

## COMMISSION'S STATEMENT OF ACCREDITED STATUS

New York Theological Seminary 3041 Broadway at 121<sup>st</sup> Street New York, NY 10027

New York Theological Seminary has been accredited by the Commission on Accrediting (COA) of The Association of Theological Schools since 1958. The school's accreditation was last reaffirmed in winter 2015, based on an institutional self-study report and an onsite evaluation visit by a committee of peer and public reviewers. The school's current period of accreditation expires March 31, 2025.

The school's current status of *Accredited on Show Cause* means the school does not meet one or more applicable COA Standards of Accreditation. The school must demonstrate within 12 months (i.e., by June 2024) as to why accreditation should not be withdrawn.

The school is approved to offer the following degree(s): MDiv, MA in Pastoral Care and Counseling, MA in Religious Education, MA in Transformational Leadership and Administration, MA in Youth Ministry, Master of Professional Studies, DMin

The school is approved to offer half or more of a degree at the following additional location(s):

Sing Sing Correctional Facility, Ossining, NY
