CHART 1: Participants by Gender and Degree Program








CHART 2: Year Began Program









CHART 3: Participants by Racial/Ethnic Identity











CHART 4: Age Range and Gender











CHART 6: Number of Dependents by Gender and Marital Status



CHART 7-A: Educational Debt Brought by All Students







CHART 7B: Educational Debt Incurred at Seminary for All Students







CHART 8A: Educational Debt Brought by Full-time Students



CHART 8-B: Educational Debt Incurred at Seminary by Full-time Students



CHART 10: Important Sources of Income Supporting Graduate Studies



CHART 11: Hours of Work per Week at Paying Jobs





CHART 15: Educational Effectiveness in Facilitating Skill Areas



CHART 17: Three Most Important Influences on Educational Experience











CHART 18: Importance of Field Education/Internship if Required













CHART 19: Effectiveness of Field Education in Developing Capacities






CHART 24: Position Expected in Five Years by Degree Program


