



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
## CHART 2: Enrollment by Racial/Ethnic Identity







**CHART 4: Age Range and Racial Identity**











## CHART 7: Highest Degree Beyond Bachelor's





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# CHART 8A: Educational Debt for Full-time Respondents




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
## CHART 8B: Non-educational Debt for Full-time Respondents





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
# CHART 9A: Educational Debt for All Respondents





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
# CHART 9B: Non-educational Debt for All Respondents






**CHART 11: Significance of Financial Aid Assistance in Choice of School**























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

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

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


**CHART 23A: Expectation for Full-time Position after Graduation**
