














#### CHART 3: Participants by Racial/Ethnic Identity










#### **CHART 4: Age Range and Gender**













#### CHART 6: Number of Dependents by Gender and Marital Status







## CHART 7B: Educational Debt Incurred at Seminary for All Students

















### **CHART 17: Three Most Important Influences on Educational Experience**








# CHART 18: Importance of Field Education/Internship if Required





## CHART 19: Effectiveness of Field Education in Developing Capacities







(1-Very dissatisfied 2-Somewhat dissatisifed 3-Neutral 4-Satisified 5-Very satisified)








