-ministry" D.Min., while requiring the M.Div. for admission, is excluded, since it is an advanced professional program. Table 6 provides the twelve-year comparisons for these degrees. It is readily apparent that the graduate masters degrees exhibit almost no pattern. The peak year was in 1970, with the low point coming in 1977. Some observers explain this as a by-product of D.Min. growth, since the potential clientele for both is the same and both require one-year full time, or its part-time equivalent. This does seem reasonable.

The doctoral phenomenon is somewhat different. The two categories (Ph.D. and Th.D./S.T.D.) really must be considered together, since many schools simply changed nomenclature from Th.D. to Ph.D. during the 1970's with little appreciable change in the program's nature. Taken collectively academic doctoral students increased from 1,466 in 1969 to 2,260 in 1980, up +54.2% in that time. This represents the largest enrollment in programs leading to potential teaching careers in the years since ATS began collecting these data. When one

considers the well-known shortage in academic positions, it is difficult to explain this popularity of the doctoral programs.

Sex Distribution of Theological Students

The Association has been collecting sex distribution data for students since 1972. Table 7 provides a representative sample of these nine years. Persons seeking information for each year can find it in earlier editions of this

Fact Book. The full computer analysis is reported in tables C-3, D-3, and E-3 where numbers of women enrollees are printed for each of the degree program categories. Parallel data for graduates are found in Tables F-3, G-3, and H-3, all in the appendices.

Table 7 summarizes these data for the several broad categories of degree program. Women seminarians are proportionately far below their ratio in the population at large, yet their numbers have been growing rapidly. In absolute numbers women have risen from 3,358 in 1972 (10.2% of the seminary student bodies) to 10,830 in 1980 (21.8%). While women registrants were increasing +222.5%, male enrollment grew only +30.7%. Thus the rate of increase in women has been more than seven times greater than men. Yet, even with such phenomenal growth, they still constitute only 21.8% of the total. And, it must be noted, this rate now appears to be slowing down somewhat. There were only 626 additional women registrants, contrasted with 1,232 the previous year, -1979.

Table 7 distributes the registration of women among the several degree categories. By coincidence the percentages in professional and graduate programs (21.8% and 21.9% respectively) are virtually identical with the 21.8% total. The largest proportion is in the two-year programs, including the religious education degree. Women actually constitute 47.2% of the student body in religious education, a church profession which has historically attracted many women. Churches in the Southern Baptist Convention employ many of these, and the six seminaries of that denomination enroll 52.4% of all women M.R.E. students. The presence of women in the other two-year programs is somewhat less.

The three- and four-year ordination degrees continue to attract the smallest proportion in numbers of women, 14.7% which is only some two-thirds of the 21.8% total. This is surely the result of the fact that ordained ministry has not been open to women until recently in many church bodies, while continuing to be closed in others. However this is one of the most rapidly growing categories. The 1980 total of 4,747 is +340.8% higher than 1972.

Masters and doctoral registrations for women increase slowly. In the former, the number of women creeps upward, while male registrants have actually decreased. Male doctoral students fluctuate considerably (the all-time high for men was 1975), while women continue to rise. In 1980 there were 448 women doctoral students, the largest number ever registered.

The broad categories of degrees used in Table 7 actually obscure the facts in one instance, the three-four year degree programs. While showing slight decreases the last two years in male students, the ramifications of this are not entirely clear in that table. Reference to Table 8 will amplify this information. This table is limited only to the ordination degrees, the M.Div. and the in-sequence D.Min. Note the male data for 1977 and each successive year.

The peak in men M.Div. and D.Min. in-sequence students was 23,266 in 1977. Since then the number of men has decreased each year, down a total of 733 males in Fall 1980 from the high point three years earlier. While the numbers of men were declining 733, in contrast the numbers of women grew by 976 persons, shifting the percentage of women herein from 12.9% in 1977 upward to 16.4% in 1980.

Table 9 reports the data on women graduates from the post-M.Div. degree programs which are the normal preparation for faculty members. A high of 134 women received masters degrees, and thirty-one doctorates were awarded. This

latter figure tends to fluctuate from year to year, reflecting perhaps the uncertainty about doctoral completion for both men and women particularly with respect to the time required for dissertations.

Table 10 provides parallel data for the major professional degrees. In each instance the largest number ever received came during the 1979-80 academic year. This is surely the expected end result of growing enrollments reported in earlier years. Taken together women ordination graduates (M.Div. and in-sequence D.Min.) rose from 474 in 1976-77 to 1,019 in 1979-80, providing church bodies

with 115.0% more women available for ministry appointments in just three years.

This information is presented in denominational detail in Table 11. Each of the Protestant church bodies is identified with the number of ordination

graduates and their proportion of the total. The largest number of women in 1979-80 was United Methodist -- 209 persons. But women comprised the greatest

proportion in the United Church of Christ (41.0%), followed by the United Church of Canada (32.9%) and the United Presbyterian Church (30.8%). These data come from comparisons of Tables G-1 and G-3 in the successive Fact Books.

Black Student Enrollment

The Association has collected these data since 1970, and they are reported in Table 12. Across that decade black student enrollment has risen from 808 to 2,205 this year. The rate of increase is obviously quite small, yet the rate has almost always been slightly higher than the overall growth of the student bodies.

The modest pace is indicated by the right-hand column in Table 12. Between 1970 and 1980 the percentage which black students represent in total student bodies has risen only from 2.6% to 4.4%. Black students continue to be unevenly distributed among the institutions. Five of them are primarily black, and they collectively have 600 or 27.2% of the total, with the remaining 1,605 black students spread among 189 primarily white schools of theology. The distribution of black students in denominational groups of institutions is reported in Table D-2. The inter/non-denominational group enrolls 745 blacks; United Methodist-302; American Baptist-244, etc. However, the 745 number includes 395 blacks in two primarily black inter/non-denomination schools, with the remaining 350 blacks distributed across the twenty remaining primarily white member seminaries.

Table 13 provides sex distribution data for black students. As is true of all women, black women have been coming to seminary at a slightly faster rate than black men. Since 1972 their proportion has risen from only 8.7% of blacks to 18.5% this year. Ordination degree enrollees lag behind this latter average, as was noted for all women. Black women graduate students are above the overall average. They represent 43.8% of all blacks in masters programs and 22.4% in doctorates. This latter number has risen remarkably from only one woman in 1972 to seventeen black women in 1980. Black men in doctoral programs continues to be erratic; 59 this year, up from 46 in 1979, but still down from 70 in the peak year of 1975. All of these data can be examined in Table C-2 in the appendices.

Table 14 reports graduate data for black students from the graduate masters and doctoral programs. As is obvious, it is difficult to draw conclusions.

1979-80 was not a good year for black graduate students. The nine masters degrees received matched the third worst year in the past eight years. The four doctorates duplicated the previous low of 1976-77. When compared with similarly fluctuating enrollments, it becomes difficult to make any optimistic predictions.

Hispanic/American Enrollment

Readers should examine Tables C-4, D-4, and E-4 for full details on Hispanic/American enrollment. This information has been collected since 1972

and reported in successive Fact Books. Table 15 provides summary details for selected years since that date. Although the number of Hispanics has risen from only 264 to 894 in the eight-year period, they still comprise only 1.8% of the total seminary student population, far below their ratio in the general population. The proportion of Hispanic women also lags behind the 21.8% for women generally, actually diminishing slightly this year. This is also true for the ordination degree category. Hispanic graduate students, men and women, are also fewer in number. Only 4.6% of Hispanics are graduate students, as compared with 8.1% in the total student population. Graduation data for Hispanics are available in Tables F-4, G-4, and H-4. This year two doctorates and eight graduate masters were awarded to Hispanics.

Pacific/Asian American Students

This category of students is defined as persons "from Asian and Pacific Island ancestry, whether born abroad or in the U.S.A. and its trust territories in the Pacific Ocean." The enrollment information is summarized in Table 16 abstracted from Tables C-5, D-5, and E-5 in the appendices. Collected only since 1977 when 494 persons were registered, this number grew to 602 this year. They comprise 1.2% of total enrollment. In contrast with other groups noted, Pacific/Asian students are more likely to be in post-M.Div. graduate programs -- 13.3% of their number are found there. And forty-two are in academic doctoral preparation, including nine women. This is almost three times the proportion of either black or Hispanic students.

Three academic doctorates and eleven graduate masters were awarded to Pacific/Asian students this year. See Tables F-5, G-5, and H-5 for the details.

Changes in Denominational Enrollments

See Table D-1 in the appendices for full details on the enrollments in the several denominational groups of member schools. Table 17 provides selected

data on two degrees offered by many of those institutions and is based on comparisons from the 1975 edition of this Fact Book. It has been presented here to show the contrast between the long established ordination degree (M.Div., to which the in-sequence D.Min. replacement is added) and the relatively newer

in-ministry D.Min. The former remains generally stable in most cases, the latter growing considerably in most instances. The Canadian groups of schools have been omitted, since the D.Min. has not become a significant factor there. Five of the denominations (Christian, Lutheran Church in America, United Methodist, Presbyterian U.S., and Protestant Episcopal) actually show a decrease in ordination students. The largest M.Div. increase (+33.3%) is in the Southern Baptist seminaries where total enrollments have grown substantially. In contrast the D.Min. registrations have risen sharply in most cases. Note especially the Southern Baptist data. Here D.Min. has decreased slightly (-2.1%), indicating that the total institutional growth consists of new persons preparing for religious leadership rather than practicing clergy returning part time for continuing education degrees.

Table 18 provides additional data, comparing total enrollment for these denominational groups of schools in 1970 and 1980. Before commenting, some words

of caution. The phenomenal Roman Catholic-Canada growth is largely explained by two new members during the decade, from three to five. Similarly the U.S. Roman Catholic membership grew from forty-two to fifty institutions. And there

was one new United Church of Canada member. Protestant Episcopal membership includes during the decade one school closed, one new one, and two institutions merging. The Southern Baptist growth is the most striking. Present D.Min. enrollment (419) is a totally inadequate explanation. The United Methodist rise is almost totally D.Min. students (786), as is United Presbyterian (1,287). About twenty percent of the doubling of enrollments in the inter/non-denominational category is derived from the D.Min., with another ten percent from new member institutions. The balance of the rise is largely attributable to the burgeoning enrollments in the non-denominational evangelical seminaries classified in this category. See Tables D-1 in successive Fact Books for full details.

Changes in Numbers of Graduates

Table 19 summarizes the data regarding graduates receiving the major professional degrees across the past twelve years. This information comes from

Americans in succeeding tables. In each instance it is apparent that the gradually increasing enrollments are inevitably producing more graduates from each degree program. For eight successive years M.Div. graduates numbered 5,000+ each year, fluctuating up and down with no obvious pattern. Two years ago this rose to 6,362, and it has moved upward regularly since then to 6,875 in the most recent year of reporting. Now that a new plateau has been reached in M.Div. enrollments at 26,000+ in each of the past four years (see Table 4 above), we can probably expect a similar stable graduation volume for a few years.

The numbers of D.Min. graduates show the kind of steady growth anticipated by the enrollment statistics (Table 4). The somewhat reduced rate of growth therein noted earlier is reflected here also. For four successive years the graduates have remained in the 900+ level, increasing each year by modest amounts. This will probably reach 1,000 for the first time during the 1980-81 academic year. The numbers of graduates from the two year masters degrees exhibit very similar characteristics. For the first time this group exceeded two thousand (actually 2,186, a +11.5% increase for the year). Given the steady increase in numbers of students, this is clearly to be expected.

Table 20 provides parallel data for several of the doctoral degrees awarded across the past twelve years. The results last year were somewhat surprising in several ways. The smallest number ever of Th.D./S.T.D. degrees -- forty -- was received. In fact, this was some forty percent below the next lowest year of 1975-76. An examination of enrollment patterns provides almost no explanation (Table 6), since enrollment has been reasonably stable in the 435-575 range for the past seven years. Ph.D. graduation is somewhat less surprising, yet it reveals no pattern. Since 1971-72 the number has moved up and down within the narrow range of 137 (low) and 242 (high). Yet during that time enrollments of Ph.D. students have grown from 1,134 to 1,782, up +57.1%. The uncertainties of dissertation writing may be an explanation. But it can also

be argued that increased Ph.D. enrollments have not as yet produced any significant rise in numbers of graduates. Finally, religious education doctorates reached their highest number last year, twenty-eight persons. All of these data may be explored in depth in the appendices, Tables F-1, G-1, and H-1.

Native American Enrollment

The Association has been collecting these data for only two years, and there is still some confusion about definitions. By "native American" we mean

North American Indian or Eskimo, native to either the United States or Canada. After careful checking to eliminate this uncertainty, the data reported in Table 21 appear to be reliable. The total enrollment of native Americans moved up to sixty-four persons from fifty-two last year. And they are distributed across several programs, each of which (except graduate masters) shows an increase. It is somewhat surprising to find five doctoral students and four D.Min. registrants among these sixty-four persons. ATS also received graduation data for the 1979-80 year. Five M.Div. degrees were awarded, one Ph.D., and one one-year certificate. These enrollees are found in thirty-five different member institutions, one of which registers eight native Americans and another six.

ATS MEMBERSHIP GROWTH

The Association of Theological Schools in the United States and Canada traces its origins to a Summer 1918 meeting. Initiated by the president of Harvard University, it included representatives of a number of Protestant schools of theology in both nations. Together they explored their common interests in education for ministry. The primary purpose of the consultation was "the improvement of theological education," the central goal still identified as primary in the ATS constitution.

The 1918 meeting proved so useful that the assembled representatives voted to meet again in two years. This decision, made more than sixty years ago, still reflects the rhythm of the association's activities with biennial meetings held in each of the even-numbered years since 1918. Known initially as the Conference of Theological Seminaries and Colleges in the United States and Canada, in 1936 the "conference" became legally the American Association of Theological Schools in the United States and Canada. In 1974 the word American was dropped from the name.

The structure of the Conference remained simple during the early years. Each biennial meeting elected a "continuation committee" which was in essence the program committee for the next meeting, there being no other business. A secretary received dues, kept a membership list, mailed notices and other similar duties. As the Conference moved through the 1920's and into the 1930's, its more generalized interest in improving theological education began to take specific shape. Other committees were appointed, and the secretary was elevated to executive secretary. While part-time and without remuneration, this person served as custodian of the Conference's interests between the biennia. In 1934 it was decided that improvement should take the form of established standards. Hence a committee on constitution and another on accrediting standards were appointed. The 1936 meeting adopted the constitution, thus becoming the American

Association of Theological Schools. It also adopted the initial set of accrediting standards and raised the first Commission on Accrediting. It charged this latter body with administration of the program of accreditation. It was determined that all institutions holding membership in 1936 were not accredited, and each was invited to participate in the process when it judged that it was ready.

Table 22 presents membership information from 1936 through 1980. Included for each biennium are the number of new member institutions received; the number dropping membership because of closings, mergers, or withdrawal; and the distribution between accredited and non-accredited membership categories.

The table demonstrated the attractiveness of membership in an accrediting association. In the first two years the membership grew by twenty-five percent, the association receiving sixteen new theological schools. That biennium also proved to be the most active ever with respect to initial accreditation decisions. Forty-six member schools were listed as accredited by 1938, a phenomenal task. The average number of new schools receiving initial accreditation in succeeding biennia is only five and one-half, with a range from none to a high of fifteen in 1970-72. The peak year of associate (non-accredited) membership was 1970 when large numbers of Roman Catholic schools had joined but not yet had sufficient time to accomplish the several sequential steps moving toward accreditation.

Table 22 contains several figures marked with an asterisk (*) between 1954 and 1964. During that decade at different times four Third World schools were granted Affiliate Membership. Two were located in Argentina, one in Cuba, and the fourth in the Philippines. This status was discontinued in 1964 primarily because of the ambiguity which prevailed about its meaning.

The largest influx of new members began in the 1964-66 period when the first five Roman Catholic institutions were received. Twenty-four more joined during 1966-68, with seventeen in 1968-70, eleven in 1970-72, five in 1972-74, and one each in the two succeeding biennia. In a period of only thirteen years a total of sixty-four Roman Catholic institutions became members, with eight of those ultimately withdrawing because of closings, mergers, or changes in program culminating in a decision to drop membership.

In the years since 1936 there have been fifteen new institutions created by mergers, usually involving two or more former ATS members. Twenty-five institutions have ceased operations and closed. Another three have voluntarily withdrawn from membership while continuing to function as educational institutions.

Finally the reader's attention is called to the more specific information found in Table B-2 in the appendices. Beginning with the list of sixty-four

members in 1936, the changes in biennial rosters are identified. Listings include the information regarding new members and those dropped -- for whatever reason -- in each two-year period.

NUMBER AND DISTRIBUTION OF PERSONNEL

Tables O through V provide the detailed information on the distribution of personnel in the categories of administration, faculty, and library staff.

These may be used with earlier Fact Books for the purpose of comparison, since the format has been preserved since their beginning. These tables distribute the data in size, status, and denominational categories.

Table 23 reports an eleven-year overall summary of personnel statistics in the three employment categories. In each instance the "per school" figure is used for year-by-year comparisons to reduce the impact of growth in the number of Association members since 1969. In that period the average student body rose from slightly more than 173 persons to 255+, an increase of +47.3% in enrollment. But there has been no comparable increase in personnel. The number of administrators per school has grown from four plus to five plus, up +26.3%. The number of faculty continues to be twelve plus, rising from 12.00 full-time teachers per school to only 12.74 the current academic year. Librarians have not fared even this well, actually decreasing in number per member institution during this span of time. Thus it appears that much of the increase in numbers of employees can be attributed to receiving new institutions into Association membership, very little to real growth.

Table 24 identifies the role that part-time instructional personnel play in the total teaching staff. Just as the number of students has risen, so

has the role of part-time adjunct instructors. In 1971-72 they numbered only 1,498 persons, a figure which rose this year to 2,374, up +59.4%. This undoubtedly provides a clue for understanding how the larger numbers of students are being instructed. Their full-time equivalence rose for the first time this year to 21.0% of total instructional time. The apparent peaking of this number three years ago was sharply reversed this year when it reached 2,374, by far the highest since these data have been collected.

Sex and Race Distribution of Personnel

Tables 25, 26, and 27 summarize the data for the employment of women in schools of theology. Only professional level employment is considered in producing these tables. The number of women administrators continues to creep upward at a barely discernable pace. Starting from 103 in 1971, it has now

reached 193 persons. This nine-year improvement of only ninety additional women has only raised their ratio to men very slightly. In 1971 those 103 women constituted 12.2% of total employment. Today 193 have pulled this modest achievement up only to 18.8%. However it should be noted that since 1971 the number of men has risen only 12.2%, while women administrators grew to be 193, up +87.4%. Thus the movement is clearly in the more inclusive direction, even though the rate of progress is obviously slow.

Table 26 reports the same data for faculty. The percentage of growth has been striking, even though the actual numbers remain very modest. From only seventy-three in 1971 to 195 this year is unusual, up +167.1% in the period. Yet despite this change, women still represent only 7.9% of full-time instructional personnel. Perhaps the substantial numbers of women currently in graduate doctoral studies will have a positive impact on this situation in the near future. A careful study of Table 26 provides some curious shifts. For example, last year there was virtually no increase in numbers of women being employed as teachers

full-time, i.e. forty of the forty-three increase were male. This year twenty-three of thirty-one new persons were women. Apparently there is a cyclical phenomenon to this change. As noted above, part-time instructors increased sharply this year, and the proportion of women increased somewhat. Women continue to be found in twice the ratio among part-time staff as is the situation with full-time faculty.

Table 27 examines these data in more detail. Each of the employment positions for which information is collected is presented there. For the second successive year there is no chief administrator, although assistants doubled.

There are now six women serving as academic deans, up from only one as recently as 1977. The rest of the categories continue to fluctuate up and down, although the over-all trend is obviously upward. The total number of women rose by eleven this year, from 182 to 193.

In contrast, women faculty members increased significantly. The number employed full-time is now 195, up from 172 last year and only 146 in 1977. There are now ninety-four women in the traditionally tenured positions of full and associate professor. Note also the large increase in part-time staff, up +26.1% in one year.

The situation with respect to women librarians continues to be the opposite trend. Not only have library staffs remained relatively constant, but the number of male librarians is on the increase. There are twenty fewer women librarians

employed full time this year than was true in 1977. See Table 27 for the data sequentially for each library position.

Table 28 provides parallel data for black staff in the administrative, faculty, and library categories. The slight drop in black administrators was reversed this year, when the previous high of thirty-two was duplicated. The six black chief administrators are found in the five primarily black institutions, with only one in a primarily white seminary. In fact, thirteen of the 32 black black administrators are employed by these five black schools. One should not be misled by the apparent +8.2% increase in black faculty. It is explained entirely by part-time instructional staff. This year and last year there were 84 full-time black teachers, and fifty each year are in the tenured positions. And 30 of these 84 full-time faculty teach in the five black schools, leaving only 54 blacks in the remaining 189 primarily white schools. Six of the twelve black librarians are also in these five black member schools. In summary, it is apparent that 1980 brought very little change in the professional employment of blacks in schools of theology.

COMPENSATION

The full details on compensation are available in Tables NN-VV in the appendices. There the reader can find each employment position identified -- whether administrative, faculty, or library staff -- with the compensation reported in the same size, status, denominational, regional, and highest degree offered categories which characterize all tables included. It must be noted that total compensation is emphasized. This is the sum of cash paid, housing allowance (if any), value of fringe benefits, such as insurance, medical (if paid by the institution), and the school's contribution to pension programs. Salaries for administrators and library staff are twelve-month basis, while faculty salaries reported are only for the academic year, even though they may be paid across a twelve-month schedule. Extra compensation for additional instruction (i.e., summer sessions, continuing education, etc.) are excluded from these reports.

A study of the tables in the appendices reveals wide variations in institutional policy. While the total compensation data may be similar, some schools will have much higher cash salary payments with lower sums provided for fringe benefits and pension support. Others reverse this pattern. Hence one must be cautious in comparing stated contract salaries to be certain that the bases used for total compensation are similar.

In an era of double digit inflation, compensation stated in dollars is not very informative. This fact has been taken into account in the tables which follow. It should be noted that the appendices do not include this additional information, since they only record the data for the current year. The Consumer Price Index rose +13.2% between July 1, 1979, and June 30, 1980, the preceding academic year. Hence this is the percentage factor used to determine whether 1980-81 salaries currently being paid matched inflation. As will be apparent in the following tables, almost no category of seminary staff matched inflation this year. The +13.2% figure is the highest recorded since these Fact Books were begun in

1969-70. On two previous occasions inflation has exceeded ten percent (+11.7% in 1973-74 and +11.3% in 1978-79). From July 1, 1969, to June 30, 1980, the CPI rose +124.7%, and Table 37 will provide salary comparisons for the same period. At this writing -- early February 1981 -- the CPI is still at the high rate of approximately thirteen percent.

Administrative Compensation

Table 29 provides summary information about changes in the total compensation being paid to administrative staff in the 1980-81 academic year. The data are divided into two categories -- accredited and other institutions. The "other" category includes both candidates for accreditation and associate member schools of theology. Despite the overall increase of +8.7% compensation to administrators, every employment position except that of Dean of Students actually suffered net real losses in purchasing power this year. This is the fourth consecutive year for such overall losses for administrators in accredited schools. The candidate for accreditation and associate schools were even more victimized by runaway inflation despite their +7.6% growth. Note also the wide range of changes in compensation. The very large loss indicated for deans of students is probably more apparent than real. There are only three such positions filled this year, and it is unlikely that they are the same individuals reporting last year. The same observation is also applicable to development directors, since only four are employed. The net loss to inflation was -5.6%, as compared with a -4.5% result in accredited schools. Full details are available in the appendices, Tables NN through PP.

Faculty Compensation

These details can be found in Tables 30-35, with the full reports in Tables QQ, RR, and SS. The sums reported, as noted, are total compensation (cash salary, housing allowance, fringe benefits, and institutional contribution to pension). It is apparent in accredited schools that faculty fared, on the average, slightly better than administrators, or +9.6% for faculty and +8.7% for administrators. Please note the three successive tables for each category. Tables 30 and 33 report dollar amounts for the past six years; Tables 31 and 34 the percentage of increase; and Tables 32 and 35 the net change in real purchasing power when the impact of inflation is considered. The dollar increase was \$2,541 this year. However \$3,481 would have been required to match the rise in the cost of living. Note also the inverse order of percentage of increase, with faculty holding the

highest rank receiving the lowest increase. In contrast, candidates for accreditation and associate school faculty had precisely the reverse pattern, with persons holding full professorships receiving the largest increase. In fact, these professors were the only faculty rank in either category of institution to exceed the cost of living increase. Full details on these compensation patterns are found in Tables 30 through 35, and in the appendices in QQ through SS.

Library Compensation

Table 36 reports summary data for the last four years for library personnel, distributed in two categories -- accredited and other institutions. Here the results with respect to inflation found earlier with administrators and faculty are

duplicated. The respective increases, +9.6% and +8.4%, are substantially below the +13.2% growth in the Consumer Price Index. Last year librarians in the "other" category were the only personnel group to exceed inflation. But this favorable circumstance was not to be repeated.

Full details on salaries of librarians are available in the appendices, Tables TT, UU, and VV.

Summary

Table 37 indicates the total impact of inflation between 1969 and 1980 in the several categories of professional employees identified earlier. As noted at the beginning of this section, the Consumer Price Index rose +124.7% in that eleven year period. No category of employees was even near this percentage of

increase. Library staff in accredited schools were least damaged, with a net loss cumulatively of -19.7%. Their colleagues in "other school" libraries were the greatest victims, -46.0% in net real income! There was little difference between faculty in the two schools, each group lagging behind something more than twenty percent. Administrators in the other school category fared best, losing "only" -16.1% net real purchasing power. In contrast, administrators, while receiving the highest overall average salary, suffered a -30.6% loss. Thus, it is obvious that school of theology professional employees have not done well economically in the period since 1969.

FINANCES-REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES

Tables AA-JJ provide the overall financial information for the ATS member schools. Those tables are available in the appendices, with summaries provided here in the text.

Financial data for each year since 1968/69 appear in Table 38. Since 1975/76 there has been a gradually improving overall financial situation, although that improvement has been exceedingly slow. The worst deficit situation occurred in the 1970/71 fiscal year. From that date forward the financial circumstances have reversed. The 1979/80 surplus reached \$5,402,000, a not insignificant sum. However, lest the reader be deceived, this is only \$27,845 per school, or just \$116 per student. It represents only 2.0% of the average expenditure budget.

Table 39 examines this information in more detail, utilizing a "per student" basis. The educational and general category continues to produce a surplus, \$305 per student last year. Both student financial aid and auxiliary enterprises are

deficit operations. Fortunately the deficit in each remained almost the same in dollar amount per student last year. Financial assistance to students, in this era of high educational costs, continues to be important. However institutions are not finding it possible to receive all of the funds needed. And furthermore, the auxiliary enterprises (food and residential services) are similarly unfavorable in their impact on the total financial picture.

In summary, it is instructive to compare the overall increases in revenues/

expenditures with the +13.2% inflation which prevailed last year. Revenues rose +13.1%; expenditures by 12.5%. As noted above, almost no category of professional salaries matched inflation. Hence it is apparent that the additional income was allocated to other costs in schools of theology.

Sources of Revenue

Tables AA-EE provide these data. Tuition and fees averaged \$1,279 last year. But this is deceptive, since the range was from a low of \$422 in the Southern Baptist schools to \$2,709 in Protestant Episcopal institutions. The percentage that tuition/fees represent ranged from 13% in United Church of Canada institutions to 47% in the inter-nondenominational group. Gifts and grants (ecclesiastical and individual) is the largest single source, around 40% on the average. In Southern Baptist seminaries this was 67%, the highest for any group. Noting the low tuition/fees structure, this is certainly to be expected. Endowment income ranged from a high of \$4,103 per student to a low of \$259 in Canadian Roman Catholic schools.

Patterns of Expenditure

Tables FF-JJ provide these details. Table FF makes it immediately evident that on a per student basis smaller institutions are far more expensive. Educational and general expenditures averaged \$8,091 in schools with fifty or fewer students, down to only \$2,976 in those over five hundred in enrollment. Although steadily increasing, these patterns vary only slightly across the years. Administrative costs hover around 30% in most schools. Instruction ranges from forty to fifty percent, with library expenditures about 10%. The widest variations are found in the denominational categories reported in Table HH.
