CHART 1: Enrollment of Students by Gender and Degree Program





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
CHART 2: Enrollment by Racial/Ethnic Identity



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CHART 3: Enrollment of Students by Age and Gender



CHART 4: Age Range and Racial Identity



CHART 5: Number of Dependents by Gender and Marital Status



CHART 6: Area of Undergraduate Degree and Type of Institution







CHART 7: Highest Degree Beyond Bachelor's





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
CHART 8A: Educational Debt for Full-time Respondents





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
CHART 8B: Non-educational Debt for Full-time Respondents





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
CHART 9A: Educational Debt for All Respondents





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
CHART 9B: Non-educational Debt for All Respondents






CHART 11: Significance of Financial Aid Assistance in Choice of School





CHART 12: Enrollment Status by Length of Commute and Planned Hours of Work per Week





Membership Size of Church




CHART 15: Time First Considered Theological School and Plan for Ordination




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CHART 16: How Student First Learned about School by Gender (All Students)








Importance of Housing to Decision




(1 - No importance 2 - Little importance 3 - Somewhat important 4 - Important 5 - Very important)



(1 - No importance 2 - Little importance 3 - Somewhat important 4 - Important 5 - Very important)



CHART 22: Interest in Parish/Congregational Ministry by Age




CHART 23A: Expectation for Full-time Position after Graduation
