## THE ASSOCIATION OF THEOLOGICAL SCHOOLS IN THE UNITED STATES AND CANADA

The Association of Theological Schools in the United States and Canada (ATS) is the accrediting and program agency for graduate theological education in North America. The mission of the Association is to promote the improvement and enhancement of theological schools to the benefit of communities of faith and the broader public. The Association seeks to fulfill this mission by engaging in four core functions of work: (1) accreditation, (2) leadership education for administrative officers and faculty, (3) development of theological education, which involves the study of critical issues in theological education, and (4) data and communications.

The Association is recognized by the United States Department of Education and by the non-governmental Council for Higher Education Accreditation for the accreditation of graduate, professional theological schools in the United States.

The Association began in 1918 as a conference of theological schools that met biennially. In 1936, it became an association, adopted standards for judging quality, and in 1938 established a list of accredited schools.

During the 2001-2002 academic year, the ATS membership consisted of 243 Protestant, Roman Catholic, and Orthodox theological schools, which included independent, university-affiliated, and collegeaffiliated graduate schools. Together, these schools reflect the broad spectrum of denominational, ecclesiastical, and theological perspectives evident in North America.

The Fact Book on Theological Education has been published annually since 1969. The data on which the Fact Book is based are provided on Annual Report Forms by the member schools of the Association. The majority of Annual Report Forms are submitted to ATS in electronic form and are entered into the institutional database at the ATS office in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

This edition of the Fact Book generally reflects recent prior editions and carries forward the substantive changes made in the 1996-97 Fact Book with respect to the new accrediting standards adopted by the Association in June 1996 that recategorized the degrees offered by member schools. It also maintains the revisions that resulted from the changes in the Annual Report Forms to accommodate revised accounting rules for schools in the United States, as mandated by the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB).

The Fact Book is one of three resources provided by the Association to assist leaders of theological schools in strategic planning, policy development, and institutional evaluation. The Institutional Peer Profile Report provides member schools with comparative data from five to fifteen other institutions selected and identified as "peers" by the institution requesting the report. The Strategic Information Report, introduced in 1998, was developed with the Auburn Center for the Study of Theological Education and provides indicators of a school's financial and enrollment strength, stability, and position in relation to other ATS institutions.

# Chapter 1 Institutional Characteristics

## HIGHLIGHTS

In 2001 the typical, i.e., median, reporting ATS institution had a head count enrollment of 197 students with eleven full-time faculty members. Part-time and adjunct teaching faculty contributed the equivalent of another 4 full-time teaching positions.

The typical institution could draw on a library with more than 116,000 volumes, possessed long-term investments and endowment of \$4.6 million, and had total expenditures of \$3.4 million. The median tuition for the Master of Divinity degree program was \$7,700 in the 2001-2002 academic year.

ATS maintains three classes of membership: accredited, candidate for accredited membership, and associate. The figures in this table reflect the membership totals at the end of each calendar year. Descriptions of each category and the criteria for membership are published in the ATS *Bulletin*, Part 1: Constitution and Dues Structure (Article IV) and Procedures, Standards, and Criteria for Membership (Articles I - III).

The following schools were admitted into their respective categories in the past year. *Accredited*: Canadian Southern Baptist Seminary. *Candidate for Accreditation*: Barry University Department of Theology and Philosophy, Campbell University Divinity School, Inter-American Adventist Theological Seminary, Knox Theological Seminary, James and Carolyn McAfee School of Theology of Mercer University, and Prairie Graduate School. *Associate*: There being no Biennial Meeting in 2001, no school was admitted to associate membership.

Table 1.2, *Significant Institutional Characteristics of Each Member School*, 2001-2002, contains the most recent data on selected institutional characteristics of each member school. DNR indicates that the school did not report the data. NA indicates that the field does not apply to the respective institution. Dashes indicate that the institution does not want the information published although totals, averages, and median figures include it.

**Status**—The three classes of membership are accredited (Accred.), candidate for accredited membership (Cand.), and associate (Assoc.). Criteria for membership are published in *Bulletin*, Part 1, Procedures, Standards, and Criteria for Membership, and are on this website in the "Accreditation" section. Status is reported as of the end of academic year 2001-2002.

I/U/C— Independent, University-Affiliated, and College-Affiliated. These terms are elaborated in Table 1.3.

**Race**—Each school identifies the predominant racial/ethnic identity of its enrolled students. For definitions of terms, *see the Appendix.* 

**Prov(ince)/St(ate)**—The primary location of each school is identified using postal abbreviations.

**Church/Denom(ination)**—Each school identifies its religious affiliation when it applies for membership. *An explanation of the codes is found in the Appendix*. Even though some schools are formally related to more than one denomination, only one denomination is listed in this table.

**Expenditures**—These data are expenditures for fiscal year 2000-2001. Canadian school data are reported in Canadian dollars; United States school data are reported in United States dollars.

**E&G**— (*Total Educational and General Expenditures*) The figures reported include instruction, research, public service, library, academic support, student services, admissions, institutional support, operation and maintenance of plant, and scholarships and fellowships. Editions of the *Fact Book* up to and including 1995-96 also included mandatory transfers and debt repayment under E&G, whereas subsequent editions do not.

**Total**—(*Total Expenditures*) Total expenditures combine E&G and expenditures for auxiliary or ancillary enterprises, which include in most ATS schools such operations as student housing, meal service, and book store.

**Long-Term Investment**—Investments held for long-term purposes in accordance with FASB (*Financial Accounting Standards Board*) No. 124. This phrase replaces "Endowment" in earlier editions of the *Fact Book*. Canadian school data are reported in Canadian dollars; United States school data are reported in United States dollars.

Faculty—The data on faculty are for fall 2001.

**F.T.**— Full-time faculty are individuals with faculty status who devote 50% or more of their time to teaching and/or research.

**F.T.E.**—The full-time equivalency for faculty is the sum of the number of full-time faculty and the equivalent of full-time teaching provided by part-time faculty. The latter figure is computed by dividing the total number of courses taught by all part-time faculty by the average teaching load of full-time faculty.

**Library Vol(ume)s**—The total number of printed books, serials, and periodicals reported in fall 2001. Library data reports reflect a variety of library arrangements among member schools, and these are footnoted in the table.

**Enrollment**—The data report enrollment as of fall 2001.

H.C.— Head count enrollment is the total number of students enrolled.

F.T.E.—Computation of full-time equivalent enrollment varies by degree program and is described in the Appendix.

Tuition—Full-time tuition charges for the 2001-2002 academic year.

Fees—Other fees related to enrollment for the 2001-2002 academic year.

The distribution of schools by size has remained relatively stable over ten years, with minor fluctuations. In 1991, 39.6% of schools had a head count enrollment of 150 or fewer students and by 2000, that percentage was up to 40.8%. In 2001, 36.2% of schools reporting had a head count enrollment of 150 students or fewer.





# Chapter 2 Enrollment

## HIGHLIGHTS

The total enrollment in all member schools in fall 2001 was 73,925, with a full-time equivalent enrollment of 48,435.

Total head count enrollment in all schools increased by 8,564 students(+13.10%) from fall 1997 to fall 2001. Of this number, 4,964 students (57.96%) represented enrollment growth in a constant set of 224 schools, and 3,600 students (42.04%) represented enrollment growth attributable to the June 2000 admittance of 7 new member schools to the Association.

The number of racial/ethnic students increased 23.91% over the five-year period from 1997 to 2001. While the number of White students increased 6.82% over the same period, the number of students in all other racial/ethnic categories increased more during the period, as follows: Asian students (+10.47%), Black students (+28.61%), Hispanic students (+43.92%), and Native American students (+4.35%).

The table reports the application, acceptance, and enrollment figures as of the fall of each year. Between 2000 and 2001, applications to all approved degree programs at member schools decreased 1.25% (29,727 total applications in 2000 and 29,355 total applications in 2001).

In the degree programs of Ministerial Leadership, General Theological Studies, and Advanced Ministerial Leadership, schools accepted more than three-quarters of all applicants, and fewer than half of the applicants to the Advanced Theological Research programs (Th.D., Ph.D., S.T.M., and Th.M.). The figures represent combined acceptance rates at all ATS schools, and acceptance rates among and within individual schools vary significantly.

Tables 2.2 through 2.7 report the fall head count and full-time equivalent enrollments at all member schools over a five-year period. The tables also indicate the percentage of increase or decrease in the program area's enrollment from the previous year. The normally larger increases in enrollment during the even-numbered years are partially the result of new members joining the Association in the year of the Biennial Meeting. The full-time equivalent enrollment for the Doctor of Ministry program is calculated by dividing the headcount enrollment by three. For the other Advanced Ministerial and Advanced Research doctoral degree programs, the full-time equivalent equals the head count.

Between 2000 and 2001, head count enrollment figures increased by 1.69% (+1,228), as did the full-time equivalent enrollment in all member schools, by1.17% (+562). Since 1997, the number of schools reporting increased by 11; the total head count enrollment increased 13.10% (+8,654); and the full-time equivalent enrollment increased 12.00% (+5,188). The general increases in enrollment noted here, however, include both increases and decreases in the number of schools reporting by denomination and in the head count enrollment in various degree programs. The number of Protestant Denominational and Inter/Nondenominational schools increased from 173 in 1997 to 181 in 2001, and the number of Roman Catholic schools reporting increased (50 schools in 1997, 53 schools in 2001) (see tables 2.4-2.7).





## GRAPH 2-A HEAD COUNT ENROLLMENT BY DEGREE CATEGORY




Graph 2-A represents the head count enrollment by degree category over the past five years. The total growth over the five years in head count enrollment (+8,564) is not attributable to any one degree program. From the fall of 1997 to the fall of 2001, the total head count enrollment grew 13.10%, as various degree programs increased or decreased by percentage. The greatest percentage increase in students was in the M.Div. programs, with an increase of 2,845 students.

Graph 2-B illustrates the full-time equivalent enrollment by degree category over five years. Full-time equivalent enrollment increased by 12.00% since 1997. These five degree programs show growth over the course of the five-year period: M.A. in Specialized Ministries (+26.24%), M.A./M.A.R./M.T.S./M.A.T.S. (14.20%), M.Div. (+9.13%), Th.D./Ph.D. (+9.22%), Th.M/M.Th./S.T.M. (+7.24%) and D.Min. (+4.45%). Decreases in full-time equivalent enrollment were M.C.M./M.S.M. (-32.48%), M.P.S./M.A.P.S. (+18.01%), D.Miss. (-10.14%), and M.R.E./M.C.E./M.A. in R.E./C.E. (-8.99%). The D.Ed.Min. degree was introduced in 1999-2000 and the students are counted in the same category as the Ed.D. degree.


#### GRAPH 2-C HEAD COUNT ENROLLMENT IN ALL PROGRAMS BY RACE OR ETHNIC GROUP



Graph 2-C shows the head count enrollment in all programs by race or ethnic group. ATS uses the racial/ethnic categories as defined by the Integrated Post-Secondary Data System (IPEDS), published by the United States Department of Education.


The number of racial/ethnic students increased by 23.91% over the five-year period from 1997-2001. The numbers increased in all categories. The number of Hispanic students increased (+43.92%), as did Black students (+28.61%), Asian students (10.47%), Native American students (+4.35%), White students (+6.82%), and Non-Resident Alien students (+9.18%).

Graph 2-D represents the head count enrollment in M.Div. degree programs by race or ethnic group. The overall number of racial/ethnic students enrolled in M.Div. programs increased 17.84% over the period 1997-2001. Black women M.Div. students increased (+48.26%), as did Hispanic women M.Div. students (+22.22%).


# GRAPH 2-E HEAD COUNT ENROLLMENT IN M.DIV. PROGRAMS BY GENDER

Overall, women now constitute 35.17% of the total enrollment, up from 33.1% in 1997.



## GRAPH 2-F HEAD COUNT ENROLLMENT IN M.DIV. PROGRAMS BY GENDER




Graph 2-F represents men and women student enrollment in M.Div. programs from 1997 to 2001. It illustrates that much of the growth in the M.Div. category has come from an increase in the number of women students, from 8,203 in 1997 to 9,722 in 2001. The number of men M.Div. students also increased moderately, from 20,080 in 1997 to 21,041 in 2001; however, the percentage of men M.Div. students declined from 71.00% to 68.78%. Overall, women M.Div. students constituted 31.23% of all M.Div. students, up from 29.00% in 1997.






**GRAPH 2-H**

# Chapter 3 Composition of Faculty and Compensation of Personnel

# HIGHLIGHTS

Racial/ethnic faculty now constitute 12.86% of all faculty members at ATS institutions. This percentage has grown 2.73% in the past five years, up from 10.14% in 1997.

The number of women teaching at ATS institutions increased by 20.24% since 1997, from 593 to 713. For the five-year period from 1997 to 2001, the number of women faculty has shown steady increases. Women now constitute 21.53% of all faculty members.

Since 1997, the average total faculty compensation in United States schools has increased by 20.86% for men and by 24.63% for women. For the same period, the average total compensation for faculty in Canadian schools increased 19.53% for men and increased 20.16% for women.

The average salary of professors in ATS United States member institutions rose 3.68% for the 2001-2002 academic year, associate professors 4.54%, and assistant professors 5.06%. Comparatively, at lower ranks, the average salary and housing of United States ATS faculty compares better with the nine-month average salaries of full-time faculty members at comprehensive institutions. [ATS annual report forms do not require schools to indicate whether their figures are for nine- or twelve-month salaries.] As rank increases, the disparity between comprehensive institutions and ATS salaries becomes more pronounced. The average salary of a professor at a public comprehensive institution is 15.15% higher, and that of an associate professor is 12.92% higher. At the rank of assistant professor, the average salary at a public comprehensive institution is 9.17% higher than that of an assistant professor in a United States ATS member school.

Table 3.6 provides data on the averages of total compensation earned by administrators and full-time faculty in United States accredited schools during each academic year. Total compensation includes contract salary, contributed services, housing allowance (if any) or the rental value of housing provided, pension payments (including institutional contribution to social security/social insurance), and medical and other insurance. In the United States the Consumer Price Index (CPI) grew at a rate of 1.74% in 1999, 2.87% in 2000, and 3.43% in 2001, calculated from the figures provided by the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics. Over the three fiscal years, average compensation for faculty members at all ranks grew by 8.86%. Total compensation for faculty at the rank of professor grew 8.04% over the three years, associate professor compensation increased 8.58%, and assistant professor compensation grew at a rate of 10.42%. Administrative salaries increased at various rates. During the past three years, the Chief Executive Officers' average compensation grew by 11.08%, while Academic Vice Presidents' compensation increased by 8.71%. In the same period, Chief Development Officers' compensation grew by 9.51%, and Chief Financial Officers' compensation increased by 8.43%.

Table 3.7 provides data on the averages of total compensation earned by administrators and full-time faculty in Canadian accredited schools during each academic year. Total compensation includes contract salary, contributed services, housing allowance (if any) or the rental value of housing provided, pension payments (including institutional contribution to social security/social insurance), and medical and other insurance. Figures are reported in Canadian dollars. In Canada the Consumer Price Index increased by 2.46% in 1999, by 2.71% in 2000, and by 2.56% in 2001. Over the three fiscal years, average compensation increased at the rank of professor by 5.47%. Associate professor compensation increased by 15.88%. Assistant professor compensation during the three years increased by 11.37%. The table omits compensation figures when a category reflects only one individual's data.








ATS Fact Book 2001-2002: Composition of Faculty and Compensation of Personnel

The number of women faculty increased from 1997 to 2001. In the five-year period, the total number of women at all ranks increased from 593 in 1997 to 713 in 2001, and the percentage of women steadily increased from 19.84% to 21.53% in the same period.

## Chapter 4 Finances

### HIGHLIGHTS

In schools grouped by student body size, the percentage change in tuition and fees for the M.Div. program varied from fall 2000 to fall 2001 from an increase of 10.89% in U.S. schools with fewer than 75 students to a decrease of 3.12% in U.S. schools with more than 1,000 students. In Canadian schools, there was an increase in M.Div. tuition and fees ranging from 0.24% increase at schools with fewer than 75 students, to a 27.33% increase at schools with a full-time equivalent enrollment between 301 and 500.

Average tuition and fees for the M.Div. increased by 11.30% and 12.15% for U.S. and Canadian university-affiliated schools, respectively. At college-affiliated schools, average M.Div. tuition and fees increased 7.16% for U.S. schools and 5.91% for Canadian schools. Only Canadian independent schools reported a decrease (-1.79%). U.S. independent schools reported a 6.48% increase.

The average expenditure, including auxiliary enterprises, by ATS institutions per full-time equivalent student increased by 6.58% from 1999-2000 to 2000-2001.

Gifts and grants from individuals in 2000-2001 as a percentage of total revenue in all member schools was 35.87%, whereas gifts and grants from religious organizations constituted 11.85% of all revenue. Tuition and fees, by contrast, accounted for 30.52% of total revenue in all member schools.

Tables 4.2A & 4.2B represent the changes in tuition and fees from 2000-2001 at university-affiliated, independent, and college-affiliated member schools. The Basic Ministerial/M.Div. tuition and fees at independent and college-affiliated institutions increased by 6.48% and 7.16%, respectively, for U. S. Schools, whereas, at Canadian independent institutions they decreased 1.79% and rose 5.91% at college-affiliated schools. Average tuition and fees for college-affiliated Advanced Theological Research programs (Ph.D./Th.D.) at university-affiliated, college-affiliated, and independent institutions increased for both U. S. and Canadian schools.

The data in Table 4.3 reflect the average revenue and expenditure that member schools reported on a per-student (full-time equivalent) basis in specific categories. Please note that due to different FASB accounting standards beginning 1995-96, the revenue figures reported in this *Fact Book* as well as in the three previous editions of the *Fact Book on Theological Education* differ greatly from past years' figures and are not comparable. Previously "Net Realized Gains" and "Net Unrealized Appreciation" were not reported as revenue. Some existing categories, furthermore, such as "Gifts and Grants from Individuals," now include all individual gifts to the institution, not only those designated solely for endowment purposes, which may be either temporarily or permanently restricted as to their use. Additionally, note that the Association has revised the calculation for full-time equivalence in the D.Min. program to one-third of head count enrollment. Although the D.Min. program is by definition a part-time program, the full-time equivalent enrollment of D.Min. programs was calculated in previous years on a one-to-one basis with head count enrollment. This revision should make representations of per-student expenditures more accurate, inasmuch as the prior calculation tended to over-represent D.Min. students. In view of these changes, comparisons with previous years must be done with great caution. Not every school reported data in each category. All figures are reported in U.S. dollars. Canadian dollars for 2000-2001 were converted at a rate of \$0.66 U.S.

Table 4.4 presents the revenue sources at member schools as a percentage of total revenues for fiscal years 1996-97 to 2000-01. Beginning in 1996 there were changes in the way schools are required to prepare their financial statements. In the United States, these changes affect the way schools reflect contributions and report their investments at market value rather than cost. These changes created the necessity of two new categories denoted as Net Realized Gains and Net Unrealized Appreciation.

Table 4.5 presents revenue sources as a percent of total revenue by church/denominational classification. An important aspect of this presentation is the relative impact tuition and fees, as well as gifts and grants, have on total revenue. Initially, there appears to be a significant disparity within these categories between denominational classifications.

The distribution of expenditures has changed little over the five-year period. Due to fluctuation in most of the categories, no consistent patterns or trends are evident from the figures. Please note that some prior editions of the *Fact Book* reported expenditure costs for "Instruction" and "Academic Support" as one figure. This table distinguishes them. Comparisons of these figures with the corresponding figures in editions of the *Fact Book* distributed before 1995-96 will be inaccurate.

Further note that this table and other finance tables in this *Fact Book* --as well as the editions of the *Fact Book* beginning with the 1995-96 edition--do not include Mandatory transfers. Mandatory transfers from current funds are those that must be made in order to fulfill a binding legal obligation of the institution. Mandatory transfers are always a transfer out from current funds and are therefore always positive. In this category, schools used to report mandatory debt-service provisions relating to academic and administrative buildings, including (1) amounts set aside for debt retirement and interest and (2) required provisions for renewal and replacement to the extent not financed from other sources. U.S. schools would include also the institutional matching portion for National Direct Student Loans (NDSL) when the source of funds was current revenue. Because mandatory transfers are not reported, comparisons with earlier editions of the *Fact Book* must be done with great caution.

Table 4.10 presents total revenues and expenditures at all member schools. The data above show that a dramatic shift occurred between 1994-95 and 1995-96. In the early 1990s, total expenditures for all member schools exceeded revenues, creating deficit spending as indicated. Expenditures continued to increase at the average rate of 6.46% each of the remaining years. Revenues, however, increased significantly, more than doubling between 1994-95 and 1997-98. Such a dramatic shift is most likely the result of changes in the way schools are required to prepare their financial statements rather than changes in the underlying reality. While the data show dramatic revenue surpluses over the past four years-due to the accounting method changes noted above--it is not apparent that such a continued rate of expenditure has actually avoided deficit spending through the 1999-2000 fiscal year. Note the reductions in income since 1997-98.

## Chapter 5 Development

### HIGHLIGHTS

Total giving reported by ATS member institutions continued the upward trend of the past half decade, reaching almost \$553 million and surpassing the 1998 record high of \$512 million, but almost \$34 million less than last year.

Other possible trends that bear watching include the following: Giving by individuals, predominantly it turns out by non-alumni/ae, has continued to surpass contributions by religious organizations to capital projects, and is only \$11+ million under operational gifts. Contributions from religious organizations, nevertheless, constitute about one-third of contributions reported by ATS institutions for current operations.

These numbers, of course, are aggregate figures. There continue to be enormous differences between the median and the average among ATS institutions in all categories, suggesting that there remain wide variations throughout the Association.

Gifts for both Operational and Capital purposes are down an average of 10-11% in all source categories. Gifts from religious organizations continued to be one of the largest sources for ATS member schools, accounting for 33.6% of the total operational gifts. Gifts from individuals continue to be the other substantial revenue source for schools. In 2000-2001, such gifts represented 37.1% and 64.8% of operational and capital gifts, respectively.

#### APPENDIX

Information on enrollment is reported according to Head Count (the total number of students enrolled) and full-time equivalency (FTE). The latter is calculated by ATS in the following two ways:

For all master-level programs FTE is computed in the following manner: Divide the total number of credits required for the degree by the number of semesters or quarters prescribed for degree duration to determine the average academic load. The total of credit hours taken by all students in a given degree program in a semester or quarter is divided by the average academic load. For Example: An M.Div. degree requires 90 semester hours, and the school considers the degree to be typically six semesters. The average academic load would be 90 divided by 6, or 15 hours per semester. If all M.Div. students complete a total of 600 hours for the semester, and the average academic load is 15, then the FTE would be 600 divided by 15, or 40 students.

For all doctoral programs FTE is computed in the following manner: The FTE equals the Head Count (HC), with the exception of the D.Min. program. The FTE for D.Min. programs is calculated at one-third of Head Count.

#### APPENDIX

#### COMPARING DATA OVER TIME

The methods by which the data have been computed have changed in some cases from those in previous editions of the Fact Book. The number of member institutions has changed in every even-numbered year since 1988 as additional schools have become new members of the Association. The degree programs were recategorized with the adoption of redeveloped accrediting standards in 1996. Also, changes in Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) reporting requirements in 1996 resulted in financial data for United States institutions that often differ substantially from previously reported figures. All these changes make over-time comparisons with earlier editions potentially less meaningful. A number of tables in this Fact Book report data over a three- to five-year period, and these tables have accounted for these variables. Comparisons over time within these tables are altogether appropriate.

#### APPENDIX

#### **RACIAL/ETHNIC CATEGORIES**

ATS uses the racial/ethnic categories as defined by the Integrated Post-Secondary Data System (IPEDS), published by the United States Department of Education. The definitions are as follows:

*Non-Resident/Visa:* A person who is not a citizen or national of the United States or Canada and who is in the country on a visa or temporary basis and does not have the right to remain indefinitely.

*Black, non-Hispanic:* A person having origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa (except those of Hispanic origin).

*American Indian or Alaskan Native:* A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North America who maintains cultural identification through tribal affiliation or community recognition.

*Asian or Pacific Islander:* A person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, the Indian Subcontinent, or Pacific Islands. This includes people from China, Japan, Korea, the Philippine Islands, American Samoa, India, and Vietnam.

*Hispanic:* A person of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central or South American, or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race.

*White, non-Hispanic:* A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, North Africa, or the Middle East (except those of Hispanic origin).

*Race/Ethnicity Unknown or Unavailable:* A person whose race or ethnic identity is either unknown or information about that person is unavailable.
