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THE ASSOCIATION OF THEOLOGICAL SCHOOLS

The Association of Theological Schools in the United States and Canada is the established accrediting agency for graduate theological education. Tracing its origins to 1918 when formal consultations on theological education were begun, the Association now numbers almost 200 institutions reflecting the diversity of the religious communities and university relationships in the two national communities. Its purposes include, within a general mandate for the improvement of theological education, the establishment of standards and the accreditation of institutions, serving as a forum for shared interests, and the consideration of issues among members and between members and related agencies. In the exercise of its standard setting duties, the Association has maintained a list of accredited schools since 1936. The Association also publishes annually a Directory of Theological Schools.

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INTRODUCTION

This is the fourteenth annual edition of this Fact Book. The information used in its production comes from the Association's member schools, each of which provides an annual report. Enrollment, professional staff, and salary data are all for the current academic year, 1982-83. Institutional financial data and library statistics are for the latest audited year, namely 1981-82. Per student revenue as well as per student and per faculty expenditure information are based on fall 1981 "head count" and "full-time equivalency" enrollment and employment, as well as the audited financial data for the 1981-82 academic year. These enrollment totals are reported for individual schools of theology in Tables A, B-1, and B-2.

This Fact Book continues the practice, begun last year, of supplying per student and per faculty revenue/expenditure information both on a "head count" and "full-time equivalency" basis. Tables C-6, D-6, and E-6 in the appendices supply these latter data, with Table B-2 reporting these two sums for individual schools. Tables AA-1 through JJ-1 provide revenue/expenditure data on the "head count" basis. Tables AA-2 through JJ-2 are parallel, using "full-time equivalency" student data. This information becomes all the more significant, as schools of theology continue to experience increasing numbers of part-time students.

A basic goal of these successive Fact Books has been to supply parallel information, thus facilitating comparisons from year to year. Where changes have been introduced, in most instances they have been confined to supplying additional data rather than altering the existing pattern. Among the data received, only the Native American statistics have not been subjected to computer analysis. The numbers remains modest, and they are fully summarized in the text, but not found in the appendices.

Table A provides the enrollment for each of the last two years, and also the basis of classification of each. Table B-1 reports individual school enrollment on a quadrennial basis for each school. Table B-2, included for only the second time, gives enrollment for 1981 and 1982 on both the head count and full-time equivalence basis for each separate degree program offered by the individual institutions.

Certain arbitrary definitions have been necessary with respect to these classifications. For example, a seminary is classified as a part of a university only if the larger institution possesses two other professional schools or departments. Schools are classified as related to a cluster only if the relationship includes at least two other schools of theology. Denominational groups are sorted and reported publicly--in the Fact Book--only if the denomination maintains at least four institutions which are members of the Association. Because the computer cannot accommodate dual denominational relationships which some schools have, each has been classified on the basis of the primary student body church membership. Thus, Louisville Presbyterian is included in the United Presbyterian category, and Andover Newton in the United Church of Christ group. Neither Bexley Hall nor Berkeley Divinity School, both Episcopal seminaries, are included in the Protestant Episcopal data because of their relationships with Colgate Rochester and the Yale Divinity School respectively. One major change has been introduced in the Lutheran category this year. Tables D, G, J, M, P, etc., in the appendices headed "Lutheran" are a combination of the Lutheran Church in America, American Lutheran Church, and the Association of Evangelical Lutheran Churches, a single inclusive category. Previously only the Lutheran Church in American (LCA) data were published, since that was the only Lutheran Church body meeting the criterion of four or more schools. There are now ten member institutions in this new Lutheran category: five related exclusively to LCA; one each to ALC and AELC; and three with dual LCA/

ALC relationships. Since data from previous years for this newly combined group of schools were not readily available, the Lutheran category has been eliminated from some of the denominational tables found in the text. It is hoped that future editions of the Fact Book can introduce these data again when separate hand tabulations can be made.

Since 1980 the Association has had three separate categories of institutional membership: accredited member; candidate for accredited member; and associate member. For the purposes of the Fact Book, the latter two groups (candidates and associates) have been combined in the "Other" column in the tables presenting size/status data in the appendices.

As in the past, all salary scales reported in the volume have been edited to preserve confidentiality. Hence, in any category with less than three salaries being reported, the data have been deleted.

Finally, the text has been prepared to report and emphasize the most important data. Factual description is the goal. No value judgments about size, mode of financing, patterns of expenditure, composition of student body, or other matters are intended. Each reader is invited to make his/her own judgments on these matters in the light of the data presented in reference to his/her own perspectives on theological education.

This Fact Book has been prepared and is offered to the ATS member schools and the general public with the hope that it will be useful to those with responsibility for the future strength of the theological education enterprise in the United States and Canada, and will be of service to persons seeking more information about that enterprise.

ENROLLMENT

Theological education in 1982 appears to have run counter to the trends in higher education in three significant ways: private institutions (which theological seminaries are) experienced a drop in enrollment; the numbers of women registered actually declined this year; and the ratio of full-time students rose. These items were reported in The Chronicle of Higher Education for November 24, 1982. None of these factors is characteristic of theological schools. Enrollment continues to increase; the numbers of women grew even more rapidly; and full-time equivalency continued to drop. This confirms the observation noted in previous years that the enrollment experience in theological education often is different from the rest of higher education.

Table 1 provides these data for each year since 1969. One thing will be immediately apparent to the reader. Year-to-year comparisons are not precisely parallel, since the Association's membership continues to fluctuate. Many new member schools have been received since 1969, with a number also closing or merging with others. The net increase is twenty-six new institutions (+15.3%) in the thirteen-year period. During that time enrollment grew from 29,815 to 52,620, up +76.5%. Thus, it is obvious that the growth in enrollment cannot be explained merely by the presence of more schools within the Association's membership. Readers interested in the details of institutional changes in membership since 1936 should consult the Fact Book, 1980-81.

Table 2 provides more precise enrollment growth data for 1981 and 1982. With exactly the same institutions reporting in both years, the increase was 1,465 persons, or +2.9%. Thus, 1.2% of the total enrollment increase shown in Table 1 for fall 1982 can be credited to the newly received member schools. Even here the raw statistical data are somewhat misleading. Table 1 indicates a growth of three additional schools. Actually four were received, but two previous members merged, producing a net gain of three schools this year.

Table 3 reports similar comparisons over a five-year period, 1977 and 1982.

The same 185 institutions reporting in both of those years appear in Table 3. This is further proof that the growth in enrollment experienced every year since 1969 is genuine, reflecting more than an increase in the number of Association member schools. In this five-year time span the increase has been +13.2%, for an average of 2.6% per year. Even when the new institutions are added, the increase has been only slightly more than 3.0% per year, indicating that the presence of new institutions--which tend to be fairly small--has had only a negligible impact on the total

situation. The growth is quite real. The average size of all theological schools is increasing year by year.

Table 4 adds a new dimension to these statistics. Previous enrollment data have been of "the total persons enrolled" type; that is, a person is counted as "one person" whether taking a full load or only a single course. Table 4 reports full-time equivalency. Here the statistics reflect a shift in perspective. While it is true that each year more and more persons are entering theological schools, they are on the average taking fewer and fewer courses per year. Table 4 reveals this quite clearly. Just four years ago in 1978 the average student was registered for 78% of a full load of studies; by 1982 this has dropped below 72%, a rather sharp decrease in such a short time period. To be sure the presence of the in-

ministry D.Min. degree--by definition a part-time program--has an impact on this. However D.Min. students have not increased sufficiently in numbers during the period since 1978 to explain this drop in full-time equivalency. It is evident that there are more and more part-time students in seminaries.

An even more careful look at the bottom three lines of Table 4 will underline this shift more precisely. In 1981, while 948 additional persons enrolled in schools of theology, the full-time equivalency enrollment rose by only nine persons. The bottom line on Table 4--marked with the asterisk (*), compares precisely the same institutions reporting in 1981. Here one finds 1,465 more registrants, but 55 fewer full-time equivalents. In previous years the number of full-time equivalents did continue to grow, however at a lower rate than the head count enrollment was increasing. This year, despite more persons, the total FTE number actually fell by -0.15%! Thus, it is clear that seminaries in this respect are becoming more and more like the rest of higher education. They are being forced by student choice to adjust to an ever increasing part-time clientele.

The above percentages are for total enrollments (persons and full-time equivalents). As one might expect, these are not at all evenly distributed across the degrees offered. The D.Min. quite appropriately, has the lowest FTE ratio, 37.7%. The highest two are doctoral degrees in music (100%, i.e., all students are full time) and religious education (93.3%). Special/unclassified/diploma/certificate students average slightly less than one-half student loads (49.8%), and the two-year masters students are 65.6%. Perhaps the most typical degree is one registering the most students, the Master of Divinity. This year the FTE ratio for the M.Div. is 86.7%. This represents the fifth successive year in which it has fallen: 90.5% (1978), 89.9% (1979), 89.2% (1980), 87.1% (1981), and falling to 86.7% this year. Since the M.Div. is the primary reason for the existence of most seminaries, its importance is difficult to overemphasize. Hence the role of the part-time student is clearly a factor with which institutions must deal.

The uneven distribution of the full-time equivalency issue across degree programs is also apparent regionally and denominationally. The region with the highest ratio of full-time students is the Plains (76.9%; down from 81.1% just last year). The lowest is the Far West (California and Oregon) with only 55.6% this year, down considerably from 63.4% in fall 1981. The other regions are between these extremes. Denominational ranges are also considerable. Episcopal seminaries enroll the largest ratios of full-time students, 85.6% in 1982. This is actually up from 83.9% last year, a clear indication that Episcopal institutions have moved against the trend, at least this year. Roman Catholic schools in the United States (78.0%) and Canada (75.9%) are a close second, as they were last year. The group with the lowest FTE ratio is the United Presbyterian (59.6%), a fact obviously determined by the presence of two very large D.Min. enrollments in these six seminaries.

The person-count enrollments are reported in full detail in Tables C-1, D-1, and E-1 in the appendices. FTE parallels are Tables C-6, D-6, and E-6. Persons interested in more information about this phenomenon should consult those tables, also using earlier Fact Books for trend lines of comparison.

Professional Degree Registrations

Table 5 provides information from the successive years for the professional degree programs enrolling the largest numbers of students. The D.Min. enrollment continues to rise, although the rate is obviously slowing down. This year a total of 6,188 persons are registered, an increase of 276 persons. While the rate is now moderating, it must nonetheless be noted that D.Min. enrollments were only 201 persons thirteen years ago. The number is now 6,188, a tremendous increase. Table 6 will provide additional details regarding this degree.

The one- and two-year masters degrees are also exhibiting continued substantial growth, up from 2,640 persons in 1969 to 8,358 this year (+216.6%). (In contrast, the M.Div. has grown only +33.4% in that same period.) These shorter programs serve two purposes. They include professional training for some ministries (religious education, music, counseling, etc.), as well as provide academically oriented introductions to theological knowledge for persons not seeking ministerial credentials but nonetheless interested in significant study. It seems obvious that there is great interest in both of these possibilities.

Master of Divinity enrollments did experience an increase this year. After five successive years in the 26,000-26,999 range, the totals jumped to 27,506 registrants. Nonetheless, despite this increase the ratio of M.Div. students to all professional degree students continued to drop, reaching an all time low of 56.4%

this year. While the education of ordained clergy is of primary importance to those who support schools of theology, this is a gradually diminishing reason why students come. In the past five years, for example, D.Min. registrations have risen +37.8%; two-year masters up +34.2%; the M.Div. by only 4.8%.

Table 6 reports on the Doctor of Ministry degree with additional detail. This degree is offered in two forms: the in-sequence pattern being an additional year immediately following the M.Div.; and the in-ministry model usually requiring a period of full-time ordained ministerial service prior to admission, with continued service accompanying part-time study spread across a few years (three being the most typical). Although the D.Min. started in the 1960s on the in-sequence basis, this has not proved to be the most attractive. Both the number of schools offering

it and the number of students have diminished steadily, although the 1982 data appear to indicate that a plateau has been reached. In contrast, the in-ministry approach continues to grow. And as member seminaries develop curricular approaches which clergy can meet, their numbers increase. One statistic in Table 6 can be

misleading. It appears that three institutions may have dropped the D.Min. since last year, the total number of schools dropping from ninety down to eighty-seven. This is an inaccurate conclusion. One seminary has in fact terminated the program. But one other merged with a second school, with the new institution continuing the degree. And two seminaries in a cluster program this year enrolled no D.Min. students. Hence the drop is more apparent than real. One additional school reported D.Min. students for the first time this year. The in-sequence program does continue to be attractive to women seeking ordination. While only 18.8% of the M.Div. students are women, 27.7% of the 343 D.Min. enrollees are women. In contrast, women are represented in the in-ministry D.Min. category by only 5.1%, undoubtedly reflecting the fact that very large numbers of women have not been engaged in ministry sufficiently long to qualify or be interested. Other details about these distributions of D.Min. enrollment are available in Tables C 1-6, D 1-6, and E 1-6 in the appendices.

Graduate Student Enrollments

Graduate degrees are defined by the Association as those requiring the M.Div. or its equivalent as a prerequisite for admission. This includes three masters degrees (M.A., S.T.M., and Th.M.), as well as the academic doctorates (Ph.D., Th.D., and S.T.D.). The in-ministry D.Min., while presupposing the M.Div., is nonetheless classified as a professional degree. This category has fluctuated in size over the last decade, ranging between 3,600 and slightly more than 4,000. This year the increase is totally within the Ph.D., but this may not be as accurate as the numbers imply. Ph.D. students are not easy to define across many institutions, since persons writing dissertations often are not "enrolled" currently. This year an attempt was made to clarify the instructions on reporting, and this may well have led to increased numbers without any genuine rise in Ph.D. candidates. The Th.D./

S.T.D. continues on the plateau reached several years ago. And for 1982 there has been almost no change in the masters degree population. It is obvious that graduate degrees are not the area which accounts for the expansion of seminary enrollments. That falls solely in the professional category.

Sex Distribution of Theological Students

These data have been collected by the Association since 1972, and Table 8 provides distributions by types of degree programs for selected years across this span of time. More precise information is available in the appendices in Tables C-3, D-3, and E-3. These tables are parallel to those found in earlier editions of the Fact Book making comparisons possible. Graduation data are found in Tables F-3, G-3, and H-3 in each year's volume.

An examination of the totals at the bottom of the table will quickly indicate the rather rapid growth in women's enrollment. Moving from only 3,358 women in 1972, the total reached 12,473 this year--a decade later. This is an increase of +271.4%. In contrast, the enrollment of men has risen only +35.3% during the ten-year period. Thus, the rate of increase for women has been more than seven times greater than that of men. However, the reader must not be misled by these percentages. In 1972 women accounted for only 10.2% of seminary student bodies, far below their ratio in the total population. Even with these increases, the percentage has reached only to 23.7%, still less than one in four students.

As with most statistics, the above averages and percentages do not do full justice to the range. There are actually nine institutions in which women are more numerous in the Master of Divinity, the one degree where their ratio is the lowest in terms of average. In several of these schools, primarily because of the D.Min. and academic doctorates where men predominate, women do not constitute the majority

in the total student body. But in the basic ordination degree program, they are more numerous. And each year one or two additional schools are added to this list.

As Table 8 reveals, these increases are distributed across all of these large degree categories. In each one there are more women this year than last. In all instances but one (graduate masters), the enrollment totals of men also rose. The category with the ordination degrees continues to lag behind the ratios of others, reaching 16.6% this year; up from only 4.7% in 1972. The rate of increase here is actually much faster than that for total enrollment of women. But the totals continue to lag precisely because the level was so very low at the beginning. Graduate registrations are more difficult to interpret. There has actually been a decrease in post-M.Div. masters since 1972, down from 353 in 1972 to 268 this year. In contrast, women in academic doctorates rose from only 147 in 1972 to an all time high of 532 this year. One possible explanation might be that women, once content to limit their aspirations to the graduate masters, no longer see that as an acceptable goal. Readers interested in denominational distributions of these data on women students should examine Tables D-1 and D-3.

The wide categories of combined degrees used in Table 8 tend to obscure one fact about women's enrollment. Table 9 corrects this impression. It identifies the women/men ratios involved in preparation for ordination (the M.Div. and the in-sequence D.Min.). One trend evident across the last five years was apparently reversed this year. Between 1977 and 1982 both the number of women and their percentage rose. The highest number of men was reached in 1977, with 23,266 enrolled. Each successive year that actual number of men has decreased, until 1982. This year the number of men in these ordination programs rose slightly, up from 22,437 in 1981 to 22,578 in 1982. However, the number of men currently enrolled in these ordination programs is still several hundred fewer than 1977, when total seminary registration was more than 7,000 fewer students.

Table 10 provides graduation data for women across the past several years. It includes information about those post-M.Div. degree programs which usually serve as training for college/university and seminary teaching. As noted above, the numbers of women enrolling in seminaries have been increasing quite rapidly in recent years. Women registered in graduate programs have also risen sharply (Table 8).

The year 1981-82 brought the first clear indication of the results. For the first time the number of women receiving academic doctoral degrees rose to match their proportion in doctoral study, with Ph.D./Th.D. graduates numbering eighty-two women. The highest previous total was but forty-five, only slightly more than half of this all-time high. Women constituted 20.8% of all doctoral graduates during the year. This clearly will add larger numbers of women to that pool of persons from which future faculty appointments can be made. Post-M.Div. masters graduates also reached a new high (145 persons), although that proportion of degree recipients has more nearly matched the student ratio for the past three or four years.

Table 11 provides the same type of graduation data for women receiving professional degrees, and the results are parallel. In each instance the numbers of women graduates rose quite significantly. In just five years the number of women

awarded the M.Div.--the basic ordination degree--has risen from 462 persons to 1,170 last year (+153.2%). Although the numbers are much smaller, the in-sequence D.Min. women graduates have gone from only twelve to thirty persons (+150.0%). Even the religious education women graduates, a profession which attracted large numbers of women for years before ordination percentages attained larger size, continue to grow. Thus, it is apparent that the increased numbers of women students

are resulting in corresponding numbers of graduates prepared to assume these professional religious leadership roles.

Table 12 examines these graduation data more precisely in relationship to the several denominational groups of institutions. Both M.Div. and in-sequence D.Min. women graduates are reported there both in absolute numbers of persons and the proportion of all graduates which they represent. While there are some up/down fluctuations, in every instance the trend in women M.Div. graduates is upward. And the percentage of the total which they constitute ranges from a low of 7.8% in the Southern Baptist category to a high of 50% in the United Church of Christ. In-sequence D.Min. numbers/ratios are less predictable, with wider variations. This fact is undoubtedly influenced by the enrollment variations for that program noted above. The right hand column (percentage that women are among ordinands) illustrates this climb upward. The enrollment data already considered indicate that this is a phenomenon which will continue. Persons interested in exploring these detailed data should consult Tables F-1, F-3, G-1, and G-3 in the successive Fact Books.

Black Student Enrollment

The Association of Theological Schools has been receiving these data since the fall 1970 registration period, and Table 13 reports the information year by year. It is readily obvious that the increases have been substantial in terms of percentages, up +218.8% in twelve years. However, one must not be misled by this growth rate. Whenever a number starts at such a low point, rate of growth can be tremendous without major changes in the quantity of persons involved. In fact, year by year there has been but slightly less than 150 additional black students enrolled! It is true that the rate of increase has been greater than the overall student

increase. This is demonstrated by the last column in the table. Between 1970 and 1982 blacks have risen from only 2.6% of the student population to 4.9%. However, this is far below the ratio that black citizens comprise in the total population. Hence, one cannot be pleased with this level of accomplishment. The 1980 census estimated that blacks were 11.7% of the United States population. If theological schools enrolled this proportion, there would be about 6,156 black students rather than the 2,576 registered in 1982.

Furthermore, it should be noted that 596 of these black students were enrolled in only five of the member schools--the five predominantly black institutions. Hence this left but 1,980 black students to be distributed across the remaining 191 schools. The largest number in a denominational group is the 359 registered in the United Methodist seminaries. American Baptists are second with 241 black students. The inter- and nondenominational category reported 882 black students, but this includes 453 black students registered in two of the black schools of theology, leaving only 429 distributed across the remaining twenty institutions. Denominational data are found in Table D-2, with graduation information in G-2.

Table 14 reports these data on black students by broad degree category on the basis of sex distribution. Here it is apparent that the progress of black women has paralleled that of all women students. In fact the growth rate since 1972 for black women (+548.9%) has more than doubled that achieved by all women seminary students (+271.4%). This year alone there were 106 additional black women, contrasted with but ninety-nine additional black men. As Table 14 indicates, this increase in black women is spread across all degree programs. It is especially evident in women doctoral students, up to twenty-three persons this year, while the number of men has remained rather steady since 1972. The ordination programs also reveal this substantial growth.

Table 15 reports graduation data for blacks receiving post-M.Div. degrees. Here the overall enrollment growth is not confirmed. As indicated in the previous Table (#14), much of the numerical increase has been in M.Div. or lesser degree patterns. For example, there were 113 post-M.Div. black students in 1972. This had risen to only 118 ten years later, and during much of the decade the total had

been less than one hundred. During that same time period professional students increased by more than 150%. Hence, while the churches are receiving increasing numbers of persons prepared for ministry, there appears to be no significant change in the total number of blacks seeking graduate degrees which might prepare them for teaching. And perhaps the most striking observation about this steady-state black graduate group is the fact that it is increasingly becoming female. In 1972 women were only 2.7% (3 of 113 blacks); by 1982 they had reached 23.7% (28 of 118) of the post-M.Div. group. Given these facts, the fluctuating numbers of black graduates reported in Table 15 are not surprising.

Hispanic/American Enrollment

Table 16 reports the Hispanic/American student enrollment for each of several successive years since 1972 when the data were first collected from ATS member institutions. Much of what has been written for blacks is also applicable here. The numbers in 1972 were so very low that any growth would of course appear to be huge. And the numbers have moved upward at a good rate of growth; i.e., since 1972 the increase has been +347.0%. In contrast total registrations in schools of theology have grown only +59.3%. Thus, the rate of increase is almost six times that of the total student group, surely a good achievement. Yet the ratio within the student bodies lags far behind the percentage that Hispanics comprise in the population. In 1982, 1,180 Hispanics were enrolled, a considerable leap upward (+23.6%). But it should be noted in Table 16 that virtually all of this increase is in the special/unclassified/nondegree category of students. Thus, the persons seeking credentials for ministry or teaching have hardly changed at all despite this sizeable jump upward in numbers of persons. Graduate degree students did not increase this year (43 persons in both 1981 and 1982), and the ordination degree group rose by

only ten enrollees. Furthermore, 136 of the 1,180 students are in the one school which conducts its programs in Spanish, leaving 1,044 among the other 195 institutions. Full details regarding Hispanic enrollment and graduation data may be found in Tables C-4, D-4, E-4, F-4, G-4, and H-4.

Pacific/Asian American Students

Table 17 reports comparative data across several years for this group of students. Pacific/Asian Americans are defined as "persons from Asian and Pacific Island ancestry, whether born abroad, in North America or the trust territories of the Pacific Ocean." The summaries contained in Table 17 are taken from Tables C-5, D-5, and E-5 in this and earlier editions of the Fact Book. The data have only been collected since 1977, the first year listed in the Table. The growth phenomenon found with other groups prevails here also, but with one significant difference. 1982 did not bring an increase, as was the experience in every other subgrouping. In fact, there were nine fewer Pacific/Asian Americans in 1982 than was the situation just one year earlier. This slight drop came after four successive years of growth, cumulatively +44.9% since 1977. And it should be noted that all of the reduction was in the post-M.Div. programs, with twelve fewer masters students and seven fewer doctoral registrants. The ordination degree group continued to rise, slightly, as did the special/unclassified category. The largest numbers of Pacific/Asian students are in the inter- and nondenominational classification (178 enrollees), Southern Baptist (104), and United Methodist schools (95). Regionally the greatest concentration is in the Far West, where twenty seminaries enroll 271 Pacific/Asian Americans. Second place goes to the forty-one schools of theology in the Great Lakes region where 105 students are found. The smallest

number is registered in the New England institutions. Table 17 also provides a distribution of these students by sex. The parallel nature of the minority/women's data is confirmed here, and the numbers have been rising among Pacific/Asian women. In contrast, the number of male students has risen much more slowly. In a year when the totals decreased slightly, it is interesting to note six additional women registered, with the male population declining by fifteen.

Native American Enrollment

Table 18 reports the enrollment of "native Americans," defined as persons either of North American Indian or Eskimo ancestry. Since the numbers are so small, the data have not been subjected to computer analysis. It is apparent that there

is a slight increase each year. In just three years the growth has been +65.4%, although that percentage is quite meaningless given the very low number from which the growth began. This year graduate registrants--post-M.Div.--dropped somewhat. Although not included in the table, graduation statistics are also interesting.

Thus, it is apparent that the hypothesis does have merit. The number of ordinands being graduated is increasing, but the rate of growth is very small. In contrast, the in-ministry D.Min. does continue to attract a substantially larger clientele, and this is a major ingredient in the explanation of seminary expansion.

Changes in Numbers of Graduates

Table 20 provides data on graduation from the several professional degrees. Enrollments in these have been identified above in Table 5, page 7. The reader will note the parallels between these two tables when examining the information about the M.Div. degree. Registration for it has risen very slowly across the past decade, hovering in the 26,000 - 26,999 range for several years. Similar results are evident among graduates. For eight successive years between 1969-70 and 1976-77 the M.Div. recipients numbered in the 5,000-plus range. For the last five

years this has risen to the 6,000-plus size, and it does appear that it probably will reach 7,000 next year. This is surely not a rapid increase. In that period (1970 to the present), total seminary enrollments rose +69.3%; M.Div. enrollments by +31.5%, with M.Div. graduates up +32.7%. Thus, it is evident that ordination graduates are increasing at a rate which is less than one-half that being experienced by enrollment in the total institution.

D.Min. graduates continue to grow at a slow pace. By definition this degree in the in-ministry form is for "one year of full-time study, or its equivalent part-time." Most institutions indicate that students ordinarily need two or three years part-time to complete the requirements. However, graduation data do not reflect this rate of movement through the program. In fact, one would expect somewhat larger numbers of graduates when estimating based solely on the total persons enrolled. It seems evident that the graduation statistics do not support the claims of those critics who believe that the degree is too easily and quickly awarded.

It has been noted earlier that the rate of growth for the one- and two-year degrees is quite substantial (Table 5 above). Hence, one should not be surprised at the graduation data indicated in Table 20. There has been an unbroken upward climb of numbers of persons receiving these degrees year after year. Since enrollment continues to rise rapidly, this phenomenon will surely be repeated in future years.

Table 21 reports the degree recipients from the major doctoral programs offered by schools of theology. Two of these reveal continued fluctuating patterns of graduation. The S.T.D./Th.D. degrees registered a new low, with only thirty-two

graduates during the past year, down -59.5% from the previous academic year. However, enrollments in those programs have been dropping slowly but steadily (see Table 7, page 9) in recent years, and a reduction in graduates is the inevitable

expectation. There has been a similar up/down experience with the doctorate in religious education. Twenty-seven graduates during 1981-82 constitute the second highest total since ATS began collecting this information, and this more than doubled the record just a year ago. Nonetheless the twenty-seven persons are one fewer than those receiving degrees just two years ago! Examining the data for those fourteen years reported in Table 21, one must conclude that there is a gradual increase in religious education doctorates, but the rate of growth is quite slow.

The situation with the Doctor of Philosophy is quite different. For the first time, this year the number of recipients jumped dramatically higher, a +57.8% increase in one year from 230 to 363. Since enrollments in recent years, while

increasing somewhat, have shown no rapid growth, this was hardly to be expected. Table 10 above (page 14) has already indicated a quite enhanced growth in the number of women who were awarded the degree during the last year, and it is equally evident that men recipients paralleled this pattern. Graduation with the doctorate is difficult to predict, since dissertation research and writing are so often done on a part-time basis while engaged in other activities (often during the first teaching job). It would appear that 1981-82 was a banner year for the successful completion of doctoral study, assuredly one unmatched in the statistics for previous years.

NUMBER AND DISTRIBUTION OF PERSONNEL

Tables O through V in the appendices provide full details regarding the numbers of professional personnel employed in the Association's 196 member schools. These are reported in separate tables for administrators, faculty, and library

staff. As with enrollment data discussed above, these tables are precisely parallel to those in earlier Fact Books to facilitate ready comparisons across the years. Size, status, and denominational distribution are included.

Table 22 summarizes these data for selected years since 1970-71. Since the number of institutions included has been steadily rising, the data are here recorded on a "per school" basis. It will be readily apparent that the increases have not been uniform by any means. In 1970 the average student group was 173+ persons, growing to 268+ in 1982, up +54.7% in those twelve years. However the average full-time faculty rose only +7.1% in that same period, and the typical library staff actually decreased by -2.8%. Only administrative personnel grew significantly, up +32.5% during the period. This percentage figure may actually be misleading, however. The average size of administrative staff grew only from slightly more than four persons to about five and one-half.

Table 23 extends this analysis one additional step by examining the ratios of

instructional service performed by full and part-time teaching personnel. These data explain the absence of much full-time faculty growth. While the former were increasing from only 2,297 persons in 1971 to 2,519 in 1982 (up +9.7%), persons providing teaching on a part-time basis rose from 1,498 to 2,693 (up +79.8%). Thus it is apparent that the additional teaching required by the growth in student bodies has to a large extent been supplied by employing more adjunct persons part-time. In 1971 their proportion of all teaching was but 15.7%. By 1982 it had risen to 23.1%, an increase of almost one half. This almost matches the slightly more than fifty percent growth in the average student body noted above. While data on the extent of off-campus education do not appear in these Fact Books, the discerning reader cannot fail to recognize the parallel between emergence of such extension programs and the sharp increase in use of part-time instructors.

Sex Distribution of Personnel

Tables O through V also provide the data regarding administrative, faculty, and library personnel distributed across both sex and racial categories. Tables 24, 25, and 26 summarize this information and report it for several successive

years. Last year the number of women administrators rose above two hundred for the first time, and it continued to increase this year. Actually both women and men increased significantly this year: twenty-five more men; twenty-eight additional women. Since 1971 women employed as administrators has risen +124.3%, while men increased only +15.3% in number. Nonetheless, although the comparative growth rate is impressive, even with this rise women constitute only 21.2% of all professional administrative staff.

Table 25 provides similar information regarding theological school faculty.

In 1971, when these data were first obtained, there were only seventy-three women teaching full time in seminaries. Eleven years later this had more than tripled to 244 women faculty, up +234.2%. In that same time period male instructional staff grew only +2.3%. Yet one must not be overly impressed with these comparisons. In 1971 the number of women was so minuscule that almost any upward movement in numbers would provide large percentages. The fact that women, despite these gains, nonetheless still constitute only 9.7% of the instructional staff must not be overlooked. This is well below the 23.7% of students which women comprise. Table 25 also reports data on part-time instructional staff for the same years. Here the ratio of women is consistently nearly double that of women teaching full time, and it rose again this year.

Table 26 repeats these data but presents them in much greater detail for each position within administration, faculty, and library staff. Only the information from the last four years is included. However readers interested in parallel data for earlier years can obtain it by referring to earlier editions of this Fact Book. This year there is one woman holding the position of chief administrative officer, the first in the past five years. The number of female academic deans remained constant at eight, but there were increases among women serving as deans of students, registrars, business officers, and directors of public relations. These upward changes were sufficient to explain the increase noted above from 203 women in 1981 to 231 this current academic year.

The numbers of women faculty rose in each of the three higher ranks. There are now fifty-six full professors, more than double the number holding this position as recently as four years ago. Together with sixty associate professors, women now number 116 persons in these traditionally tenured ranks. In 1978-79 there

were only seventy women in these positions. The assistant professor rank reached 101 this year, the first time that women have ever numbered that many occupants in any single position on the academic ladder. Thus, it is obvious that there is growth, but it moves quite slowly in its upward pattern.

The number of women employed as library staff continues to fluctuate somewhat

erratically. In 1978-79 there were 280 women, but this was the peak year. Each of the next three years the number diminished, until reaching a low of but 251 last year. Then inexplicably it moved upward again in the current year to 275 women, still slightly below the levels reached earlier.

Table 27 reports parallel information on the employment of black professional staff in the three different categories. Once again there has not been very much change in the years included. Administrators move up and down in numbers, this year reaching thirty-eight persons, but fourteen of these are in the five black institutions. Black faculty actually decreased by six, although this is a bit misleading. Full-time black faculty rose over one hundred for the first time, up ten from last year. At the same time blacks teaching part-time dropped by sixteen persons, for the net loss of six. But thirty-four of the 103 full-time black faculty teach in the five black schools of theology, leaving only 69 blacks distributed across 191 primarily white seminaries, hardly a significant number. Black library staff number fourteen persons, exactly half of them in the five black schools. In summary, there is very slight overall upward growth in the total numbers of blacks employed professionally in theological education, although there is some variation up and down across the years. In 1978-79 a total of 216 blacks held positions. This rose to 240 last year, slipping slightly to 239 in the current year.

COMPENSATION

Tables NN-VV in the appendices provide full details regarding total compensation of professional staff. Each position is identified, with data distributed on each category of compensation. The sums listed in those tables are for total compensation, and the data in the text also reflect this. Total compensation includes cash salary, housing allowance (if any) or value of housing provided, fringe benefits (i.e., insurance, etc.), and the employer's contribution to pension programs. Salaries of administrative staff are on a twelve-month basis, while faculty remuneration covers only the nine-month academic year (even though it may be disbursed in twelve monthly checks for convenience). Extra compensation, such as summer teaching, etc., is not included in these amounts.

Persons interested in compensation patterns should study the appendices carefully, since there is fairly wide variation. In some instances total compensation may be quite similar, but its components somewhat different. The percentage of compensation included in fringe and pension benefits varies greatly. Hence one must be careful when comparing "salaries," to be certain that the entire package of benefits is included in the evaluation.

Inflation has been a major factor in Fact Books published during the last several years. While total compensation has been rising steadily, the rate of growth has seldom matched the impact of the price spiral. At this writing (January 1983) this situation has shown a remarkable shift. Between July 1981 and July 1982 the Consumer Price Index rose only +6.5%, down considerably from the +10.7%, +13.2%, and 11.3% experienced in the preceding three academic years. In fact, the drop has been even more dramatic, since calendar 1982 has been officially reported to have

experienced only a +3.9% increase. Thus, after three successive years of double-digit inflation, there has been a significant reduction. These factors are reported in the tables which follow, since a simple listing of salary changes would be very misleading.

Administrative Compensation

Table 28 summarizes the data for each administrative position for the past five years. This is taken from Table NN in the appendices. Tables OO and PP provide parallel information distributed by denominational and regional groups, as well as by degree level among the accredited schools of theology. Among administrative staff employed in accredited institutions six of the nine positions realized some slight gain on the cost of living index this year. The overall average for accredited administrators was one percent above the CPI index, the first time this has occurred in several years. Associate school administrators were even more fortunate than that, gaining 2.3%, after losses each of the past four years. Specific details for each position are available in Table 28 and Tables NN, OO, and PP.

Faculty Compensation

The same detailed information is found for theological school faculty in Tables 29-34 in the text and Tables QQ, RR, and SS in the appendices. As was the situation with administrators, once again total compensation is reported (salary, housing, fringe benefits, and pension). For the first time since 1976-77 the overall faculty average in accredited schools exceeded the Consumer Price Index. While one can be pleased with this gain, it should not be overvalued. The gain this year was +1.7%, but that hardly matches the cumulative loss of -10.2% across the last five years. To illustrate, since 1976-77 full professors in accredited

schools have received a +59.6% increase in total compensation. During that same period the cost of living grew by +70.8%, for a cumulative loss of -11.2%. This emphasizes the importance of viewing compensation growth alongside the cost of living. Thus, although the results are positive this year, one must set that fact into

perspective across several years. The tables in the text have been designed to do this clearly. Tables 29 and 32 for accredited and nonaccredited schools provide the dollar amounts for seven successive years. Tables 30 and 33 report the percentage of change. And Tables 31 and 34 adjust these to reflect the impact of the Consumer Price Index. Full details may be found in the appendices.

Library Staff Compensation

Table 35 summarizes the information for library staff. Full details are available in Tables TT, UU, and VV, including the distribution for each position. These results are much the same as for the other professional employees.

Summary

Table 36 provides all of these data in summary form since 1969-70, the year that the first Fact Book was published. In that thirteen year span the cost of living has risen +165.0%, and no category of professional staff comes close to matching it. Faculty and library staff in accredited schools are the best. Administrators in accredited institutions and library staff in unaccredited schools have the least

enviable compensation record, more than thirty-five percent behind the consumer price index.

Table 37 reports parallel information for the last five years. Once again no category equals the cost of living rise. Faculty and library staff in the unaccredited schools have come the closest to matching inflation, with administrators in those same institutions experiencing the greatest loss. All three categories of professional employees in the accredited schools fall in between these extremes.

FINANCES - REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES

Tables AA-JJ provide the overall financial information for the ATS schools of theology for the 1981-82 year. These are available in the appendices. Please note that two sets of tables are supplied. Each table includes the appropriate dollar amounts, the ratio of educational and general revenue/expenditure which that represents (stated as a percentage), and the calculated per student sum. As noted above, student data have been provided on both a head count and full-time equivalent basis. Hence two sets of tables are needed. AA-1 through JJ-1 indicate per student costs on the head count basis: AA-2 to JJ-2 are full-time equivalency. In some instances where there are large numbers of part-time students these cost calculations are sharply different. This is the second year that both sets of student cost data have been supplied. The tables in the successive Fact Books are fully parallel and may be used together to make comparisons.

Table 38 summarizes the total financial data for each successive year. Included are the total revenues and expenditures (educational/general, student aid, and auxiliary enterprises). It is apparent there that 1970-71 was the worst year in the Association's institutions. The deficit reached more than five million dollars. The following year a turnaround began, and it has quite steadily continued. By 1975-76 the deficits had been eliminated, and a slowly but regularly increasing surplus has resulted. Last year (1981-82) this reached almost ten million dollars.

The casual reader might well misunderstand the import of this situation, since it obviously is a quite significant sum. It must be set in perspective. The \$9,865,000 cumulative total is only \$51,114 per school, or \$195 per student

enrolled. When viewed in this way it should be apparent that the amounts involved are really quite modest. It actually required \$6,591 to educate each seminary student last year, making the "surplus" less than three percent of that cost. Thus, any temptation to interpret Table 38 as implying that all financial needs are solved for seminaries would be unwarranted. Furthermore, one must keep in mind the salary data reported in the previous chapter. Virtually all of this "surplus" can

readily be explained in relation to compensation deficiencies. If salaries had kept pace with inflation during the last several years there would be no surplus at all. In fact, a substantial deficit situation would prevail. When one adds the tendency to defer maintenance, well known across higher education, the surplus is more adequately understood. The surplus is a reality, but it has been achieved at considerable cost.

The discerning reader will also be interested in the reasons for the substantial increase in the surplus this year. Much of it is easily explained. Auxiliary enterprises (dormitories, food service, bookstores, etc.) have presented seminaries with financial problems for some time. Every year they cost more to operate than the fees received cover. In 1981-82 this situation was reversed. The 1980-81 data produced an auxiliary deficit of \$1,419,000, which had to be subsidized by general revenues. But last year a surplus of \$1,558,000 was reported, for a net change in the total financial situation of almost three million dollars. Thus, most of the explanation rests here. To state it in per student terms, during 1980-81 each student paid \$28.60 less than the actual cost of providing these auxiliary services. In 1981-82 the average person paid \$30.82 more than the cost. For the first time in several years these auxiliary enterprises were not a financial drain on general revenues. And this fact is the major reason for the large increase in the cumulative financial situation found in Table 38.

Table 39 examines these data from another perspective, the per student sums distributed across each of the educational and general income/expenditure categories for each of the last three years. The data also separate the accredited and "other" groups of schools. The general rate of increase noted in Table 38 is

reflected here also. Annually both revenues and expenditures per student have risen in accredited schools within the narrow range from ten to twelve percent. The data for the "other" group of member schools are less consistent. Here the fluctuations are more volatile, especially for revenues. The range of expenditures has been increasing at a more uniform rate.

Sources of Revenue

Table 40 compares various distributions of seminaries with respect to sources of revenue. Data for 1980-81 and 1981-82 are presented in parallel columns. This information comes from Tables AA-2 and CC-2 in the appendices. The variations among institutions are demonstrated by tuition ratios. While both accredited and

nonaccredited schools receive similar proportions of revenue (28% and 29%, respectively last year) from tuition, this does not prevail in other groups of schools of theology. The larger seminaries receive twice the proportion of income that the

smallest group does. And the denominational range is from a low of but 13% in United Church of Canada to 45% in the interdenominational group. Endowment ratios present contrasting comparisons. The lowest ratio is 7% for Roman Catholic-Canada institutions to 46% for the Presbyterian Church-United States category. Gifts/grants reveal similar variations, ranging from 28% in United Presbyterian

institutions to 64% for the Southern Baptist group. Regional variations can be found in Table DD-2.

Patterns of Expenditure

These data are available in Tables FF-2 through JJ-2. While the variations here are not as great as noted for revenue categories, yet there are some differences. Administrative ratios vary from 21% (Southern Baptist) to 41% (primarily black institutions). Instructional costs are similar in their patterns. Library support ranges from 6% to 12%. Other examples of these variations can be found in the tables.
