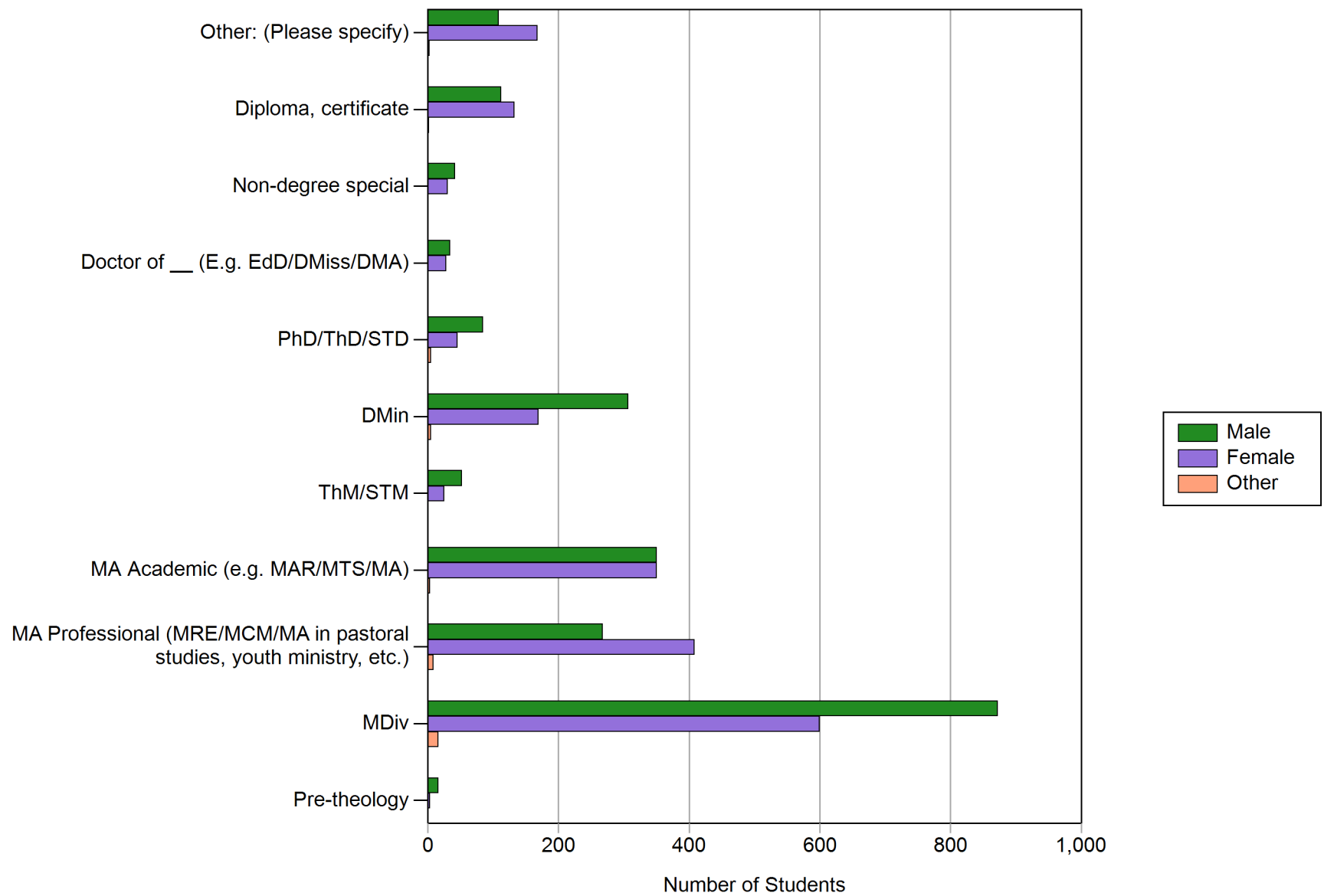

## CHART 2: Participants by Racial/Ethnic Identity

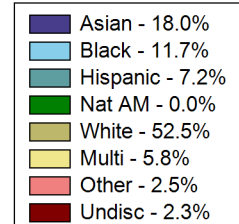
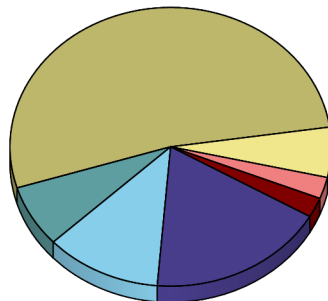

**CHART 3: Participants by Age and Gender**



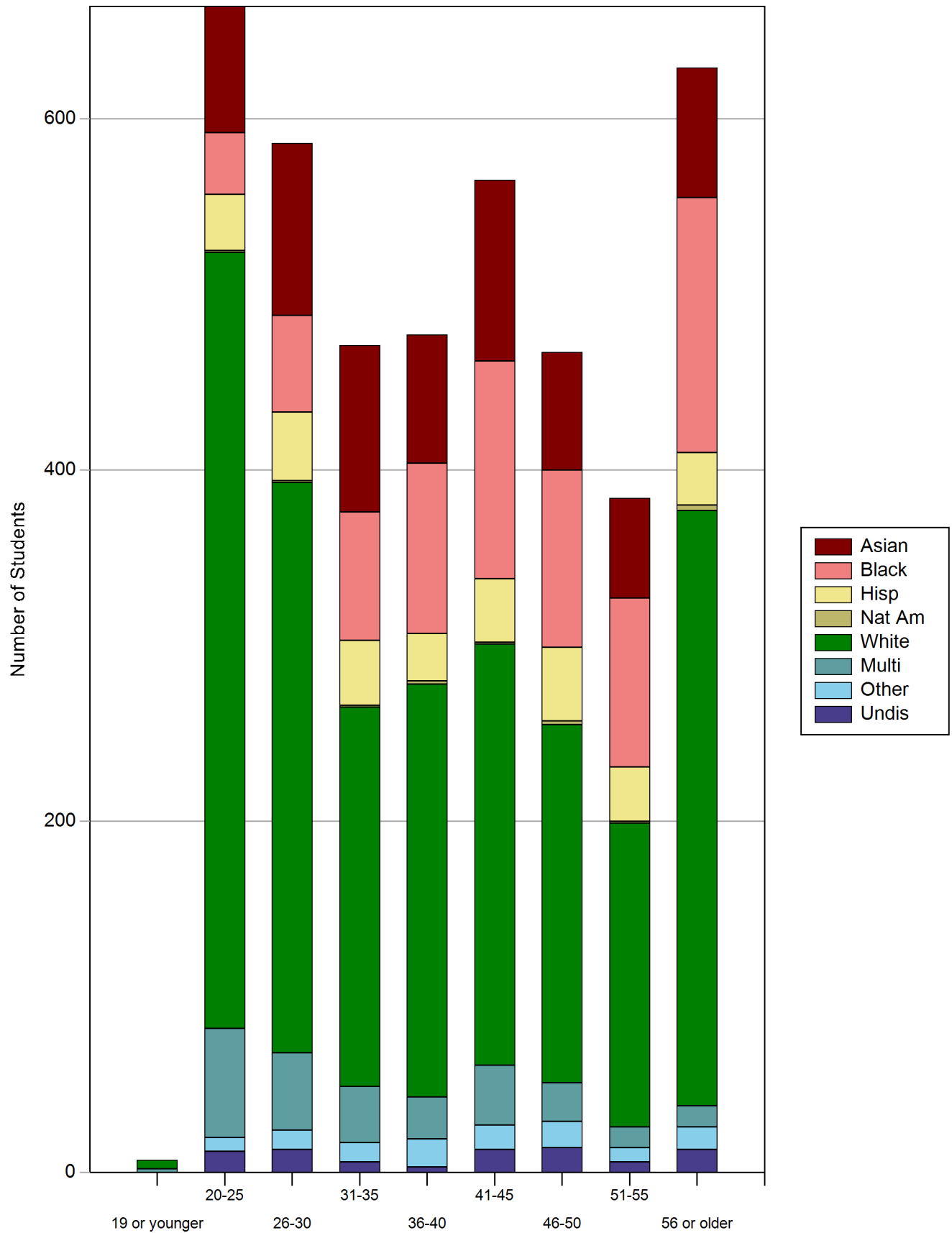

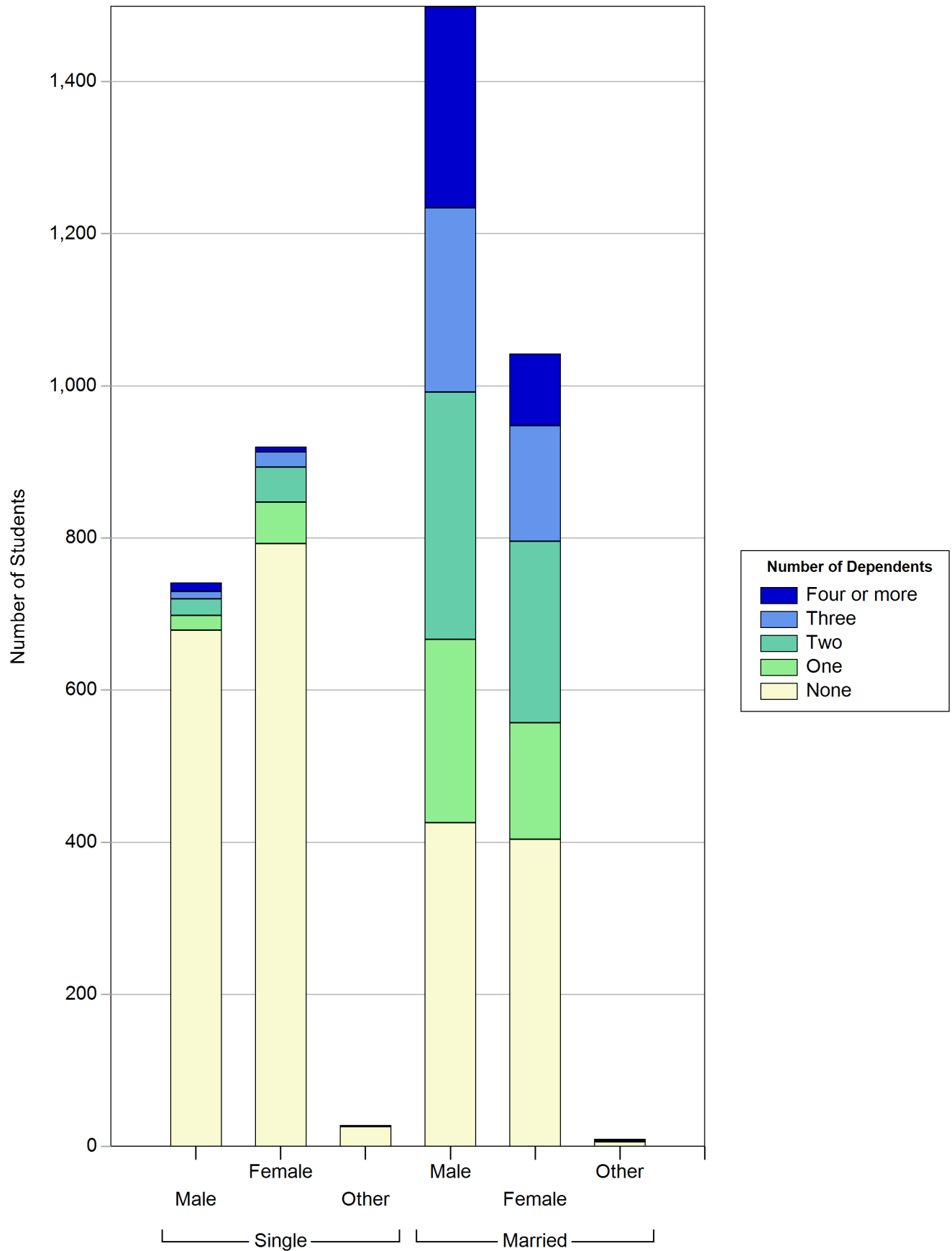

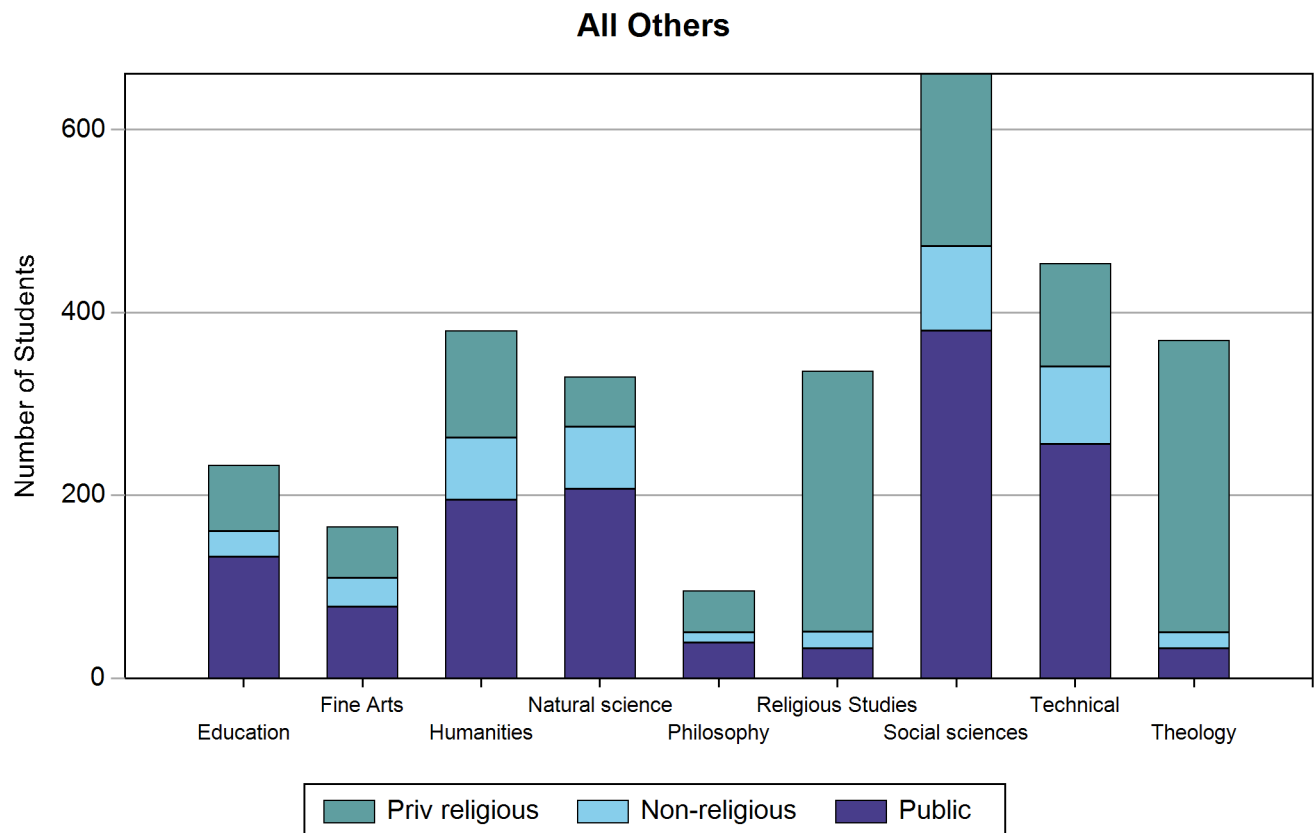
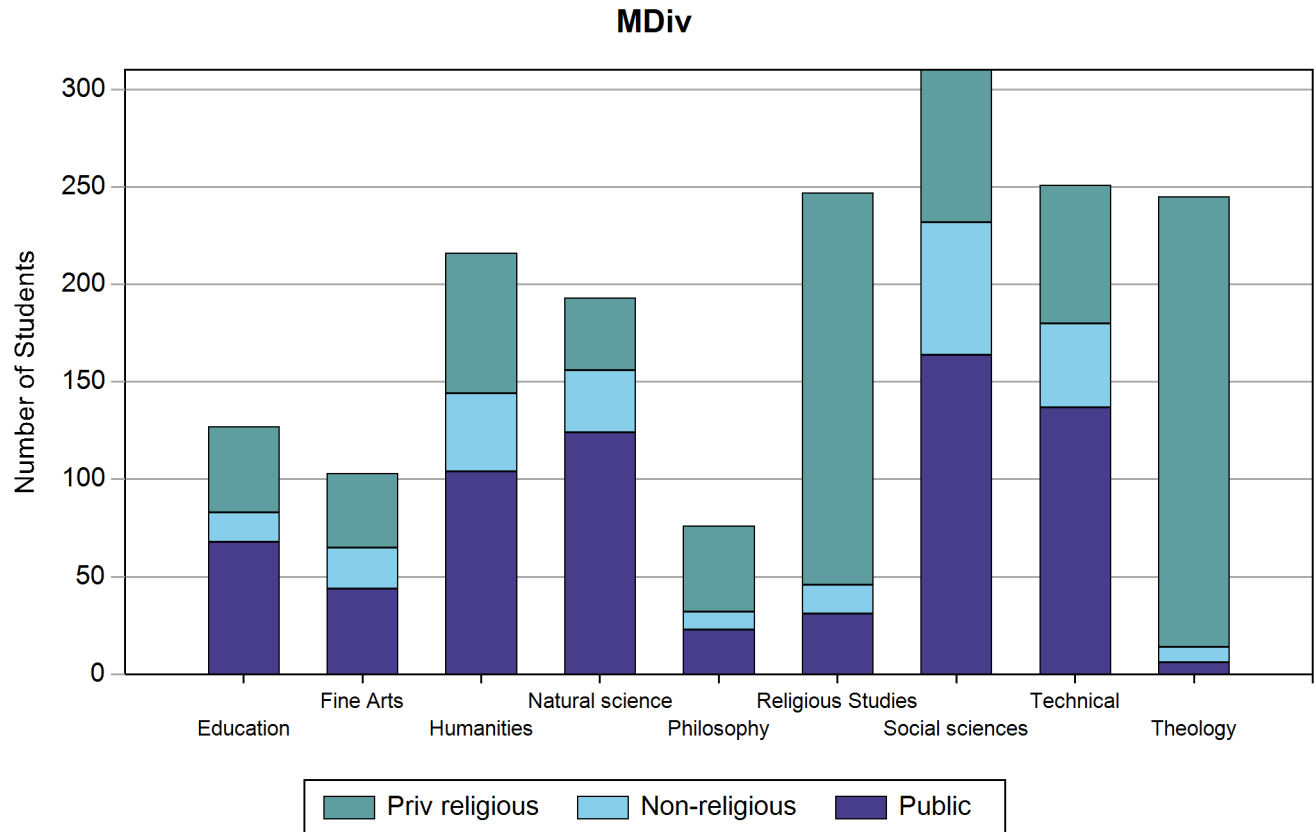

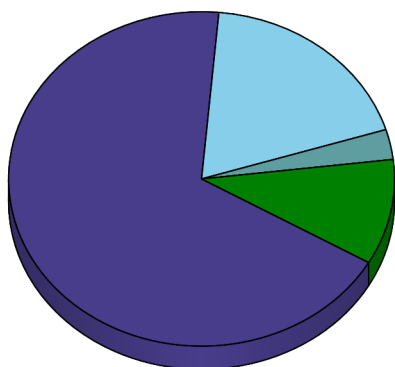

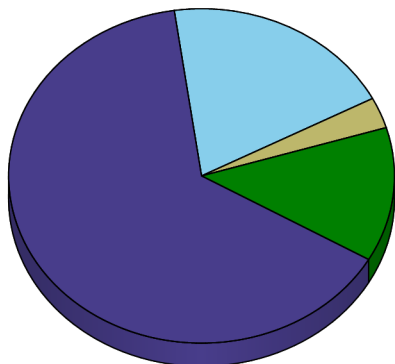
**CHART 7: Highest Degree Beyond Bachelor's**

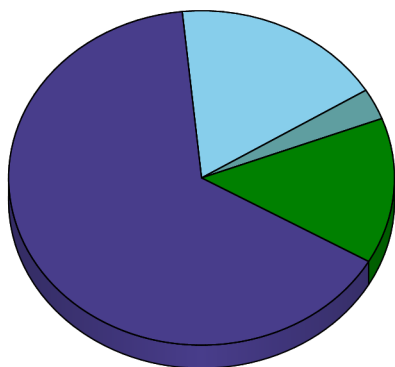

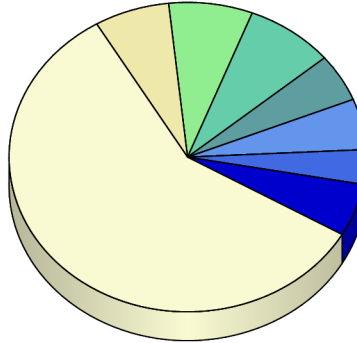

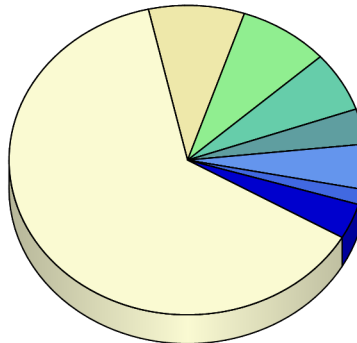
## CHART 8-A: Educational Debt for Full-time Respondents

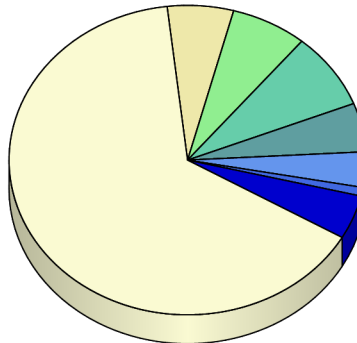

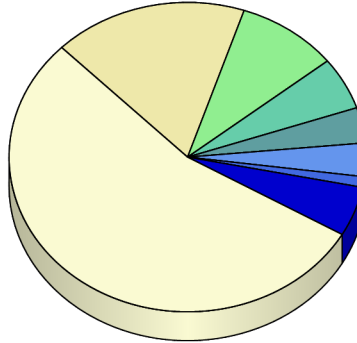

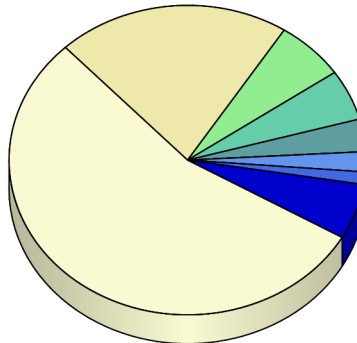
## CHART 8-B: Non-educational Debt for Full-time Respondents

**CHART 9-A: Educational Debt for All Respondents**

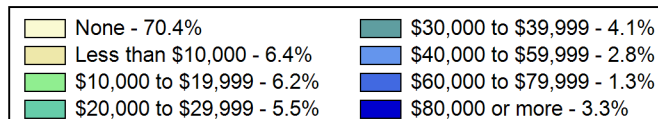
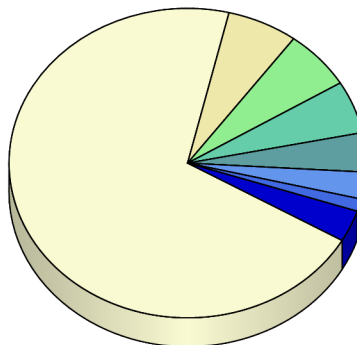

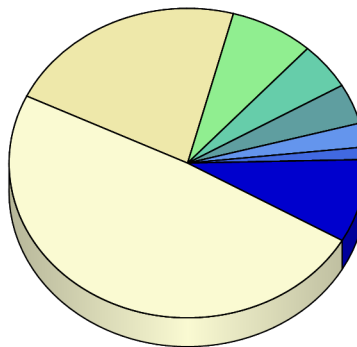
**CHART 9-B: Non-educational Debt for All Respondents**

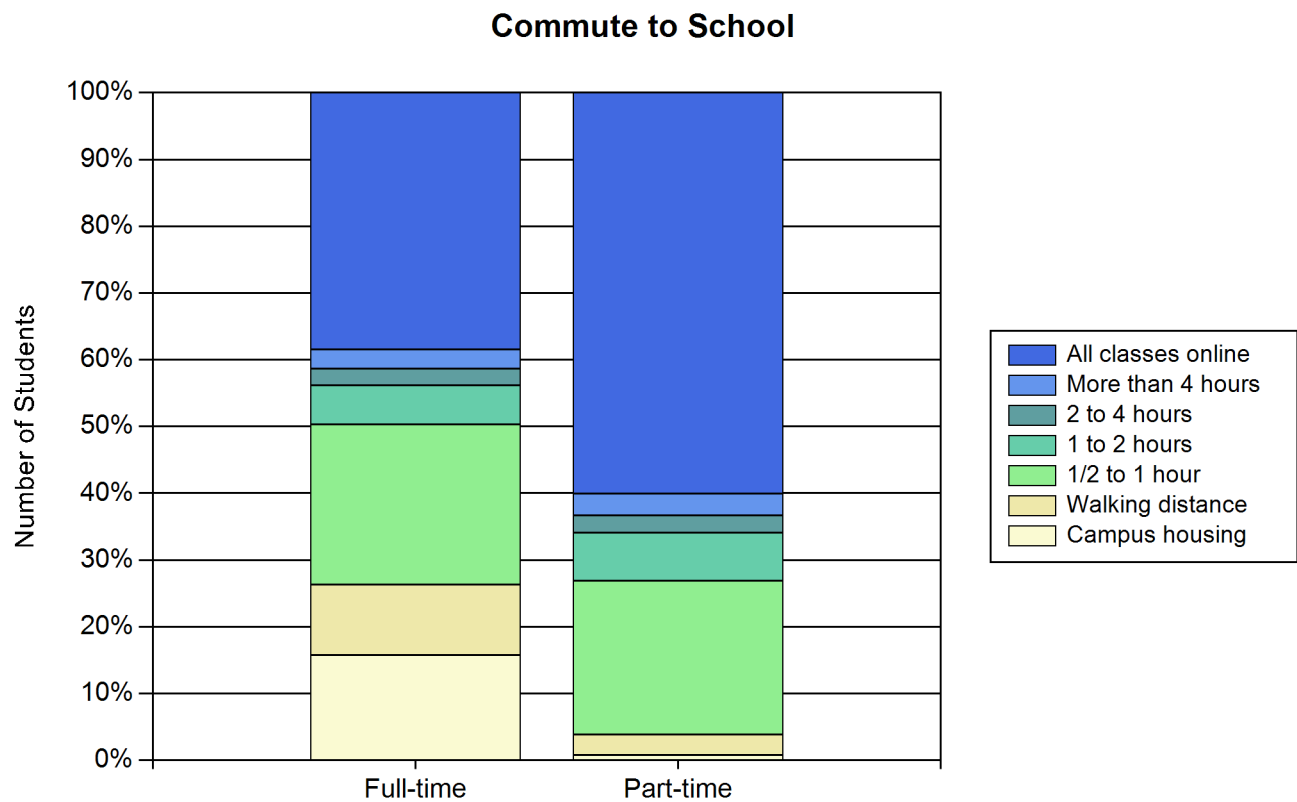
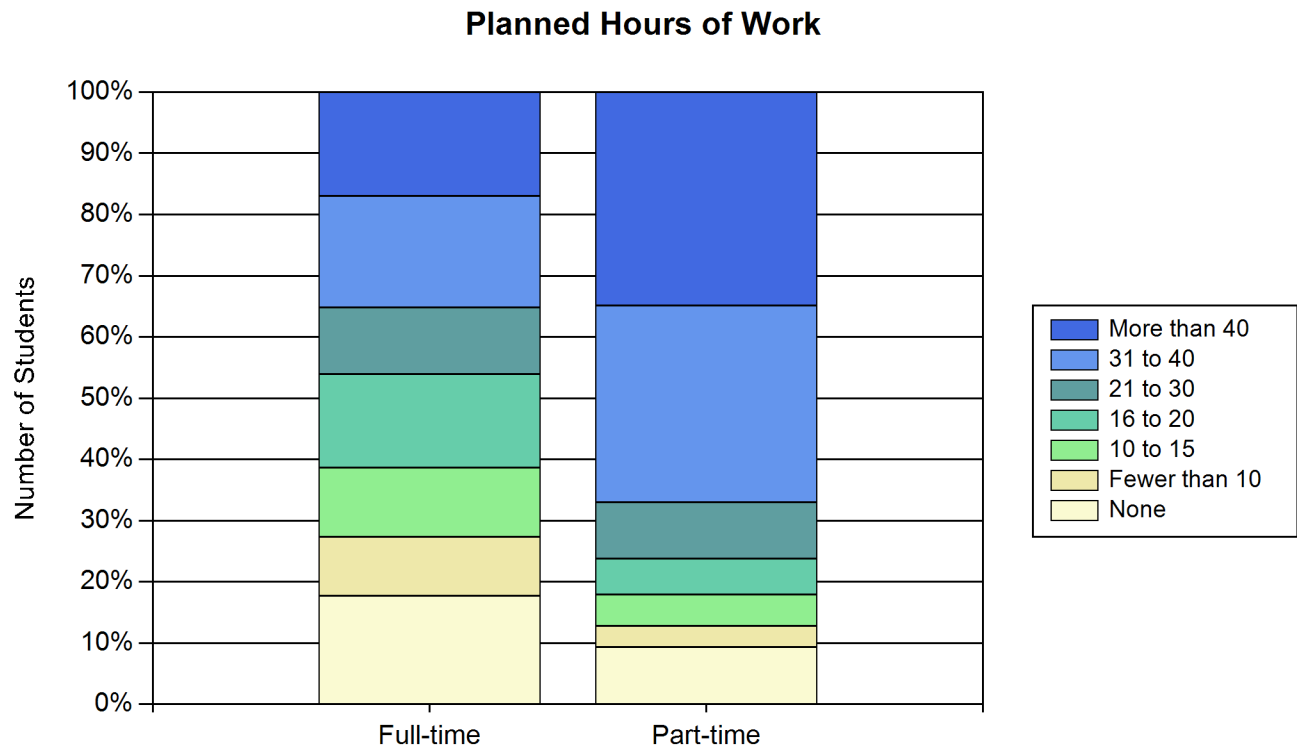

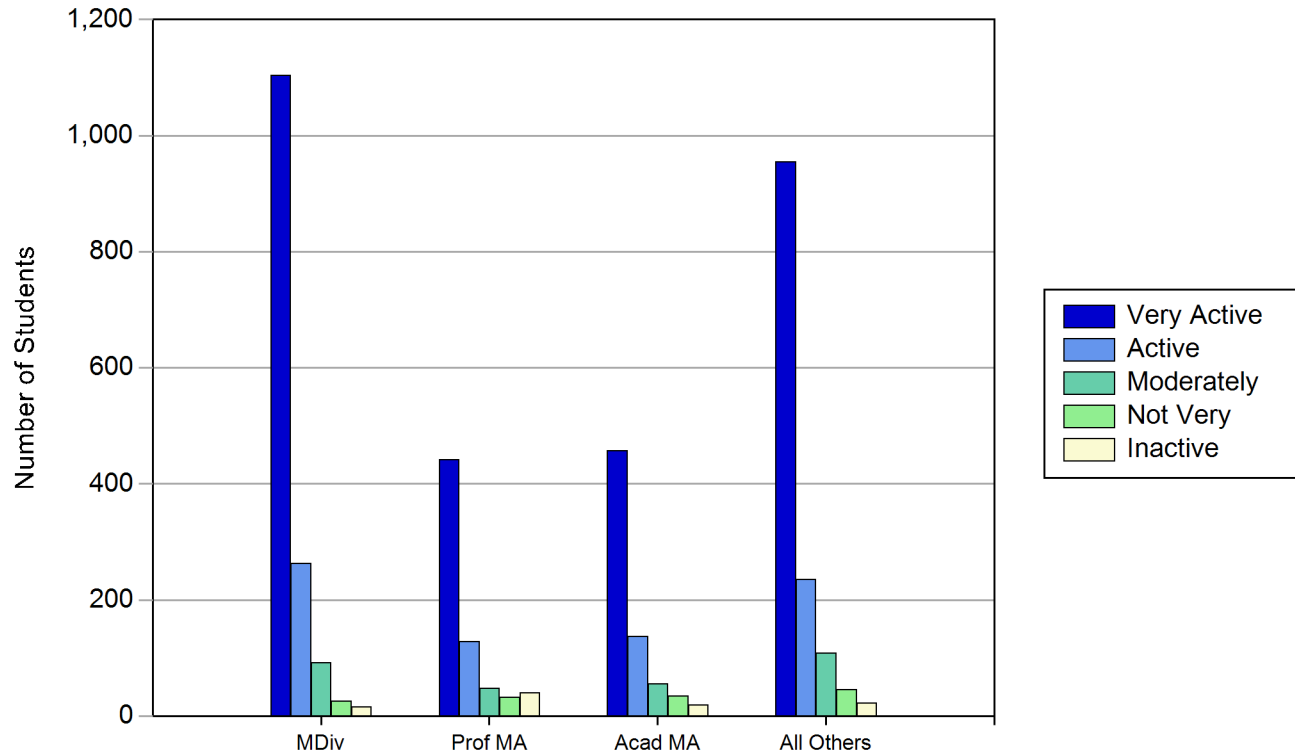

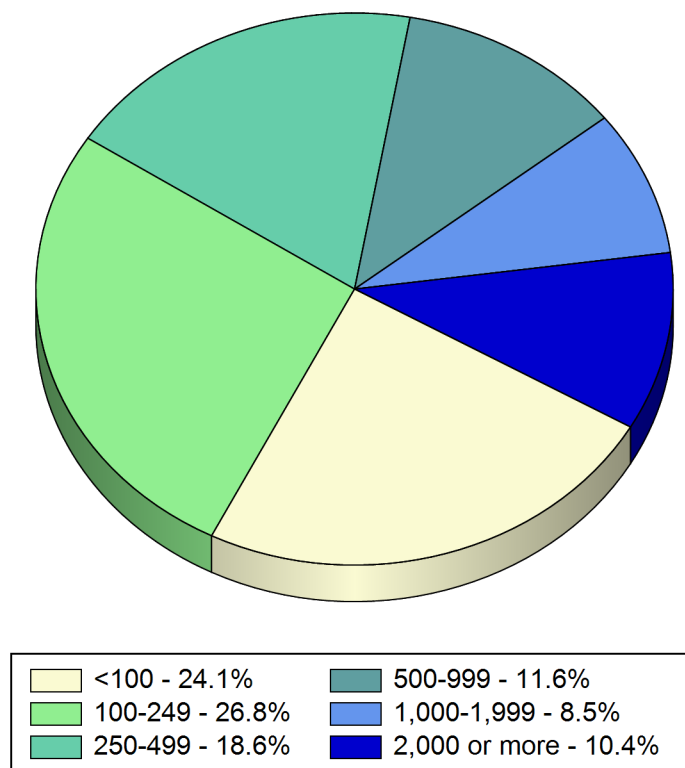


**CHART 14: Worshipping Community and Size of Church**

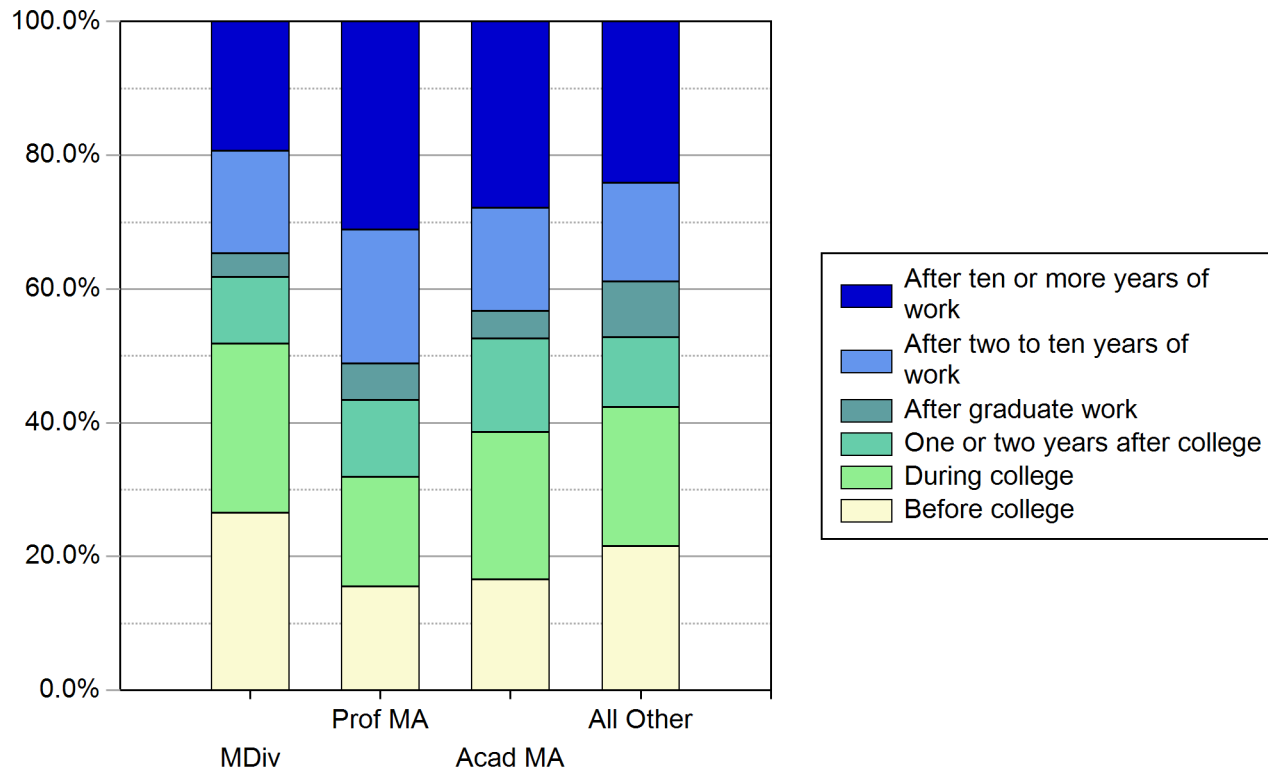

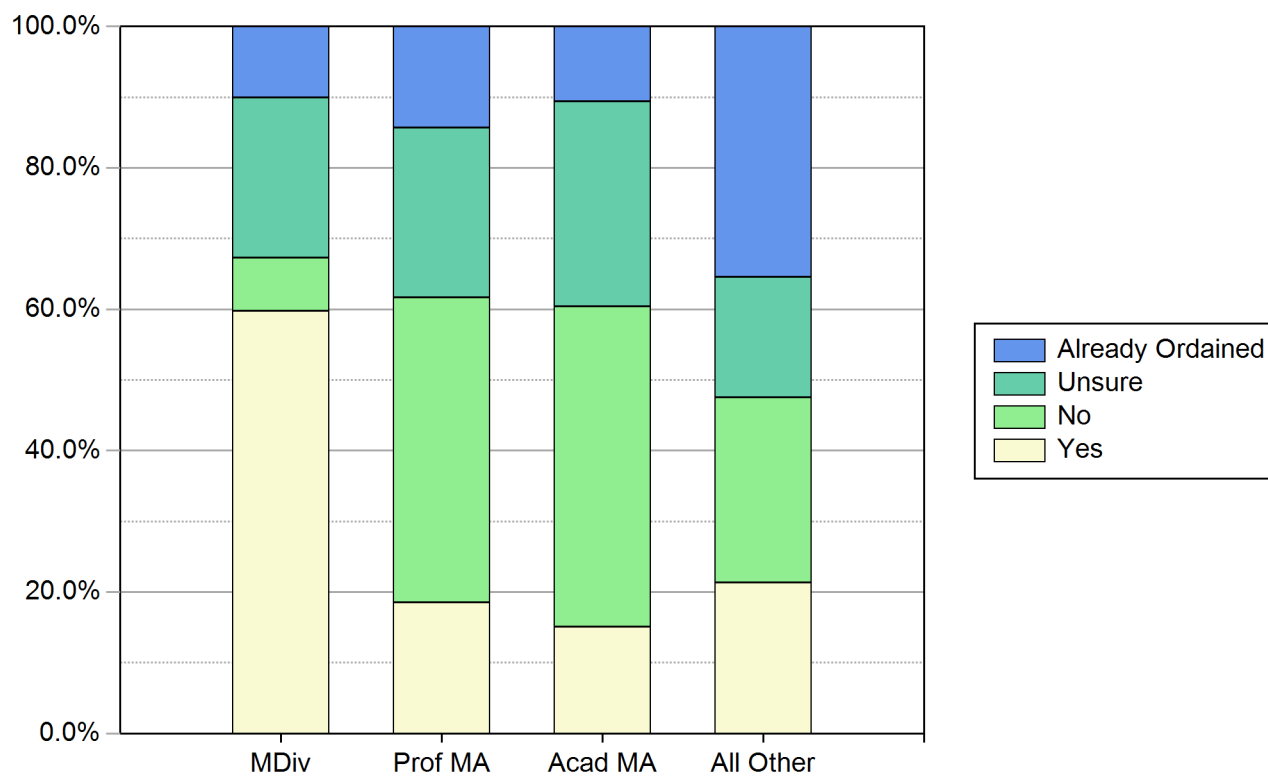

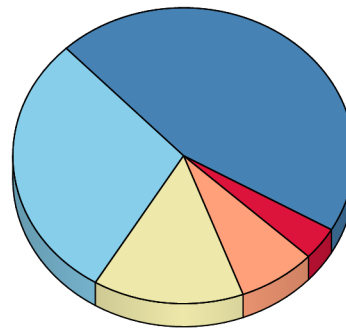

## CHART 17: Information Sources, Importance of School Visit, and Student Housing

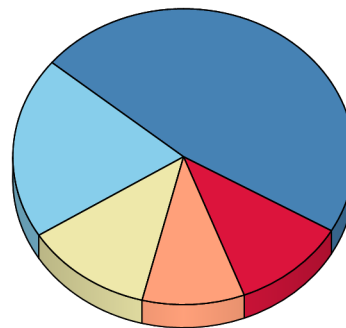

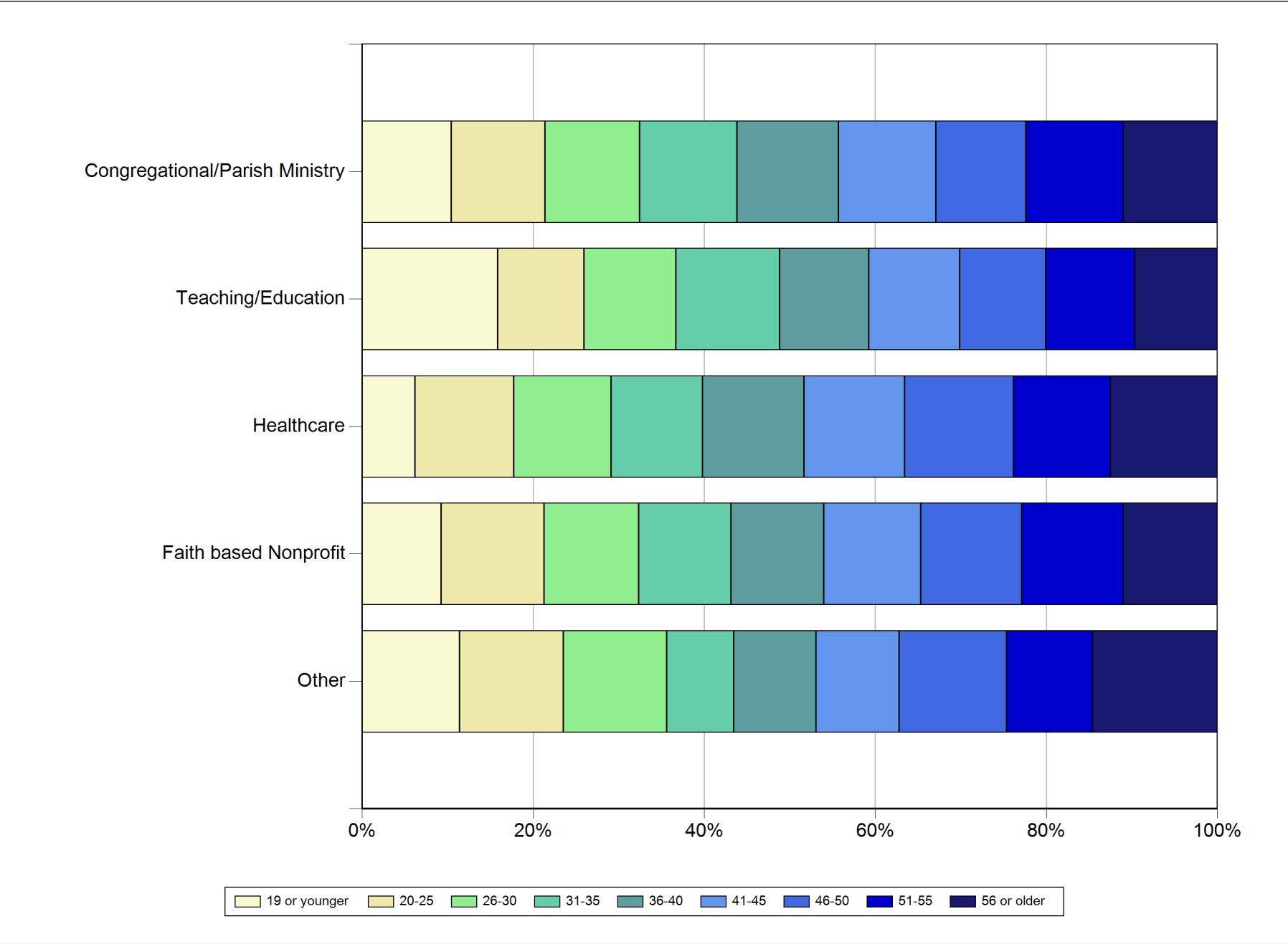

### CHART 22: Interest in Vocational Contexts by Age



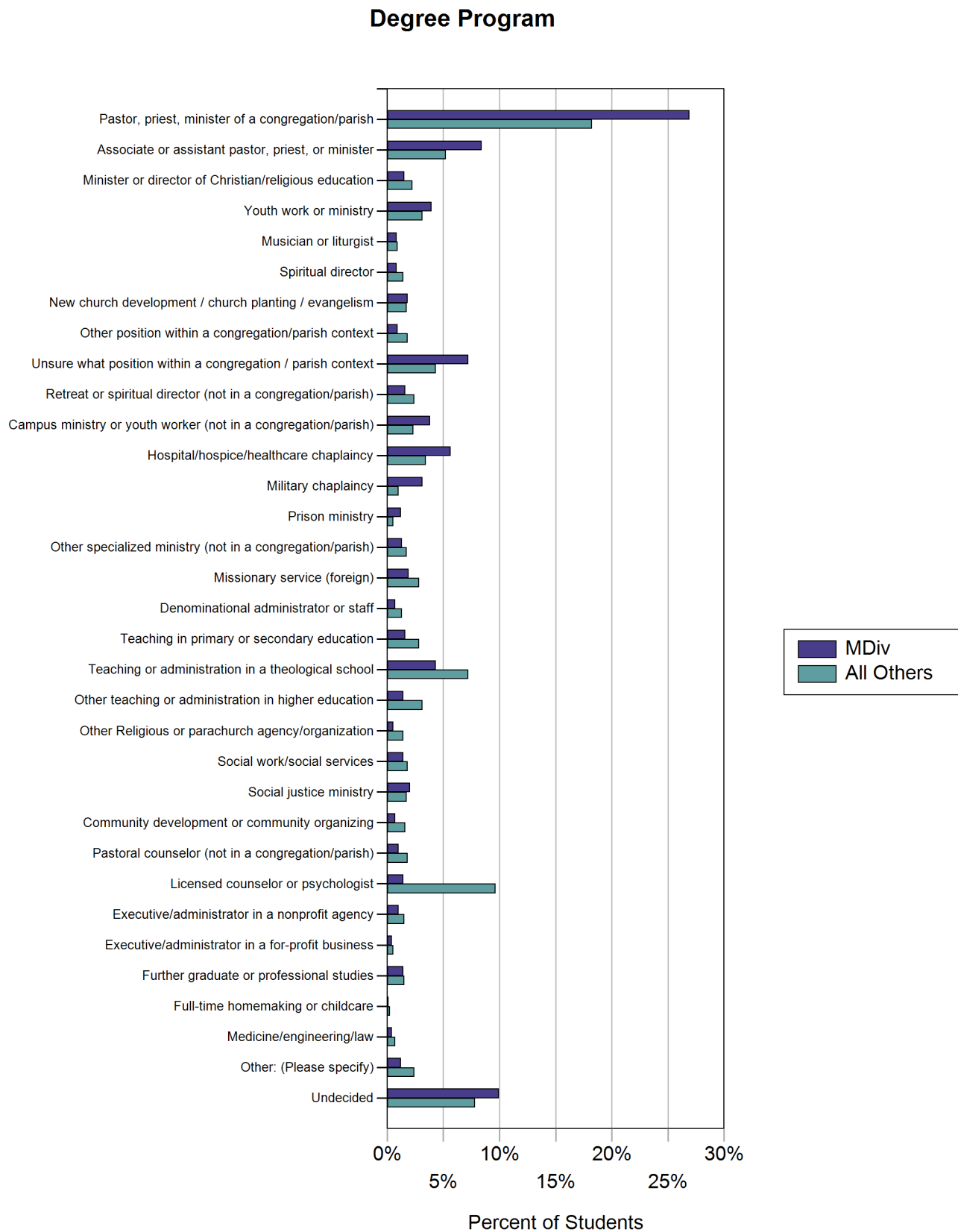

**CHART 23-A: Expectation for Position after Graduation by Degree Program**



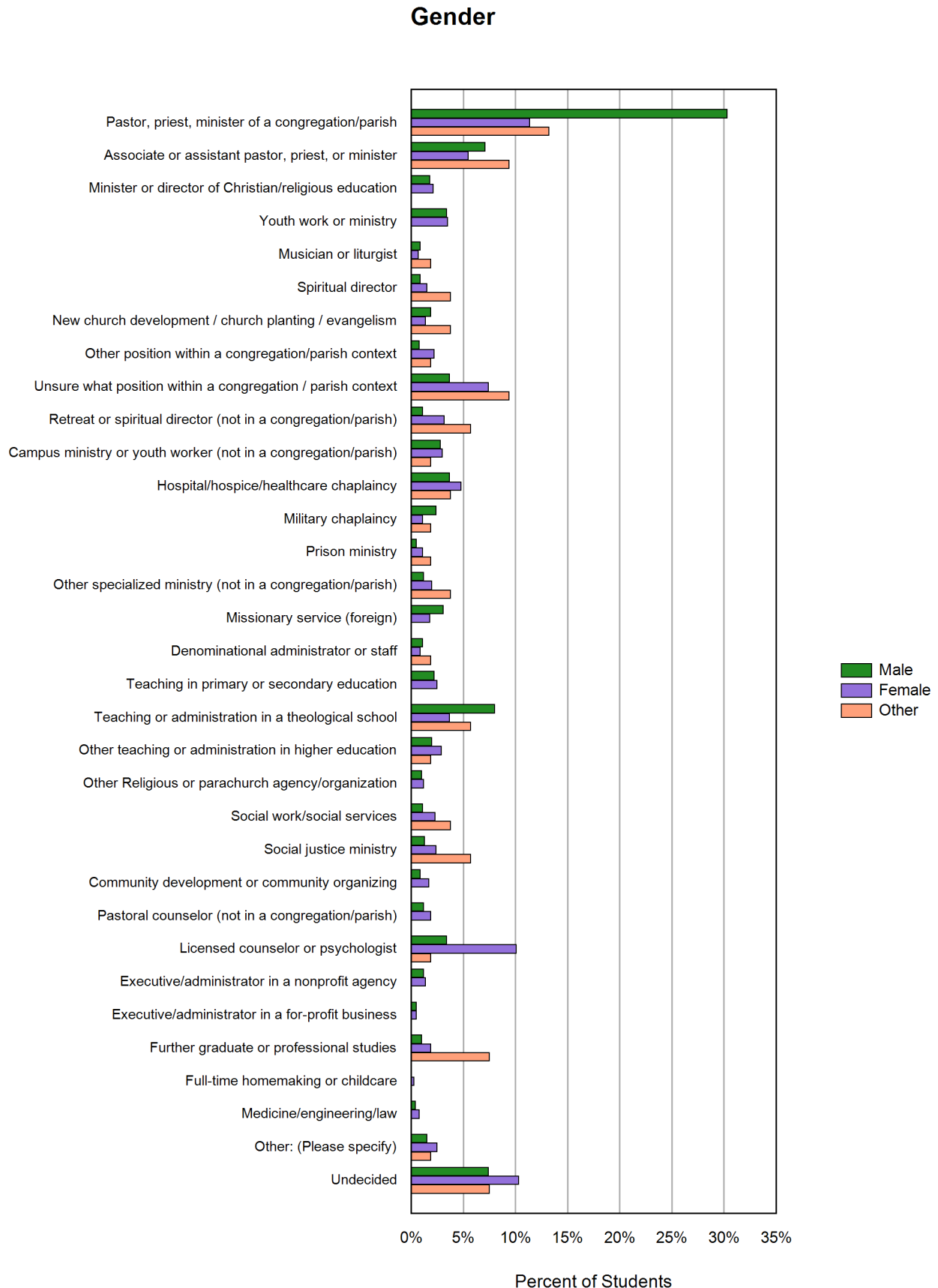
