
Council on Theological Scholarship and Research announces grant

- Collaboration between theological scholars of different cultures or ethnicities or backgrounds or ecclesial traditions or experience, and/or between theological scholars and specialists in other sectors of society
- Use of innovative methods—including interdisciplinary engagement—between scholars in theological disciplines, or between theological scholars and those in other disciplines
- Expanding possible modes of dissemination that may include academic and trade publications, public lectures, and presentations to concerned publics through the media, social media, blogs, podcasts, video, or artistic venues

Fifty-four proposals were submitted and reviewed by the program's Council on Theological Scholarship and Research, re-constituted and patterned after a group of scholars that served the Association in a similar role during the 1980s and 1990s. The Council—leading scholars from a variety of ATS schools—is advising the project as it explores possible models of research and scholarship for future program funding proposals.

Projects will be completed during the 2022–23 academic year, with final project reports due in August 2023. The Council will gather with the five project teams in spring 2023, to hear their progress and to discuss next steps.
