The Association also publishes annually a Directory of Theological Schools.

INTRODUCTION

This is the seventeenth annual edition of the Fact Book. Each year all of the Association's member schools are required to provide annual reports on forms which are supplied. These reports include information on enrollment, professional staff, and salaries for the current year, 1985-86. They also include graduation statistics, financial reports, and library data from the previous academic year, 1984-85. Per student revenue and per student/per faculty expenditures are based on the fall 1984 "head count" and "full-time equivalency" enrollment and employment, as well as on the audited financial information for the 1984-85 year.

TABLES: Enrollment totals are reported for individual schools of theology in Tables A, B-1, and B-2. This is the fifth successive year in which the per student and per faculty revenue/expenditure tables (AA-1 through JJ-2) are supplied on both a "head count" and "full-time equivalency" basis. Tables C-6, D-6, and E-6 in the appendices provide these latter data, with Table B-2 reporting both the "head count" and "FTE enrollments" for individual schools. Tables AA-1 through JJ-1 provide revenue/expenditure data on the "head count" basis, while Tables AA-2 through JJ-2 are parallel, using the "full-time equivalency" information. The differences between the two become increasingly important as schools continue to experience an influx of more part-time students in their various degree programs. This is the second year in which Gifts and Grants Income are reported in Tables WW-1 through 8.

PURPOSE: From the beginning of publication a primary purpose of these Fact Books has been to provide annually information on parallel patterns permitting ready comparisons across the years. Where changes have been introduced these have generally been in the form of providing additional information not previously supplied or to acknowledge changes that have occurred. All data, with the exception of the Native American enrollments, are subjected to computer analysis. Since these latter numbers continue to be quite small, they have been fully summarized in the text, but are not found in the computer generated appendices.

CLASSIFICATIONS: The data received from each school are classified in several ways: size of enrollment, accredited or "other" (i.e., candidate and associate member institutions), university relation, cluster membership, race, denomination, region of location, and highest degree offered for the accredited schools only. These classifications provide the basis

for the distributions found in the tables included in the appendices. Table A indicates the classification identifiers for each member school, including both the 1984 and 1985 fall enrollments. Table B-1 reports the changing enrollment patterns for each member school on a quadrennial basis beginning in 1960 or the year of initial Association membership, if later than 1960. Table B-2, included for the fifth successive year, reports individual school enrollment by separate degree programs for both 1984 and 1985, "head count" and "full-time equivalent."

Certain arbitrary decisions are necessary with regard to these classifications. For example, a seminary is classified as a part of a university only if the larger institution possesses two other professional schools or departments operating at the graduate level. Schools are classified as related to a cluster only if the relationship includes at least two other schools of theology. Denominational groups are sorted and reported publicly--in these Fact Books--only if the denomination maintains at least four institutions which are members of the Association. Because the computer cannot deal with dual denominational status--which some schools hold, each has been classified on the basis of the primary church membership of the student body. Thus, Andover Newton is included in the United Church of Christ category, rather than American Baptist. Neither Bexley Hall nor the Berkeley Divinity School, both Episcopal seminaries, are included in the Episcopal data because of their relationships with Colgate Rochester and the Yale Divinity School respectively. The Lutheran category is not one denomination, but it combines the data for the American Lutheran Church, Association of Evangelical Lutheran Churches, and Lutheran Church in America schools into a single inclusive category. Prior to the 1982-83 edition the term "Lutheran" applied only to the Lutheran Church in America schools. There are ten institutions included in this new composite Lutheran category. This is the third year the new denomination, the Presbyterian Church, U.S.A., appears. The data for prior years have combined the information for the Presbyterian Church in the United States and the United Presbyterian Church. Note also that, at the request of the school, the data for the Pacific School of Religion were shifted in 1983-84 to the United Church of Christ category, rather than the inter-/nondenominational grouping, as in the past. Tables in the text were adjusted to reflect this change. However, readers using previous Fact Books must do so with care, since these two subgroupings are no longer precisely parallel in successive volumes.

Since 1980 the Association has had three separate categories of institutional membership: accredited member, candidate for accredited member, and associate member. For the purposes of the Fact Book, the latter two groupings (candidates and associates) have been combined in the "Other" column in the tables presenting size/status data. Please

note that this year schools are listed as members of Clusters/Consortium if the school is listed as a member of such a group listed in the ATS Annual Directory under Clusters and Consortia. Schools will note a goodly number of changes in their classification this year as this characteristic was updated.

As in the past, all salary scales reported in the volume have been edited to preserve confidentiality. Hence any salary data field with less than three salaries being reported indicates the number of persons but does not provide any salary information.

Finally, as editor I have written the text to report and emphasize those data which appear to me to be most important. The goal has been factual presentation and description. No value judgments about size, mode of financing, patterns of expenditure, composition of student body, or other matters are intended. Each reader is invited to make his/her own judgments on the data and their import in reference to his/her own perspectives and commitments in the theological education world. The additional caption, e.g., [TABLE 4], indicates clearly the textual commentary on tables 1-39.

Again, I do wish to thank my predecessor, Dr. Marvin J. Taylor, for the substantial time and help he gave in analyzing this year's data for the preparation of this report.

The Fact Book has been prepared by the ATS staff and is offered to the ATS member schools, as well as the general public, with the hope that it will be useful to those with responsibility for the management of the theological education enterprise in North America. The work has been done with the strong conviction that management decisions are best made when the persons charged with making them have the widest range of and most complete data available to inform their deliberations.

ENROLLMENT

[TABLE 1]

Theological school enrollments declined this year for the first time since the data were first published in the Fact Book for 1969. The overall decrease was slight--0.16%, but it is interesting that the decrease was confined to USA schools (0.6%) with Canada recording a 6.9% growth. The increase in 1984 had been 2.5%. One school closed between 1984-1985. The

majority of students from this school transferred to another school. The number involved, however, was so small as not to affect the overall percentages. Factors which are reflected in this decline will be not only the influence of demographic data which have predicted gradually diminishing enrollments for higher education, but also the broad American cultural influence which has been less than supportive of those opting to prepare for ordained ministry.

Table 1 provides these enrollment data for each year since 1969, the initial publication year for these Fact Books. In that sixteen year span, seminary enrollments have risen from 29,815 persons in 1969 to 56,377 this year, up +89.1%. Some of this growth can be explained by the first column, the increase in the number of Association member schools reporting each fall. The institutional growth rate, however, has been only 15.3%, far below the student enrollment growth of 89.1%. Readers interested in details of this change in membership should consult the 1980-81 Fact Book. Table 1 also indicates that the growth has been chiefly in professional degree programs, i.e., those preparing persons for some leadership role in the churches. The graduate programs, confined chiefly to masters and doctoral degrees primarily for higher education and secondary school teaching,

have fluctuated up and down during the years. In 1982 they enrolled about the same number as 1969. During the past three years, this number has held almost steady with 4,284 enrolled in 1985. This is still well below the number and, more important, the proportion of graduate students enrolled in the early 1970s. Thus, enrollment growth has been church occupation related, rather than academic career oriented.

In the major denominational groupings, only the following recorded increases: Canadian Roman Catholic +2.2%; Southern Baptist +3.2%; Episcopalian +6.3%. The increase for the latter two was principally in non-degree programs. The following recorded decreases: Canada United Church -1.4%; American Baptist -8.0%; Christian Church -2.7%; Lutheran Church -3.4%; United Methodist -3.7%; Presbyterian USA -3.4%; USA Roman Catholic -0.7%; United Church -2.8%; Interdenominational Schools -0.4%.

Table 2 provides more precise data on enrollment, since the number of institutions reporting in the last two years was not the same. This table reflects data from schools reporting in both years, and the decrease was -0.14%, not too different from the -0.16% of Table 1. The school which closed had a relatively small enrollment, not sufficient to affect the overall percentages.

Table 3 continues these comparisons, this time on a five-year basis. During both 1980 and 1985, there were 189 schools reporting both years, and their total enrollments for the two different years are reflected in the table. They constitute a +10.7% growth, or c. 2.1% per year. In that same time period higher education has been growing at an average rate of between one and two percent. During the past year, theological schools have not kept up with the national average.

Table 4 provides a different view of these data. The preceding tables have tabulated persons registered, regardless of the extent of their time commitment to study, called simply a head-count. Table 4 reports on persons studying full time, or in the instance of part-time students, their full-time equivalency. These data are available only since 1978. The decline in Full-Time Equivalent enrollment is more substantial (-1.5%) than in Head-Count enrollment. There has likewise been a decline in the percentage of FTE (68.9%) in relation to head-count. During this seven-year period in which we have recorded these statistics, the average student study load has declined almost 10% from 78% of a full load of studies to 68.9%. This indicates a continuing growth in the number of students studying part-time at these schools. Theological schools across the country are experiencing a steady increase in the number of candidates who are starting theological studies at a more advanced age when the responsibilities of family or of employment will not permit full-time involvement in study. This will include many already involved in some form of ministerial service who want to improve the educational background which they bring to ministry. Schools have not been able to increase financial aid rapidly enough to meet these new needs. As a result, the need of increasing endowment for student financial aid has assumed a higher place in an average school's priorities, especially since graduate-level education calls for a high level of freedom for reflection and research. Theological schools are learning to accommodate to the higher number of part-time students with changes in the scheduling of courses and often more concentrated offerings. Deans and registrars indicate a trend toward older persons, often making a career change, and frequently with families to support. Several studies are being conducted this year both on denominational lines and on a cross denominational basis to document this shift in age and to study the response of schools to accommodate the special needs of older students.

The part-time rate of study, however, is not uniform across the several types of program offered. The Master of Divinity, the standard degree

preparing one for ordination, enrolls by far the largest number of persons, and they register for an average load of 84.6%, well above the overall average load of 68.9%. There has been regular decline in this average since 1978 when it stood at 90.5% for the M.Div. program. The decline during the past year has only been -0.3%.

Of interest is the fact that persons enrolled in the four-five-year Master of Divinity programs have a consistent high ration of 97% studying full-time in relation to head-count. This year the decline in general enrollment was also noticeable here (-2.7% head-count; -3.1% full-time equivalent), reversing the strong increase of last year (+11.5% and +8.2%).

Regional enrollment patterns also show some variations. The Plains region has the highest FTE ratio (73.8%), and the Far West has the lowest (59.8%). New England (70.7%), Great Lakes (73.0%), and Southeast (71.5%) are all above the average. Far West (59.8%) and Mid East (66.0%) are below the average. Canada (68.5%) and the Southwest (68.1%) are very close to the average. It is interesting to note that the Far West had a significant increase since last year (2.8%) in the percentage of FTE to Head-Count enrollment.

The only significant changes in regional enrollment were increases in three regions: Canada (+2.4%); Southeast (+1.8%); and Southwest (+2.3%). Despite a decrease in head-count enrollment, the Far West increased its FTE enrollment by 1.6%.

Denominational comparisons of full-time students are also interesting. These range from the United Church of Canada (58.6%), to the Lutheran Church (80.4%). Southern Baptist, the Christian Churches, the United Methodists, the Presbyterian USA, the United Church of Christ, and Interdenominational schools all hover within a percentage point of 66%, close to the average. Above them, are the American Baptists (70.1%), USA Roman Catholic (76.7%), and Episcopal (78.6%). The ratio in Episcopal schools is down 4.5% since last year.

Professional Degree Enrollments

Table 5 records the major degree enrollments for selected years since 1969. In terms of overall growth, the Doctor of Ministry program has done best from 201 persons in 1969 to 6,345 this year. It continues to command 12.5% of total seminary professional program enrollment, despite a decrease of 5.6% in total D.Min. enrollment from last year. The M.Div. population has grown only 37.7% in 16 years by comparison with a total enrollment increase of 89.1% in seminaries. The M.Div. commands a smaller percentage each year, presently 54.5%. The two-year graduate programs and the special certificate programs are increasingly prominent as these percentages have

advanced to 18.6% and 14.2% respectively. It is clear that seminaries are attracting students with a wider variety of interests. The D.Min. group is largely full-time professionals already holding the M.Div. and seeking advanced competence for the performance of their duties. This program holds a secure place among the professional degrees.

Further detail on D.Min. enrollments is reported in Table 6. There are two different degree patterns, both carrying the D.Min. designation. The "in-sequence" model is a four-year program which includes the accomplishments of the more customary three-year M.Div. and adds another full year of preordination preparation. It was this pattern which first emerged in the 60s and was responsible for creating an interest in new approaches. The "in-ministry" track adds one additional year, usually done part-time and spread across two or three years of advanced preparation. This track almost always requires a period of full-time ministerial experience following the award of the M.Div. Through the years there has been a steady decline of interest in the in-sequence degree track, both on the part of students and of institutions. Table 6 indicates its extent. Enrollment dropped from 499 persons (25 schools offering this track) in 1975 down to 208 students in 10 schools this autumn. At the same time, the in-ministry degree track almost doubled in registrants, up from 3,211 to 6,137. Almost 50% more institutions offered this track than in 1975. These data surely indicate that there is positive clergy response to a program which provides "advanced competence in the practice of ministry."

There are some interesting enrollment contrasts in the D.Min. While women as a group constitute 25.8% of total seminary enrollment, 30% of in-sequence D.Min. registrants are women. It is only in this program and in the two-year masters degrees that women are so well represented (43.7%). By way of comparison, women make up only 7% of the D.Min. in-ministry students, well below these ratios. While somewhat striking in contrast, this is probably to be expected. The entrance of significant numbers of women into ministry is a rather new phenomenon. Hence, only a very small pool of applicants possess both the M.Div. and the years of full-time professional ministry experience which are usually prerequisite for admission. Given the substantial numbers of women entering ministry, this ratio will be changing.

The D.Min. program presents other somewhat startling contrasts. While 88 institutions offer the in-ministry model, most of them have quite modest enrollments in the program. In fact, these in-ministry D.Min. students are very unevenly distributed across the Association's membership. About one-third are found in only 4 schools of theology, leaving the remaining two-thirds distributed across 84 schools. Full details can be found in the appendices, especially tables B-2, C-1, and D-1.

Graduate Student Enrollments

Table 7 provides the details in summary form for selected years since 1969. The Association classifies as "graduate" those degree programs which require four or five years beyond the baccalaureate, or which require the M.Div. plus one to three additional years of study. The most obvious impression from the table is one of random fluctuation, up and down. This year the total graduate enrollment is slightly lower than last year. The decrease is entirely in the masters level programs (-5.5%), 101 students, whereas at the doctoral level there was an increase of 52 students (+2%). It seems clear that no simple pattern can be found to explain the phenomenon. In the early 1970s the emergence of the D.Min. degree was thought to provide an alternative which would lower at least the graduate masters level of enrollment, especially the S.T.M. Though the masters enrollment has dropped -40.6% since 1971, enrollment in masters programs has been almost steady for the past five years. These programs appear to respond to a definite group. Doctoral level programs have grown +163% since 1971; interest continues to rise and the need for those degrees is still there. The D.Min. after spectacular growth appears to have leveled off during the past couple of years. It is worth noting that the change in enrollment in the Th.D. and Ph.D. categories is accounted for almost entirely by one school which changed the designation of its degrees.

In the light of the well-known retrenchment in higher education, and the scarcity of new positions, one might expect a diminished interest in the doctoral level degrees. As we noted, this is not the case. The growth since 1971 has been +163%. The fluctuations noted above are not evident in the Ph.D. doctoral program. The details on these degrees may be examined in the appendices, Table C-1.

Sex Distribution of Theological Students

The Association has received these data from member schools since 1972. Table 8 provides the information distributed both by sex and by selected degree programs for several years since 1972. Full details are found in Tables C-3, D-3, and E-3. All of these tables are parallel to those found in earlier editions of the Fact Book permitting precise comparisons. Data on graduation will be found in Tables F-3, G-3, and H-3.

The continuing rapid growth in the enrollment of women is demonstrated by examining the totals at the bottom of Table 8. Thirteen years ago, women constituted 10.2% of the total student population. This year they constitute 25.8% of the student group. The actual head-count of women has grown by 430 or 3% since last year, a steady growth especially significant in the light of the overall decline in enrollment this past year. The growth rate has declined from the highest recorded at 30.7% in 1974 to 3% the past year. The average growth for the past six years was 6.1%. The increase during the past year (3%) was the lowest we have recorded.

While the percentage of women enrolled in the three and four-year degrees which customarily lead to ordination (18.6%) still lags behind the overall average for the enrollment of women, even that percentage has continued to grow. In 1972 women were only 4.7% of its registrants. The enrollment of women in academic doctoral programs has more than tripled since 1972. The presence of women on the theological academic scene as well as in church ministry is continuing to grow in significance, despite the limitations on ordination in several denominations.

Table 9 adds more precision to the observations above about the enrollment of women in ordination programs. Here the M.Div. and the in-sequence D.Min. have been segregated for comparison. Between 1979 and 1985, there was no increase in men enrollees for these two degree programs. In that six-year period total seminary enrollments rose +16.6%. However, the enrollment of women in these two programs in that period increased +44.0%. The year 1985 marks a decline in absolute numbers in male enrollment. The 22,672 men enrolled in 1985 were only a few more than was the situation in 1976. And during that period, seminary enrollments rose by over 13,354 persons, with none of this growth bringing additional numbers of men to the ordination programs. In summary, in 1976 women were only 11.5% of the students in ordination programs. By 1985 they had become 20.8% of the total. During that time, the number of male registrants has virtually stood still.

Table 10 provides data on the results of this increased enrollment of women in the graduate, post-M.Div. programs. It is immediately apparent

that 1984-85 reverses the decline from the high of 1981-82. In that year, 1981-82, the largest numbers of women ever reported received both graduate masters and academic doctoral degrees, comprising 23.5% of the former and 20.8% of the latter. This pace was not repeated in the following year. But one must examine both the numbers of women being graduated and the percentage of the total as well. In the instance of the masters degrees, there was an increase in both numbers and percentage since 1984. Such was also the case in the doctoral degrees awarded. Whereas the total number of students receiving post-M.Div. academic degrees rose +7% during the past year, the number of women graduates rose proportionately more (+14%). It is clear that the number of women available for teaching positions is increasing year by year. However, as Table 10 indicates, the trend across the years is still upward. Not only are larger numbers of women beginning these programs, they are also completing them and receiving the appropriate degrees.

Table 11 provides parallel information about women receiving the professional degrees. The field of church education has been one area of full time service open to women for many years. Hence the reader should not be surprised to find that 43.6% of the Master of Religious Education graduates last year were women. As more and more women enter ordained ministry, one might expect that percentage to drop gradually, but this has not been the case.

The women graduates in the Master of Divinity program present a far more striking contrast. As noted on the following page, total M.Div.

enrollments have been moving upward at a very modest pace, when compared to other degree programs. But the role of women in the M.Div. has been rising at a rapid rate, and this is reflected in the numbers of graduates. In just eight years (since 1976-77) women M.Div. recipients have increased 200% (from 462 to 1,384). In that same period of time men M.Div. graduates rose by only 9.6% (from 5,158 to 5,653). This sharp contrast is highlighted even more when the data in Tables 11 and 19 are compared.

The situation with respect to the in-sequence D.Min. presents an interesting contrast. As Table 11 reveals, here the numbers of women graduates have fluctuated across the years. But that has also been the characteristic of total numbers of graduates. Note for example, the data for the last three years: 30 women graduates constituted 28.6% of the D.Min. class in 1981-82. Last year there were 16 women graduates, constituting 34.7% of a total of 46 graduates; this year, there were 18 of 67 graduates (26.9%). The steadily diminishing enrollments in this track of the D.Min. program are now being fully reflected in graduation statistics. Even though the program seems to be gradually disappearing and even though the actual numbers are not growing, the role of women in it remains strong.

Table 12 pushes these data one additional step by examining them within denominational categories. Ordination graduates here are defined as persons receiving either the M.Div. or the D.Min. in-sequence. While there is some up/down fluctuation from year to year, it is apparent from the table that both the numbers and percentages of the total represented by women have increased since 1976-77. In the United Church of Christ, women are one-half of the candidates ready for ordination consideration. For the United Church of Canada, Episcopalians, Presbyterian U.S.A., and United Methodists it approximates 36%. Other church bodies have lower rates. Even the churches of the Southern Baptist Convention, a group which has

traditionally been unwilling to approve the ordination of women, find themselves with significant numbers of women fully prepared for ordination (138 women, or 11.5% of the total graduates last year).

Persons interested in additional details regarding the role of women in theological schools should consult Tables C-3, D-3, and E-3 for enrollment data and Tables F-3, G-3, and H-3 for graduation statistics.

Black Student Enrollment

These data have been received from member schools since fall 1970, and the successive Fact Books have contained them. Table 13 provides a summary of this information. The reader will note that the numbers of blacks enrolled in seminaries has risen steadily across the years. The average rate of increase per year has been 9.3%, which is more than double the average total enrollment increase of 4.1%. However, the reader must be careful when using these statistics. Black enrollment started from such a low point that phenomenal rates of growth have still not produced large numbers of black students. And the ratio that black students represent in the total theological school population has only doubled within this fourteen year period, moving upward from 2.6% in 1970 and reaching 5.4% in 1985. This is far below the black percentage of the total population, estimated by the 1980 census to be 11.7% in the United States. This reflects the

fact that blacks continue to be an "underrepresented constituency" in Association schools. The total enrollment of blacks in 1985 rose 4.4% (129 students) substantially more than the 1.2% increase in 1984.

One must also keep in mind that 673, or 22.1%, of these black students are found in the five schools which have traditionally served an almost exclusively black clientele. This means that the remaining 2,373 black students are distributed across the 191 additional member seminaries. Actually this distribution is very uneven. There are 45 member institutions with no black students. The largest number of blacks in a denominational grouping of schools is the 391 black students enrolled in United Methodist schools. The American Baptist group has 324 blacks, but one of these seminaries is among the five traditionally black institutions. There are 256 blacks enrolled in the six Southern Baptist theological schools, and 177 in the ten Presbyterian, U.S.A. institutions. Table D-2 indicates that there are 1,011 black registrants in the twenty-one inter- and nondenominational member schools, but two of these are the two largest primarily black seminaries which together enroll 479 blacks, leaving the remaining 532 black students distributed across the other nineteen institutions in this group.

[TABLE 14]

Table 14 provides a sex distribution for the 3,046 black students in the several degree categories utilized above. It is readily apparent that the general increase in women's enrollment noted earlier has also characterized the growing role of black women. In fact, their rate of increase is much greater than that for black men, since the latter are a steadily diminishing proportion of the total number of blacks in seminaries. In 1972 black men were 91.3% of the black student population. By 1985 this had dropped to 73.6%. Or to state the statistic a bit differently, in that 13 year interval black men have increased in number by 131.5%; but black women's numbers have risen by 773.0%! This growth rate is even more startling in some of the separate degree programs. For example: black women ordination candidates rose from 34 (5.0% of blacks in these programs) in 1972 to 449 (21.2%) in 1985. Black women doctoral students numbered but one person in 1972 (1.8% of black doctoral students). In 1985 there were 25 black women registered in doctoral programs, and they were 33.0% of the total. This one degree program best illustrates the increasing role for black women. In 1972 there were 55 black males in such programs; in 1985 the number was 51. At the same time, the numbers of black women rose from 1 to 25! There have been additional increases in the other degree categories found in Table 14.

[TABLE 15]

Table 15 presents the accumulated data on black graduate degree recipients across the past decade. The fairly stable nature of the enrollment of black students in these degrees has already been noted, and the numbers of graduates across the years tend to confirm this observation. The customary fluctuations found in all graduate degree programs appear, since the normal time patterns applicable to other degrees (i.e., two years for the

M.R.E., etc.) are probably not applicable. And Table 15 reveals that such is the case. Black students receiving graduate masters degrees have ranged from a low of seven (1975-76) to a high of eighteen in 1982-83. And similarly black doctoral awards have ranged from four (in two different years) to ten on three occasions. It was seven last year. From these data one must draw the conclusion that there is no discernable increase in the numbers of black graduates joining the ranks of those qualified to teach in theological schools, completing the requirements for degrees at this level.

Readers interested in full details regarding black enrollment and graduation data should consult Tables C-2, D-2, E-2, F-2, G-2, and H-2 in this and earlier editions of this publication.

Hispanic/American Enrollment

The Association of Theological Schools has been collecting this information on student enrollment since 1972, and Table 16 presents a summary of women/men distributions within the same degree categories utilized in earlier tables. The observations regarding women's and black enrollment made above are, in a general way, also applicable here. In 1972 there were only 264 Hispanic/American registrants. By 1985 this had risen to 1,454, up 451%. In that span of years total enrollments rose only 70.6%. Thus the rate of growth was more than six times greater, obviously indicating that Hispanic increase cannot be explained simply as a part of the general enrollment increase. However, before one becomes overly impressed with this

phenomenon, keep in mind that these 1,454 persons are only 2.6% of seminarians, and this is far below the ratio of Hispanics in the population. We have far to go before Hispanics will cease to be "underrepresented" in theological schools. It is encouraging to see the sharp reversal this year (+10.6%) of last year's decline (-4.9%).

A careful examination of the table reveals other observations also. The number of special and unclassified students increased, and accounted for most of this year's growth. The percentage of Hispanic/American students in those categories (35%) is more than double the ratio for all students (13.1%). One aspect of this reported verbally by schools but not covered in the reports is that a fair percentage of these students will register later in degree programs, once they have discovered that they are really capable of advanced-level work.

Table 16 also contains other information of interest. There is little encouraging data in the post-M.Div. graduate enrollments. Not many Hispanic seminary degree recipients pursue the kind of graduate study which prepares one for theological seminary teaching. As Hispanic enrollments continue to mount, and more schools seek Hispanic faculty, this information does not indicate the emergence of a pool of persons trained in the normal ways (i.e., the academic doctorate) to respond to invitations to teach, an unfortunate circumstance. The percentage of ordination candidates for Hispanics (47%) is approaching the ratio for the total student population (51%). Hence, the excessive registration in the special/unclassified category apparently has not adversely affected the full preparation of Hispanic students for the ordained ministry, including the earning of the normal credentials.

As was noted for black students, neither are Hispanics distributed evenly across the Association's membership. One seminary in Puerto Rico, which primarily serves Hispanics, enrolls 166, or 11.4% of the total. And 40.0% of the schools, 79, register no Hispanic students at all. This leaves 1,288 students distributed across 116 institutions.

Full details regarding Hispanic student enrollments can be found in Tables C-4, D-4, E-4, F-4, G-4, and H-4, the latter three presenting the data for graduates during the 1983-84 academic year. All of these tables are parallel to those with the same designations in earlier Fact Books, thus facilitating comparisons across a range of years.

Pacific/Asian American Scholars

Pacific/Asian American students are defined as "persons from Asian and Pacific Island ancestry, whether born abroad, in North America, or the trust territories of the Pacific Ocean." These data have been received for the past eight years, beginning in 1977. The summaries for each year can

be found in all Fact Books as Tables C-5, D-5, and E-5, with graduation information in the parallel format found in Tables F-5, G-5, and H-5. Observations above regarding other groups are also appropriate here, especially with respect to increased registrations. And this is found in all of the degree categories. The role of women is a growing one, as found elsewhere. Their ratio to men is above that found for all students. It should be noted that Pacific/Asians as a group are more likely to be enrolled in graduate academic programs than any other group. There are currently 8.2% of total Pacific/Asian enrollments here, as contrasted with 7.6% in the total student population, 3.6% of Hispanics, 3.5% of blacks, and 6.9% of all women. The largest concentration of Pacific/Asian students is in the twenty inter-/nondenominational schools which together have 374 enrollees (31.3%). Next in size are the 121 persons (10.1% of the total) in the six Southern Baptist institutions. Presbyterian, U.S.A. schools of theology follow closely (120 or 10.0%), with Roman Catholics following (101 or almost double last year). Regional distributions are similarly unbalanced. Far West schools (California and Oregon) have 420 of the total, or 35.1%. Next is 186 in the Mid East region (15.6%), with Canada close behind (180 or 15%). Of interest is the number in the Southeast region (106), almost twice the number last year.

[TABLE 18]

Native American Enrollment

These are persons of Native American Indian or Inuit origin, and the data have been received for only the last 6 years. Since the numbers are so small, they have not as yet been subjected to data processing, and the information which appears in Table 18 cannot be found among the tables included in the appendices. The table reveals that growth here has been quite slow. The current enrollment of 94 persons represents only 0.17% of the total seminary student registrants. M.Div. enrollment is now 54 persons, 15 more than in 1984. The graduate numbers are quite small, and there is some improvement. These few persons are distributed across 48 different schools, with the highest registration being 11 Native Americans in one institution, with 3 others having from 8 to 10 registrants. There were 9 graduates this year, 5 of whom received the M.Div. With the growth in enrollment that number should soon increase.

Changes in Numbers of Graduates

Table 19 reports the numbers of persons receiving degrees which the Association has designated as "professional." First among these is, of course, the Master of Divinity, the degree accepted by most church bodies as the appropriate preparation for ordained ministry. Since 1973-74, there has been a modest, but nevertheless, steady increase in the numbers of M.Div. graduates year by year.

There has been a relative plateau in M.Div. graduates since 1978 when 6,362 graduated. This year it increased to 7,037. Comparing M.Div. enrollments with M.Div. graduates over the past 4 years, we find an increase of 5.3% enrollment growth over 4 years. Graduates grew only 3.8% over the same 4 years. Apart from the percentage of noncompletions, the schools themselves report that a steadily growing percentage of students, both part-time and full-time, are taking more than the basic 3 years to complete the M.Div.

We can observe a similar phenomenon in reports for the D.Min. program. There was no change in the number of graduates this year. Overall, the period 1981-85 reflects a stable number of D.Min. graduates. At the same time, there has been a slow growth in D.Min enrollments of 7.3% from 1981 to 1985. The slowing down of the dramatic growth in enrollment up to 1979 is reflected in the more stable numbers of graduates over the past 3 years and in the decline in enrollment during the past year. When we add the complicating factor of D.Min. "projects" which can be completed in a varying number of years in a given program depending on the motivation of the candidate and the constraints of full-time ministerial engagement, we can understand why a relatively stable pattern of graduates will still involve fluctuating data.

The results for the one- and two-year degree are in contrast with the above observations. With but one exception (1972-73) there has been a steady increase in numbers of graduates from these programs averaging 7.6% per year. This year, however, despite an increase of 4.1% in enrollment in these programs there was no increase in graduates.

[TABLE 20]

Table 20 provides parallel information for the graduation data among the several doctoral degrees. The doctorate in religious education is a rather small enterprise, limited to only a few schools. And the graduation data illustrate this restricted existence. The largest graduating group was 28 persons (1979-80), with 23 last year. The range has been from a low of 6 to a high of 28. Th.D./S.T.D. data can be misleading, since this is merely another name for the Ph.D. in some institutions. (The former days when the Ph.D. was awarded only by universities and the Th.D./S.T.D. only by free-standing seminaries no longer prevail. And some free-standing schools during the period reported in Table 20 have simply changed the name of the existing degree, making for further confusion in using these data.) Nonetheless, even with the limited Th.D./S.T.D. enrollments, reported above in Table 7, last year the Th.D. graduates were 38 persons. It seems obvious that this statistic is doomed to fluctuation. For the last 7 years graduates have numbered 87, 40, 79, 32, 48, 48 and 38. The enrollments in the years 1978 to 1984 ranged only from 437 to 523. This year's 1985 enrollment of 466 represents a decrease of 10.9%, a good part of which can be traced to one school which changed the designation of its Th.D. to Ph.D.

Graduates with the Ph.D. are also reported in Table 20. The same type of fluctuation prevails there also. Ph.D. recipients in the last 7 years have been, successively, 204, 189, 230, 363, 259, 236, and 294. The large number (363) in 1981-82 may be simply a one-year experience which does not readily lend itself to explanation, and it probably should not be utilized in any efforts to discern trends in Ph.D. production. Enrollments in the Ph.D. have risen substantially in the last 4 years (up 34.0% since 1981). The larger number of graduates is also evident in the current report.

As indicated at the outset of this chapter in Table 1, there has been a steady and substantial increase in the number of students enrolled across the years, accompanied by a much smaller increase in the number of member schools. Average enrollment has risen from 175.38 per school in 1969 to 287.60 in 1985. Table 21 reports those changes in terms of the 5 size distributions utilized by the Fact Book and reports the changing percentages of schools in each size group and the percentage of students enrolled in each group. As one might expect, the most startling data are in the smallest and largest size categories. In 1969 there were 25 schools (14.7%) with 50 or fewer students, and 2.5% of all students were enrolled in these 25 institutions. Despite a 15.3% increase in the number of schools, by 1985 there were only 11 institutions with 50 or less students (down to 5.6% of total institutions), enrolling only 0.7% of total students. Thus, although smaller schools continue to exist, their numbers continually decrease, and they serve a rapidly diminishing percentage of the total student population.

At the opposite end of the size scale precisely reversed results are evident. In 1969 only 11 institutions registered over 500 persons. This rose to 23 in 1985. And the ratio of total institutions which these 23 comprise rose from 6.5% to 11.7%. Similar dramatic changes are apparent

in the students served. Those 11 seminaries in 1969 were enrolling about one-fourth (26.2%) of all students. The 23 in 1985 registered over two-fifths (44.5%) of the students. And, as will be discussed later in this volume, they provide education for 44.5% of the students while spending only 33.3% of the total theological school expenditures.

The reader will find similar data for the three middle size categories by studying Table 21. This table was prepared from information contained in Tables C or C-1 for the Fact Books in each of the years cited.

NUMBER AND DISTRIBUTION OF PERSONNEL

[TABLE 22]

Tables 0 through V in this and earlier Fact Books provide the detailed information about theological schools' professional employees. Since the tables have maintained their precisely parallel nature across the years, it is possible to make very accurate comparisons from year to year. The customary distributions by size and status, denomination, and region are included.

Table 22 is a summary of this information regarding administrators, faculty, and librarians for selected years since fall 1970. The table reports the total number of persons in each category, the average number per school (to eliminate the effect of constantly changing numbers of member schools), and the percentage of change in the average number per school from the previous year. For purposes of comparison, the same data are provided for student enrollments, permitting ready analysis of total personnel trends (professional employees and students).

This year for the first time, the average number per school of personnel grew more rapidly than the average number of students per school. The growth was concentrated at the level of administrative personnel and it represents a growth of one-quarter person per school. Even here the growth was found almost entirely in the 19% increase of the omnibus category of "other" administrative personnel beyond the usual eight functional categories listed on page S-1 of the Annual Data Forms. This increase may well represent an upgrading of support staff to the administrative staff level to accommodate growing responsibilities.

In thirteen years since 1972, the average per school enrollment of students has risen by 113 students (64.5%). In the same period the average increase of administrators was 1.2 persons (26%) per school, certainly not excessive given the ever increasing responsibilities of administrators. The increase of full-time faculty was 0.84 persons (6.9%). There was no change in the staffing of libraries, despite the substantial growth in the size of the schools.

In evaluating the increase of full-time instructional staff one should keep in mind the rapid growth of part-time personnel during the same thirteen year period. Part-time faculty increased by 440 FTE persons (87.2%) as noted in Table 23. This means an increase from 2.5 FTE part-time faculty per school to 4.5 FTE part-time faculty per school in 1985. If we combine this figure of part-time faculty with full-time faculty, we find an overall growth in faculty of 3.25 persons per school (26.6%) in this thirteen year span.

As noted above, Table 23 extends this analysis by examining the role of part-time instructional personnel in seminary teaching. In the period between 1971 and 1985, full-time faculty have increased in total numbers of

persons employed from 2,297 to 2,558 (up 11.4%). In that same interval, the part-time persons offering instruction have risen from 1,498 to 3,202 (up 113.8%). And translated into full-time equivalency, these persons moved from 429 FTE to 880 FTE (up 105%). Furthermore, the proportion of total instruction offered by part-time instructors moved from 15.7% of the total to 25.6% this year. All of this means that today about one out of every four classes offered by a theological school is being taught by a person whose relationship to the instructional work of that institution is part time. When compared with the rest of higher education, this is not particularly surprising. However, given the historic reliance of seminaries on full-time staff for all or virtually all of their teaching, it is obviously a new phenomenon. When one considers the move toward extension, off-campus instruction which is characteristic of many seminaries, this trend toward additional part-time staff is probably inevitable. The implications of this trend for the style and quality of theological education merit further study. Table 23 provides the changing picture of this situation across the years.

Tables 0 through V also provide these data for administrative, faculty, and library personnel distributed across both sex and race categories. Tables 24, 25, and 26 summarize this information and report it from

the several successive Fact Books published annually. The sharp drop of male administrators reported in 1983 was probably attributable to a clarification that year in the instructions for completing the annual report forms, viz., that persons with divided administrative and teaching roles are to be listed as administrators only if more than one-half of their time is devoted thereto. Conversely, if they teach more than one-half time, the proper location for the listing is in faculty data. The steady increase in the number of women administrators (25.6%) is close to the percentage of women students (25.8%), and well ahead of the percentage of full-time women faculty (12.4%).

Table 25 provides parallel information regarding faculty, and these distributions have been received from member schools since 1971. In that year there were only 73 women teaching full time in theological seminaries. Fourteen years later, by 1985, this had risen to 316 women, and the ratio of women to men had grown from but 3.2% to 12.4%. Similar data are found at the bottom of the table for the adjunct or part-time teaching staff who are women. Here the ratio has always been somewhat higher than among the full-time instructors, moving from 6.9% in 1971 to 19.3% this current year, a not quite three-fold increase. The Table 25 data illustrate the fact that the rapid rate of increase among women employed full time does prevail also with the adjunct group.

Table 26 examines this information over a five-year span and with more precision since it shows changes for each professional position. There was a significant increase in the total of women in administrative roles (+12.4%) with the greatest growth in the categories of assistant administrator from 7 to 10 persons (43%), and with eleven women now serving as academic deans . The latter is one more than in 1984.

Women faculty also continue to increase in numbers as Table 26 indicates. There has been a steady growth in actual numbers for the past three

years with a 10.8% increase in 1985. The positions of full professor and assistant professor saw an above average increase in 1985 of 13% and 24.3% respectively. These two ranks were held by 200 women, up from 167 last year. While from one viewpoint these increases are commendable, it is quite obvious that women still are significantly underrepresented on seminary faculties.

There was a slight decline in library staffing this year. With this the percentage of women employed in libraries dropped a percentage point by comparison with male employment. Overall, women account for 54% of library staff, a percentage which has varied little over the past five years. The specific positions and the data in successive years for each are reported over a five-year span in Table 26.

Table 27 parallels the preceding one in format, but it provides information regarding the employment of blacks among administration, faculty, and library categories. An initial overall glance at the table will indicate there has been a decline with the percentage of blacks employed as administrative staff from 39 to 36 (-7.7%). There was no change in library staff, but the number serving a faculty increased significantly by 11 persons (5.0%).

There is one further qualification to these data which must be acknowledged. Thirteen of the black administrators serve in the 5 primarily black institutions, leaving but 23 for the other 191 schools. Sixty-three of the black faculty teach in these 5 schools, with the other 172 distributed across the 191 primarily white theological schools. The data clearly indicate that, despite the increase this year, there is still very little "black presence" in schools of theology.

COMPENSATION

Table NN-VV in the appendices provide full details regarding total compensation for professional staff employed in non-Roman Catholic institutions. Staff in Roman Catholic schools have been eliminated from these averages because of the "contributed services" aspect of compensation and the variety of ways this is treated in the Canadian and United States Catholic member schools. Please note that the amounts listed are total compensation, not just cash salary paid. Total compensation includes cash salary, housing allowance (if any) or rental value of housing provided, institutional payments for fringe benefits (insurance, etc.), and the institutional contribution to pensions. Compensation for administrative staff is for a twelve-month period, while faculty compensation is for nine months (the regular academic year). Extra compensation, such as summer school salaries, is not included in these quotations.

Readers interested in the full details should study the appendices of this and earlier Fact Books with care. It will be evident from such an analysis that there is considerable variety in patterns of compensation. Two total compensation amounts which are very similar may, in fact, have considerable variation in the components. Some institutions choose to pay larger cash salaries and provide little in fringe benefits or only very modest pension support. Other schools, providing much the same total compensation, may have a considerably lower cash salary but offer extensive benefits in insurance, family medical coverage, educational allowances for children, and substantial contributions to pension plans. Therefore, the reader must be very careful when comparing "salaries" to be certain that the entire package of cash and the value of other benefits has been included in the evaluation. Trends in the kinds of compensation packages have not been analyzed, but could be of some interest.

Inflation has been a major factor for the past several years in its impact on compensation patterns. Hence, one must take it into account when evaluating the progress of remuneration. While total compensation has been steadily rising, year after year, the rate of growth has often failed to match the increase in the cost of living index. During the high inflation years professional staff in schools of theology fell further behind each year in maintaining pace with the cost of living rise. After a number of years in which inflation hovered at the "double digit" level (+10.7%, +13.2%, +11.3% for seven, six, and five years ago, respectively), it has dropped sharply in the last four years (+6.5%, +2.4%, +4.1% and 3.6%). Hence, while compensation growth during the double-digit years always fell substantially below the index, the last four years there has been significant recovery from these losses. All of the tables included in the text have been designed to show the impact of inflation on the rising salaries. In contrast, the tables found in the appendices do not reflect adjustments for inflation, and they should be used with care.

Administrative Compensation

AUs Table 28 summarizes the data for each administrative position for the AUspast 5 years. This information is taken from Table NN in the appendices AUsof this and earlier editions. Tables 00 and PP provide this same information distributed by denomination and by region/highest degree offered categories. Among the accredited schools, all of the nine positions, with the Ausexception of business officers, received compensation increases in excess

of the cost of living growth. Overall accredited administrative staff increases were only +0.34% over the inflation index. Table 28 also includes data for administrative personnel in candidate and associate member institutions, designated collectively as "other." Here four of the positions received real losses, while all of the others exhibit increases in excess of the +3.6% inflationary factor. As a group these administrative personnel received somewhat higher increases in compensation than those experienced by the accredited schools (+8.6% and +3.9%, respectively). Thus both groups of schools reflect the continued efforts of theological schools to overcome earlier losses to inflation.

Faculty Compensation

The same detailed information regarding faculty total compensation is provided in Tables 29-34. Total compensation includes cash salary, housing allowance, value of fringe benefits, and school contribution to pension. 1982-83 was the first time since 1976-77 that faculty compensation had matched the rise in the cost of living. That achievement was repeated again in 1983, 1984, and 1985 for faculty in both accredited and other institutions, with the exception in 1984 of a loss of -2.4% for faculty in non-accredited schools. The importance of this general improvement should not be overestimated, since it follows five consecutive years of loss to the cost of living. Faculty salaries must still grow beyond the level of inflation to regain a position comparable to the base year (1969) when these data were first received and published. In 1985-86, faculty salaries for accredited schools still averaged \$1099 below (-2.7%) the level of comparability. Faculty salaries for non-accredited schools averaged \$869 below (-2.6%) the level of comparability. The tables in the text have been designed to illustrate the impact of inflation quite clearly. Tables 29 and 32 report the dollar amounts of compensation for seven successive years. Tables 30 and 33 translate these sums into percentages of dollar change. Tables 31 and 34 apply the effect of inflation to these percentages, providing the net real change in compensation after inflation. The first three tables (Tables 29-31) are for the accredited schools, the latter three tables (Tables 32-34) for candidate and associate institutions. Full details are in the appendices, including faculty compensation data distributed by denomination (Table RR), region, and highest degree offered (Table SS).

Library staff in other candidate and associate schools increased +35.2%. This sudden jump was occasioned by a substantially higher figure reported by several schools in this category.

Summary

The preceding tables provide compensation amounts and comparisons only across a few recent years. The Association of Theological Schools began to receive and publish these data in the 1969-70 academic year, a time when the excessive inflationary experiences of the 1970s had not yet begun. Hence a summary table reporting the situation with respect to compensation comparisons across those sixteen years may give the reader a better perspective on the economic condition of professional staff today, as contrasted with the base line year. Table 36 provides this information in summary fashion for administrative, faculty, and library staff in both accredited and other school categories. In that period the consumer price index has risen by 192.6%, a tremendous rate of growth. Professional employees in theological schools in every category suffered substantial losses during the years of high inflation. Now with salaries generally increasing over the past four years at a rate over the rate of inflation, most categories are closer to a level of comparability to the CPI index for 1969-70. The exception is the salaries of administrative personnel in accredited schools who are well below the sixteen year inflation rate. An exception in the other direction is the salary of library personnel in non-accredited schools who had by far the lowest salary in 1969-70 and whose salaries have commendably advanced beyond the inflation rate.

Table 37 supplements this information, by confining the data to the last five years. In this period the cumulative inflationary rate has been

+30.3%. The gains of the past four years exceed this growth. The poorest record during the five years was recorded for other school administrative staff.

Additional compensation growth in excess of inflation will be necessary to bring salaries back to their 1969-70 relationship with the consumer price index. Nonetheless, with the exception of administrative staff in accredited schools, salaries are moving closer to the level of comparability with 1969-70.

FINANCES -- REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES

Tables AA-JJ provide the overall financial information for the ATS schools of theology for the academic year 1982-83. The reader can find these in the appendices. There are two sets of tables supplied. Each table includes the appropriate dollar amounts, the ratio of educational and general revenue/expenditure which that represents (stated as a percentage), and the calculated per student sum. As noted, the tables with the suffix -1 provide the student data on a "head count" basis. Those with a -2 suffix utilize the "full-time equivalency" (FTE) enrollment. In some groupings, especially where there are large numbers of part-time students, the per student costs will differ quite markedly. This information is provided this year for the fifth successive year, and tables in this and the preceding four Fact Books are parallel and may be used directly to arrive at comparisons, subject to the exception noted below.

The 1983-84 Fact Book explained at length (pp. 52-55) the salutary effects of a change in the instructions for the Annual Report Forms which has served to limit the instances of "double-counting" of student aid income. The reader is referred to those pages for a full explanation. The old procedure inflated the total revenue and yielded paper surpluses which did not exist in reality. The good effects of the change in procedure have been verified in both the 1984-85 and 1985-86 data.

Table 38 summarizes the total financial data reported again this year under the newer instructions. Please observe the footnote to the table. The change in reporting methodology no longer permits any claim of precise comparability with previous years. With the newer methodology, 1983-84 and 1984-85 data are comparable to 1982-83 data, but these three years are no longer precisely comparable to previous years. The newer data, however, are more accurate than the data of earlier years. Table 38 reveals an increase of total revenue for 1984-85 of 7.8%, together with an even greater rise in expenditures of 7.9%. With the more rapid increase of expenditures over revenues, the surplus has also decreased to \$4.62 million. The exceptionally small 1982-83 revenue increase (2.1%) probably reflects the correction for student aid income which had often been double counted as revenue in previous years.

The reader should not be misled by this multimillion dollar surplus. While at first glance it appears to be substantial, in fact it is just \$23,612 per member school; only \$119 per full-time equivalent student; even less \$82 per head count student. Stated in this manner, these are not particularly impressive surpluses, especially when compared with the fact that it cost \$10,311 to provide education for each full-time student during 1984-85 in accredited member schools. The 1982-83 Fact Book noted that for

it cost \$10,311 to provide education for each full-time student during 1984-85 in accredited member schools. The 1982-83 Fact Book noted that for the first time the auxiliary enterprise category appeared to indicate a surplus. This would include the charges levied for food, housing, book-store, etc., as compared with the expenditures incurred in providing those services. During the past three years the deficits have been 3 million, 2.1 million and 2.5 million, or \$64 per FTE student in 1984-85. Management attention should be given to this situation lest the drain on revenue continue too long.

category has been eliminated totally. The \$647 per student in student aid within accredited schools during 1981-82 became zero in 1982-83 and 1983-84. This does not mean that contributions designated for student aid disappeared last year. They continue as in the past. However, they are now reported in terms of source: endowment proceeds, gifts, or grants. This makes student aid income parallel to all other income, designated and otherwise. The student aid expenditure line reveals the extent by which some member institutions were unable to comply with the new reporting. \$354 per student (in accredited schools) and \$118 per student (in the other schools) could not be subjected to the netting process used by most institutions.

The reader will also want to examine the revenue/expenditure totals for both the accredited and the non-accredited schools. The surplus/deficit per FTE student for accredited schools was: +\$181 for 1982-83; +\$141 for 1983-84; +\$123 for 1984-85. For non-accredited schools the surplus/deficit was: -\$71 for 1982-83; -\$58 for 1983-84; +\$30 for 1984-85.

Of significance for strategic planning are the percentages of the several line items of revenue/expenditures in relation to the Educational and General totals. For accredited schools in 1984-85, tuition was 23% of revenue; for other it was 33%. Endowment for accredited schools accounted for 25.5% of revenue; for other it was 7%. Gifts and grants for accredited schools were 42% of revenue; for others, 50%

Administrative costs for accredited schools were 30.3% of expenditures; for other 32.7%. Instructional costs were 46.6% of expenditures; for others 44%. Library costs for accredited schools were 9.2% of educational and general expenditures; for other schools 12.4%

One final observation and explanation from last year's Fact Book bears repeating. "The discerning reader will detect a substantial increase in educational and general revenue in the 1983-84 Fact Book when compared with earlier editions. One must not be misled by this increase, since it is more apparent than real. Previously the Association segregated student aid outside the educational and general category, both on the revenue and expenditure side. This has been eliminated, but only as an item of revenue. Hence revenue designated as student aid now appears within educational and general. It continues to be excluded from that category of expenditure, an arbitrary decision of the Association related to its procedures for assessing dues. Hence, if one wants to understand the full financial picture of a seminary, total revenues must be compared with total expenditures. One can no longer draw conclusions regarding fiscal health merely by examining educational and general revenue and expenditures."

Full details on all of these matters are available in the appendices, Tables AA-1 through JJ-2. As noted they must be read with care when compared with the same tables in previous Fact Books.

Table 39 provides some additional perspectives on this new reporting procedure. Here the total seminary enterprise data (as reported in the previous table) are presented on a revenue/expenditure per full-time student basis for the past three years. Note the percent of change rows at

the bottom of the revenue and expenditure categories. Two years ago the revenue gain for accredited schools was +4.5%; last year it was but +7.7% per full-time student. The expenditure data are +5.0% and +8.0% respectively. When one compares the revenue enhancement of but 7.7% while expenditures rose 8.0%, the decrease in the surplus noted above is again apparent. Note also the student aid rows for both. Student aid as a revenue

Gifts and Grants Income

This is the third year in which Gift and Grant Income has been collected on the new D-1 Forms. This is only the second year in which the tables WW-1 through WW-7 have been published to provide detailed information on sources of gift income. A comparison with last year's tables reveals immediately a significant increase in the number of schools reporting with a response to some or all of the categories--183 schools in 1985 by comparison with 169 in 1984. The increase is even more evident in the number of schools distributing gifts and grants according to the several categories in the respective tables. Schools have also made obvious corrections from last year in the allocating of gifts and grants to the proper categories. The increased number of schools reporting (+8.3%) and the number of corrections make an estimation of overall trends difficult. These trends will, however, be more accurate in the data for specific denominations.

If we compare the average reported for endowment in Table WW-1 for 1985 with 1984, we find a remarkable growth of 25%. More schools are reporting this year, but there are doubtless other factors. The average reported for the Annual Fund is down this year (-2%); for gifts/grants from National Denominations it is up +2%; for Regional Denominations -12%; and for Local Denominational sources -3%. We hope that this year's statistics will offer a more reliable base for trends as data is allocated to the proper categories. Presidents and development officers will find the information helpful for planning.
