support a holistic approach to the Association's leadership development programming through the cultivation and facilitation of robust communities of practice within the ATS membership.

"Chelsea brings a wealth of experience and a contagious enthusiasm with her to this work, along with a deep commitment to fostering real community and helping leaders thrive," said Shadd.
