The Association of Theological Schools in the United States and Canada is the established accrediting agency for graduate theological education. Tracing its origins to 1918 when formal consultations on theological education were begun, the Association now numbers 204 institutions reflecting the diversity of the religious communities and university relationships in the two national communities. Its purposes include, within a general mandate for the improvement of theological education, the establishment of standards and the accreditation of institutions, serving as a forum for shared interests, and the consideration of issues among members and between members and related agencies. In the exercise of its standard setting duties, the Association has maintained a membership list of accredited schools since 1936. The Association also publishes annually a Directory of Theological Schools.

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## INTRODUCTION

This is the nineteenth annual edition of the Fact Book. Each year all of the Association's member schools are required to provide annual reports on forms which are supplied. These reports include information on enrollment, professional staff, and salaries for the current year, 1987-88. They also include graduation statistics, financial reports, and library data from the previous academic year, 1986-87. Per student revenue and per student/per faculty expenditures are based on the fall 1986 "head count" and "full-time equivalency" enrollment and employment, as well as on the audited financial information for the 1986-87 year.

TABLES: Enrollment totals are reported for individual schools of theology in Tables A, B-1, and B-2. This is the seventh successive year in which the per student and per faculty revenue/expenditure tables (AA-1 through JJ-2) are supplied on both a "head count" and "full-time equivalency" basis. Tables C-6, D-6, and E-6 in the appendices provide these latter data, with Table B-2 reporting both the "head count" and "FTE enrollments" for individual schools. Tables AA-1 through JJ-1 provide revenue/expenditure data on the "head count" basis, while Tables AA-2 through JJ-2 are parallel, using the "full-time equivalency" information. The differences between the two become increasingly important as schools continue to experience an influx of more part-time students in their various degree programs. This is the fourth year in which Gifts and Grants Income are reported in Tables WW-1 through 7.

PURPOSE: From the beginning of publication a primary purpose of these Fact Books has been to provide annually information on parallel patterns permitting ready comparisons across the years. Where changes have been introduced these have generally been in the form of providing additional information not previously supplied or to acknowledge changes that have occurred. All data, with the exception of the Native American enrollments, are subjected to computer analysis. Since these latter numbers continue to be quite small, they have been fully summarized in the text, but are not found in the computer generated appendices.

CLASSIFICATIONS: The data received from each school are classified in several ways: size of enrollment, accredited or "other" (i.e., candidate and associate member institutions), university relation, cluster membership, race, denomination, region of location, and highest degree offered for the accredited schools only. These classifications provide the basis

for the distributions found in the tables included in the appendices. Table A indicates the classification identifiers for each member school, including both the 1986 and 1987 fall enrollments. Table B-1 reports the changing enrollment patterns for each member school on a quadrennial basis beginning in 1960 or the year of initial Association membership, if later than 1960. Table B-2, included for the seventh successive year, reports individual school enrollment by separate degree programs for both 1986 and 1987, "head count" and "full-time equivalent."

Certain arbitrary decisions are necessary with regard to these classifications. For example, a seminary is classified as a part of a university only if the larger institution possesses two other professional schools or departments operating at the graduate level. Schools are classified as related to a cluster only if the relationship includes at least two other schools of theology. Denominational groups are sorted and reported publicly--in these Fact Books--only if the denomination maintains at least four institutions which are members of the Association. Because the computer cannot deal with dual denominational status--which some schools hold, each has been classified on the basis of the primary church membership of the student body. Thus, Andover Newton is included in the United Church of Christ category, rather than American Baptist. Neither Bexley Hall nor the Berkeley Divinity School, both Episcopal seminaries, are included in the Episcopal data because of their relationships with Colgate Rochester and the Yale Divinity School respectively. The Lutheran category combines the data for the American Lutheran Church, Association of Evangelical Lutheran Churches, and Lutheran Church in America which have merged to form the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. Prior to the 1982-83 edition, the term "Lutheran" applied only to the Lutheran Church in America schools. This is the fifth year the new denomination, the Presbyterian Church, U.S.A., appears. The data for prior years have combined the information for the Presbyterian Church in the United States and the United Presbyterian Church. Note also that, at the request of the school, the data for the Pacific School of Religion were shifted in 1983-84 to the United Church of Christ category, rather than the inter-/nondenominational grouping, as in the past. Tables in the text were adjusted to reflect this change. However, readers using previous Fact Books must do so with care, since these two subgroupings are no longer precisely parallel in successive volumes.

Since 1980 the Association has had three separate categories of institutional membership: accredited member, candidate for accredited member, and associate member. For the purposes of the Fact Book, the latter two groupings (candidates and associates) have been combined in the "Other" column in the tables presenting size/status data. Please

note that this year schools are listed as members of Clusters/Consortium if the school is listed as a member of such a group listed in the ATS Annual Directory under Clusters and Consortia. Schools will note a goodly number of changes in their classification this year as this characteristic was updated.

As in the past, all salary scales reported in the volume have been edited to preserve confidentiality. Hence any salary data field with less than three salaries being reported does not provide any salary information.

Finally, as editor I have written the text to report and emphasize those data which appear to me to be most important. The goal has been factual presentation and description. No value judgments about size, mode of financing, patterns of expenditure, composition of student body, or other matters are intended. Each reader is invited to make his/her own judgments on the data and their import in reference to his/her own perspectives and commitments in the theological education world. The additional caption, e.g., [TABLE 4], indicates clearly the textual commentary on tables 1-39.

The Fact Book has been prepared by the ATS staff and is offered to the ATS member schools, as well as the general public, with the hope that it will be useful to those with responsibility for the management of the theological education enterprise in North America. The work has been done with the strong conviction that management decisions are best made when the persons charged with making them have the widest range of and most complete data available to inform their deliberations.

ENROLLMENT  
[TABLE 1]

Seminary enrollment in ATS member schools has suffered a decline of 1% this year with an opening fall 1987 enrollment of 55,766. This is a slightly greater than the overall decline last year of -0.6%. Excluding, however, the six new schools which were added in 1986, the decline for 1986 would have been -1.2%, slightly larger than the 1987 decline. This is the third straight year of a gradual decrease in enrollment, reversing a long-time trend of growth since 1970. Canadian member schools likewise experienced a decrease of -3.3% in overall enrollment. The largest drop in the schools was found in the Northeast region (-6.6%). The Far West region experienced a decline of -3.6% and Canada, as noted above a decline of -3.3%. The only growth was that in the Great Lakes region which experienced an increase of +3.4%, all but 1% of which was accounted for by the first time reporting of a program which had been in existence for a number of years at one of the member schools. Except for the regions noted above, enrollment was stable across the country. The decline of enrollment in those programs which normally lead to ordained ministries was -3.1%, greater than the overall average of -1% for all programs. A trend which was noted last year, namely, a growth in the number of first year students, was again noted this year with a growth of +4% up from 12,944 students to 13,459. Schools hope that this trend will continue and will be reflected eventually in overall statistics. The retention rate of students may be a greater concern in coming years.

Table 1 provides these enrollment data for each year since 1969, the initial publication year for these Fact Books. In that seventeen year span, seminary enrollments have risen from 29,815 persons in 1969 to 55,766 this year, up +87%. Some of this growth can be explained by the first column, the increase in the number of Association member schools reporting each

fall. The institutional growth rate, however, has been only 18.2%, far below the student enrollment growth of 87%. Readers interested in details of this change in membership should consult the 1980-81 Fact Book. Table 1 also indicates that the growth has been chiefly in professional degree programs, i.e., those preparing persons for some leadership role in the churches, although this number has declined for the past three years. The graduate programs, confined chiefly to masters and doctoral degrees primarily for higher education and secondary school teaching, have fluctuated up and down during the years. In 1982 they enrolled about the same number as 1969. During the past six years, this number has grown steadily, though the proportion of graduate students enrolled is below the early 1970's. Enrollment growth has been church occupation related, rather than academic career oriented.

In the major denominational groupings, only the U.S. Roman Catholics recorded an increase of +3.7%. Even that increase was due almost totally to the listing of a previously unreported program in a member school. Significant decreases were recorded by the United Church of Canada -6.7%; American Baptist -5.7%; Lutherans -3.6%; Canadian Roman Catholics -2.6%; and United Church of Christ -2.3%.

Table 2 provides more precise data on enrollment, since the number of institutions reporting in the last three years was not the same. This table reflects data from schools reporting in both years, and the decrease was -1.6%.

Table 3 continues these comparisons, this time on a six-year basis. During both 1981 and 1987, there were 185 schools reporting both years, and their total enrollments for the two different years are reflected in the table. They constitute a +7.3% growth, or c. 1.2% per year. In that same time period higher education has been growing at an average rate of between one and two percent. During the past three years, theological schools have not kept up with the national average.

Table 4 provides a different view of these data. The preceding tables have tabulated persons registered, regardless of the extent of their time commitment to study, called simply a head-count. Table 4 reports on persons studying full time, or in the instance of part-time students, their full-time equivalency. These data are available only since 1978. The fall of 1987 experienced a fractional growth in Full-Time equivalent (FTE) enrollment of +0.1%. This follows a decline of -1.4% for the previous year. The percentage of FTE (68.6%) in relation to total head-count was also up this year from 68.0% to 68.6%. This reverses a long-time trend of a declining ratio. Schools have been making a major effort to increase endowment dedicated to financial aid for students in order to free more students for full-time studies. Perhaps the impact of this effort is finally being felt. The trend to a lower percentage in the FTE enrollment has at least been arrested. But given a percentage of error in reporting, this slowdown is not enough in one year to constitute a reversal of the downward trend. During this nine-year period in which we have recorded these statistics, the average student study load has declined 10% from 78% of a full load of studies to 68.6%. This indicates a continuing growth in the number of students studying part-time at these schools. Theological schools across the country continue to experience a steady increase in the number of candidates who are starting theological studies at a more advanced age when the responsibilities of family or of employment will not permit full-time involvement in study. This group will include many already involved in some form of ministerial service who want to improve the educational background which they bring to ministry. The need of increasing endowment for student financial aid has assumed a high place in an average school's priorities, especially since graduate-level education calls for a high level of freedom for reflection and research. Theological schools are learning to accommodate to the higher number of part-time students with changes in the scheduling of courses and often more concentrated offerings.

The part-time rate of study, however, is not uniform across the several types of program offered. The Master of Divinity, the standard degree

preparing one for ordination, enrolls by far the largest number of persons, and they register for an average load of 82.8%, well above the overall average load of 68.6%. There has been regular decline in this average since 1978 when it stood at 90.5% for the M.Div. program. The decline during the past year has been -0.5%.

Of interest is the fact that persons enrolled in the four to five-year Master of Divinity programs have a consistent high ratio 97.7% studying full-time in relation to head-count. This year the decline in general enrollment was not noticeable here (+8.9% head-count; +8.7% full-time equivalent), continuing last year's increase of c.7%.

Regional enrollment patterns also show some variations. The Great Lakes region has the highest FTE ratio (73.7%), and the Far West has the lowest (60.6%). The Plains (72%), Southwest (69.5%) and Canada together with the Southeast (69.8%) were above the average.

New England and the Mideast were slightly below the average of 68.6%. Overall, the changes since last year were negligible with New England regaining 1.5 percent points of the three which it had lost last year.

Denominational comparisons of full-time student ratios are also interesting. The lowest at 58.3% is the United Church of Canada. The highest, grouped at 78% are Lutherans, Episcopalians together with Canadian and US Roman Catholics. Grouped at 62% are American Baptists, Christian Churches, Presbyterians and the United Church of Christ. Closer to 67% are Southern Baptists and United Methodists.

Professional Degree Enrollments

Table 5 records the major degree enrollments for selected years since 1969. The year 1975 is a good benchmark from which to compare the relative growth of professional programs. During the past 12 years the two-year M.A.'s have done best with a growth of +88%. Next comes the Doctor of Ministry with a growth of +69%, then the one-year special programs +65%, and last the Master of Divinity +16%. The D.Min. continues to command a steady 12% of professional degree enrollment. The M.Div. commands a smaller percentage each year, presently 53.3%. The two-year graduate programs and the special certificate programs are increasingly prominent as these percentages have advanced to 19.4% and 14.5% respectively. It is clear that seminaries

are attracting students with a wider variety of interests. The D.Min. group is largely full-time professionals already holding the M.Div. and seeking advanced competence for the performance of their duties. This program holds a secure place among the professional degrees.

Further detail on D.Min. enrollments is reported in Table 6. There are two different degree patterns, both carrying the D.Min. designation. The "in-sequence" model is a four-year program which includes the accomplishments of the more customary three-year M.Div. and adds another full year of preordination preparation. It was this pattern which first emerged in the 60s and was responsible for creating an interest in new approaches. The "in-ministry" track adds one additional year, usually done part-time and spread across two or three years of advanced preparation. This track almost always requires a period of full-time ministerial experience following the award of the M.Div. Through the years there has been a steady decline of interest in the in-sequence degree track, both on the part of students and of institutions. Table 6 indicates its extent. Enrollment dropped from 499 persons (25 schools offering this track) in 1975 down to 51 students in 9 schools this autumn. At the same time, the in-ministry degree track almost doubled in registrants, up from 3,211 to 6,204. Almost 50% more institutions offered this track than in 1975. These data surely indicate that there is positive clergy response to a program which provides "advanced competence in the practice of ministry."

There are some interesting enrollment contrasts in the D.Min. While women as a group constitute 27% of total seminary enrollment, 30% of in-sequence D.Min. registrants are women. It is only in this program and in the two-year masters degrees that women are so well represented 44.5%. By way of comparison, women make up only 8.9% of the D.Min. in-ministry students, well below these ratios. While somewhat striking in contrast, this is probably to be expected. The entrance of significant numbers of women into ministry is a rather new phenomenon. Hence, only a very small pool of applicants possess both the M.Div. and the years of full-time professional ministry experience which are usually prerequisite for admission. Given the substantial numbers of women entering ministry, this ratio has been growing.

The D.Min. program presents other somewhat startling contrasts. While 90 institutions offer the in-ministry model, most of them have quite modest enrollments in the program. In fact, these in-ministry D.Min. students are very unevenly distributed across the Association's membership. Eighteen schools have 100 or more D.Min. students. Of these, two schools have between 200 and 300; and three school have over 300 D.Min. students. Full details can be found in the appendices, especially tables B-2, C-1, and D-1.

Graduate Student Enrollments

Table 7 provides the details in summary form for selected years since 1969. The Association classifies as "graduate" those degree programs which require four or five years beyond the baccalaureate, or which require the M.Div. plus one to three additional years of study. The most obvious impression from the table is one of random fluctuation, up and down. This year the total graduate enrollment is higher (+6%) than last year. Of that 6% growth, half was due to the first-time listing of the newly approved Doctor of Missiology degree (128 students). Significant growth was also found in the Th.D. (+7.6%, +35 students). And the masters program grew by 4.2%. It seems clear that no simple pattern can be found to explain the phenomenon. In the early 1970s the emergence of the D.Min. degree was thought to provide an alternative which would lower at least the graduate masters level of enrollment, especially the S.T.M. Though the masters enrollment has dropped -35% since 1971, enrollment in masters programs has been almost steady for the past ten years. These programs appear to respond to the interest of a definite group. Doctoral level programs (Th.D.-/Ph.D.) have grown +37.2% since 1971; interest continues to rise and the need for those degrees is still there. The D.Min. after spectacular growth up to the early 1980's appears to have leveled off during the past couple of years.

In the light of the well-known retrenchment in higher education, and the scarcity of new positions, one might expect a diminished interest in the doctoral level degrees. As we noted, this is not the case. The growth since 1971 has been +37.2%. The fluctuations noted above are not evident in the Ph.D. doctoral program. The details on these degrees may be examined in the appendices, Table C-1.

Sex Distribution of Theological Students

The Association has received these data from member schools since 1972. Table 8 provides the information distributed both by sex and by selected degree programs for several years since 1972. Full details are found in Tables C-3, D-3, and E-3. All of these tables are parallel to those found in earlier editions of the Fact Book permitting precise comparisons. Data on graduation will be found in Tables F-3, G-3, and H-3.

The continuing rapid growth in the enrollment of women is demonstrated by examining the totals at the bottom of Table 8. Fourteen years ago, women constituted 10.2% of the total student population. This year they constitute 27.4% of the student group. The actual head-count of women has grown by 444 or 3.0% since last year, a steady growth especially significant in the light of the overall decline in enrollment this past year. The growth rate has declined from the highest recorded at 30.7% in 1974 to 3.0% the past year. The average growth for the past five years was 4.2%.

While the percentage of women enrolled in the three and four-year degrees which customarily lead to ordination (19.9%) still lags behind the overall average for the enrollment of women, even that percentage has continued to grow. In 1972 women were only 4.7% of its registrants. The enrollment of women in academic doctoral programs is five and one-half times that of 1972. The presence of women on the theological academic scene as well as in church ministry is continuing to grow in significance, despite the limitations on ordination in several denominations.

Table 9 adds more precision to the observations above about the enrollment of women in ordination programs. Here the M.Div. and the in-sequence D.Min. have been segregated for comparison. Between 1976 and 1987 there was a slight decline in men enrollees for these two degree programs. In that ten year period total seminary enrollment rose +30%. Total enrollment in the preordination programs rose only +8.6%. The enrollment of women, however in those two programs rose +110%. The year 1987 marks the third year of a decline in absolute numbers of male enrollment. This means that since 1976 the growth in these two programs has been entirely among women whose percentage rose from 11.5% to 22.4%.

Table 10 provides data on the results of this increased enrollment of women in the graduate, post-M.Div. programs. The total number of women completing all seminary programs during 1986-87 was 25.9% of the total graduates. This figure is only 1.5% below the total percentage of women enrolled in such programs (27.4%). The total percentage of women graduates in the academic programs is growing rapidly, although the percentage in the doctoral level programs appears steady at 20% since 1981.

Table 11 provides parallel information about women receiving the professional degrees. The field of church education has been one area of full time service open to women for many years. Hence the reader should not be surprised to find that 38.3% of the Master of Religious Education graduates last year were women. As more and more women enter ordained ministry, one might expect that percentage to drop gradually, but this has not been the case.

The women graduates in the Master of Divinity program present a far more striking contrast. As noted on the following page, total M.Div. enrollments have been moving upward at a very modest pace, when compared to other degree programs. But the role of women in the M.Div. has been rising at a rapid rate, and this is reflected in the numbers of graduates. In just ten years (since 1976-77) women M.Div. recipients have increased 224% (from 462 to 1,496). In that same period of time men M.Div. graduates rose by only 4.6% (from 5,158 to 5,394). This sharp contrast is highlighted even more when the data in Tables 11 and 19 are compared.

The situation with respect to the in-sequence D.Min. presents an interesting comparison. This year, women were 22 of 59 graduates (37.3%). The steadily diminishing enrollments in this track of the D.Min. program are now being fully reflected in graduation statistics. Even though the program seems to be gradually disappearing and even though the actual numbers are not growing, the role of women in it remains strong.

Table 12 pushes these data one additional step by examining them within denominational categories. Ordination graduates here are defined as persons receiving either the M.Div. or the D.Min. in-sequence. While there is some up/down fluctuation from year to year, it is apparent from the table that both the numbers and percentages of the total represented by women have increased since 1976-77. In the United Church of Canada, women are over one-half of the candidates ready for ordination consideration. For the United Church of Christ the percentage is 47.6%. For the Episcopalians, and United Methodists it approximates 37%. Other church bodies have lower rates. Even the churches of the Southern Baptist Convention, a group which has traditionally been unwilling to approve the ordination of women, find themselves with significant numbers of women fully prepared for ordination (130 women, or 11.4% of the total graduates last year).

Black Student Enrollment

These data have been received from member schools since fall 1970, and the successive Fact Books have contained them. Table 13 provides a summary of this information. The reader will note that the numbers of blacks enrolled in seminaries has risen steadily across the years. The average rate of increase per year since 1979 has been 6.5%, which is more than three times the average total enrollment increase of 1.8%. However, the reader must be careful when using these statistics. Black enrollment started from such a low point that phenomenal rates of growth have still not produced large numbers of black students. And the ratio that black students represent in the the total theological school population more than doubled within this fourteen year period, moving upward from 2.6% in 1970 and reaching 6% in 1987. This is far below the black percentage of the total population, estimated by the 1980 census to be 11.7% in the United States. This reflects the fact tht blacks continue to be an "underrepresented constituency" in Association schools. The total enrollment of blacks in 1986 rose +3.1% (102 students).

One must also keep in mind that 731, or 21.6%, of these black students are found in the six schools which have traditionally served an almost exclusively black clientele. This means that the remaining 2,648 black students are distributed across the 195 additional member seminaries. Actually this distribution is very uneven. The largest number of blacks in a denominational grouping of schools is the 454 black students enrolled in United Methodist schools. The American Baptist group has 312 blacks, but one of these seminaries is among the six traditionally black institutions. There are 266 blacks enrolled in the six Southern Baptist theological schools, and 185 in the ten Presbyterian, U.S.A. institutions. Table D-2 indicates that there are 1,087 black registrants in the twenty-two inter- and nondenominational member schools, but two of these are the two largest primarily black seminaries which together enroll 455 blacks, leaving the remaining 632 black students distributed across the other twenty institutions in this group. Of the member schools with no American/Canadian black students 34 are in the US and 19 are in Canada.

[TABLE 14]

Table 14 provides a sex distribution for the 3,379 black students in the several degree categories utilized above. It is readily apparent that the general increase in women's enrollment noted earlier has also characterized the growing role of black women. In fact, their rate of increase is much greater than that for black men, since the latter are a steadily diminishing proportion of the total number of blacks in seminaries. In 1972 black men were 91.3% of the black student population. By 1987 this had dropped to 70.6%. Or to state the statistic a bit differently, in that 15 year interval black men have increased in number by 14.6%; but black women's numbers have risen by 982%! This growth rate is even more startling in some of the separate degree programs. For example: black women ordination candidates rose from 34 (5.0% of blacks in these programs) in 1972 to 583 (25.7%) in 1987. Black women doctoral students numbered but one person in 1972 (1.8% of black doctoral students). In 1987 there were 27 black women registered in doctoral programs, and they were 30.3% of the total. This one degree program best illustrates the increasing role for black women. In 1972 there were 55 black males in such programs; in 1987 the number was 62. At the same time, the numbers of black women rose from 1 to 27! There have been additional increases in the other degree categories found in Table 14.

[TABLE 15]

Table 15 presents the accumulated data on black graduate degree recipients across the past decade. The fairly stable nature of the enrollment of black students in these degrees has already been noted, and the numbers of graduates across the years tend to confirm this observation. The customary fluctuations found in all graduate degree programs appear, since the normal time patterns applicable to other degrees (i.e., two years for the

M.R.E., etc.) are probably not applicable. And Table 15 reveals that such is the case. Black students receiving graduate masters degrees have ranged from a low of seven (1975-76) to a high of eighteen in 1982-83. And similarly black doctoral awards have ranged from four (in two different years) to ten on three occasions. It was six last year. From these data one must draw the conclusion that there is no discernable increase in the numbers of black graduates joining the ranks of those qualified to teach in theological schools, completing the requirements for degrees at this level.

Readers interested in full details regarding black enrollment and graduation data should consult Tables C-2, D-2, E-2, F-2, G-2, and H-2 in this and earlier editions of this publication.

[TABLE 16]

Hispanic/American Enrollment

The Association of Theological Schools has been collecting this information on student enrollment since 1972, and Table 16 presents a summary of women/men distributions within the same degree categories utilized in earlier tables. The observations regarding women's and black enrollment made above are, in a general way, also applicable here. In 1972 there were only 264 Hispanic/American registrants. By 1987 this had risen to 1,386, up 425%. In that span of years total enrollments rose only 69%. Thus the rate of growth was six times greater, obviously indicating that Hispanic increase cannot be explained simply as a part of the general enrollment increase.

Keep in mind, however, that these 1,386 persons are only 2.5% of seminarians, and this is far below the ratio of Hispanics in the population. We have far to go before Hispanics will cease to be "underrepresented" in theological schools.

The increase of enrollment of +6.8% is encouraging in light of significant efforts on the part of many denominations to support this group in preparation for ministry and for advanced graduate level degrees. This reverses last year's discouraging downward trend. What is of even greater importance is the growth +3% of candidates enrolled in programs ordinarily leading to ordained ministry. Equally important is the 26% growth in those enrolled in graduate level programs leading to the doctorate. Though the total number of students enrolled is relatively small (44), they will begin to respond to the great need of trained personnel for teaching. The proportion of Hispanics in the total student body grew this year to 2.5%. The percentage of ordination candidates for Hispanics (46%) is now close to the ratio of ordination candidates to total enrollment for the total student population (48.9%).

Full details regarding Hispanic student enrollments can be found in Tables C-4, D-4, E-4, F-4, G-4, and H-4, the latter three presenting the data for graduates during the 1986-87 academic year. All of these tables are parallel to those with the same designations in earlier Fact Books, thus facilitating comparisons across a range of years.

[TABLE 17]

Pacific/Asian American Scholars

Pacific/Asian American students are defined as "persons from Asian and Pacific Island ancestry, whether born abroad, in North America, or the trust territories of the Pacific Ocean." These data have been received for the past ten years, beginning in 1977. The summaries for each year can be found in all Fact Books as Tables C-5, D-5, and E-5, with graduation information in the parallel format found in Tables F-5, G-5, and H-5. Observations above regarding other groups are also appropriate here, especially with respect to increased registration. And this is found in all of the degree categories. The role of women is a growing one, as found elsewhere. Their ratio to men is above that found for all students. It should be noted that Pacific/Asians as a group are more likely to be enrolled in graduate academic programs than any other group. There are currently 11.4% of total Pacific/Asian enrollments here, as contrasted with 8.3% of the total student population, 4.3% of Hispanics, 3.8% of blacks, and 7.2% of all women.

The largest concentration of Pacific/Asian students is in the

twenty-two inter-/nondenominational schools which together have 548 enrollees (33.3%). Next in size are the 294 persons (18% of the total) in the six Southern Baptist institutions. Closely grouped are the Methodist (177 or 10.8%), USA Presbyterians (132 or 8%) and US Roman Catholics (112 or 7%). Largest increases were Interdenomination schools +51% and Methodists +33%. Regional distributions are similarly unbalanced. Far West schools (California and Oregon) have 655 of the total, or 39.8%. Next is 364 in the Mid East region (22%). Then comes the Great Lakes region with 210 (13%) and after that Canada with 153 (9.3%).

[TABLE 18]

Native American Enrollment

These are persons of Native American Indian or Inuit origin, and the data have been received for only the last 8 years. Since the numbers are so small, they have not as yet been subjected to data processing, and the information which appears in Table 18 cannot be found among the tables included in the appendices. The table reveals that growth here has been quite slow. The current enrollment of 134 persons represents only 0.24% of the total seminary student registrants. M.Div. enrollment is now 68 persons, 2 less than in 1986. The graduate numbers are quite small. These few persons are distributed across 53 different schools, with the highest registration being 27 Native Americans in one institution. There were 16 graduates this year, 11 of whom received the M.Div. With the growth in enrollment that number is increasing.

Changes in Numbers of Graduates

Table 19 reports the numbers of persons receiving degrees which the Association has designated as "professional." First among these is, of course, the Master of Divinity, the degree accepted by most church bodies as the appropriate preparation for ordained ministry. From 1969 to 1980 there was a modest, but nevertheless, steady increase in the numbers of M.Div. graduates year by year with only a few exceptions. Since then, the number has varied little, except that the decline of M.Div. enrollment over the past three years is now reflected in the smaller group of graduates.

During the past five years, M.Div. enrollment has declined by -0.9%. The number of M.Div. graduates has declined even more rapidly -1.2%. If we subtract the six new schools which joined the Association in 1986, the total decrease in M.Div. graduates in the five years since 1982 would have been -6.8%. Similarly, the decrease in M.Div. enrollment would have been -2.1%. Apart from the number of noncompletions, some of the decrease of graduates may reflect the growing percentage of part-time students who take more than the basic three years to complete the M.Div.

We can observe a similar phenomenon in reports for the D.Min. program. There was little change in the number of graduates this year. Overall, the period 1981-87 reflects a stable number of D.Min. graduates. At the same time, there has been a slow growth in D.Min. enrollments of 5.8% from 1981 to 1987. The slowing down of the dramatic growth in enrollment up to 1980 is reflected in the more stable numbers of graduates over the past 7 years. When we add the complicating factor of D.Min. "projects" which can be completed in a varying number of years in a given program depending on the motivation of the candidate and the constraints of full-time ministerial engagement, we can understand why a relatively stable pattern of graduates will still involve fluctuating data.

The results for the one- and two-year degree are in contrast with the above observations. With but one exception (1972-73) there has been a steady increase in numbers of graduates from these programs. The steady growth in enrollment in the M.A. programs is now fully reflected in the increase of graduates.

[TABLE 20]

Table 20 provides parallel information for the graduation data among the several doctoral degrees. The doctorate in religious education is a rather small enterprise, limited to only a few schools. And the graduation data illustrate this restricted existence. The largest graduating group was 29 persons (1986-87), with only 19 in 1985-86. The range has been from a low of 6 to a high of 29. Th.D./S.T.D. data can be misleading, since this is merely another name for the Ph.D. in some institutions. (The former days when the Ph.D. was awarded only by universities and the Th.D./S.T.D. only by free-standing seminaries no longer prevail. And some free-standing schools during the period reported in Table 20 have simply changed the name of the existing degree, making for further confusion in using these data.) Nonetheless, even with the limited Th.D./S.T.D. enrollments, reported above in Table 7, last year the Th.D. graduates were 52 persons. Graduates since 1982 have averaged about 50. The enrollments in the years 1978 to 1987 ranged only from 437 to 523. This year's 1987 enrollment of 496 represents a +7.6% increase from the previous year.

Graduates with the Ph.D. are also reported in Table 20. The same type of fluctuation prevails there also. Ph.D. recipients in the last 7 years have been, successively, 230, 363, 259, 236, 294, 276, and 278. The large number (363) in 1981-82 may be simply a one-year experience which does not readily lend itself to explanation, and it probably should not be utilized in any efforts to discern trends in Ph.D. production. Enrollments in the Ph.D. have risen substantially in the last years (up 21.3% since 1982).

As indicated at the outset of this chapter in Table 1, there has been (with the exception of the last three years) a steady and substantial increase in the number of students enrolled across the years, accompanied by a much smaller increase in the number of member schools. Average enrollment has risen from 175.38 per school in 1969 to 277.4 in 1987. Table 21 reports those changes in terms of the 5 size distributions utilized by the Fact Book and reports the changing percentages of schools in each size group and the percentage of students enrolled in each group. As one might expect, the most startling data are in the smallest and largest size categories. In 1969 there were 25 schools (14.7%) with 50 or fewer students, and 2.5% of all students were enrolled in these 25 institutions. Despite an 18.2% increase in the number of schools, by 1987 there were only 12 institutions with 50 or less students (down to 6% of total institutions), enrolling only 0.7% of total students. Thus, although smaller schools continue to exist, their numbers continually decrease, and they serve a rapidly diminishing percentage of the total student population.

At the opposite end of the size scale precisely reversed results are evident. In 1969 only 11 institutions registered over 500 persons. This rose to 24 in 1987. And the ratio of total institutions which these 24 comprise rose from 6.5% to 11.9%. Similar dramatic changes are apparent

in the students served. Those 11 seminaries in 1969 were enrolling about one-fourth (26.2%) of all students. The 24 in 1987 registered over two-fifths (44.0%) of the students. And, as will be discussed later in this volume, they provide education for 44.0% of the students while spending only 33.9% of the total theological school expenditures.

The reader will find similar data for the three middle size categories by studying Table 21. This table was prepared from information contained in Tables C or C-1 for the Fact Books in each of the years cited.

## NUMBER AND DISTRIBUTION OF PERSONNEL

[TABLE 22]

Tables O through V in this and earlier Fact Books provide the detailed information about theological schools' professional employees. Since the tables have maintained their precisely parallel nature across the years, it is possible to make very accurate comparisons from year to year. The customary distributions by size and status, denomination, and region are included.

Table 22 is a summary of this information regarding administrators, faculty, and librarians for selected years since fall 1970. The table reports the total number of persons in each category, the average number per school (to eliminate the effect of constantly changing numbers of member schools), and the percentage of change in the average number per school from the previous year. For purposes of comparison, the same data are provided for student enrollments, permitting ready analysis of total personnel trends (professional employees and students).

This year for the second time, the average number per school of personnel grew more rapidly than the average number of students per school. The growth was concentrated at the level of faculty and it represents a growth of one-third person per school.

In fifteen years since 1972, the average per school enrollment of students has risen by 103 students (58.7%). In the same period the average increase of administrators was 1.4 persons (34%) per school, certainly not excessive given the ever increasing responsibilities of administrators. The increase of full-time faculty was 1.1 persons (9.2%). There was no change in the staffing of libraries, despite the substantial growth in the size of the schools.

In evaluating the increase of full-time instructional staff one should also note the rapid growth of part-time personnel during the same fifteen year period. Part-time faculty increased by 489 FTE persons (+104%) as noted in Table 23. This means an increase from 2.5 FTE part-time faculty per school to 4.8 FTE part-time faculty per school in 1987. If we combine this figure of part-time faculty with full-time faculty, we find an overall growth in faculty of 3.5 persons per school (+24%) in this fifteen year span.

As noted above, Table 23 extends this analysis by examining the role of part-time instructional personnel in seminary teaching. In the period between 1971 and 1987, full-time faculty have increased in total numbers of

persons employed from 2,297 to 2,682 (+16.8%). In that same interval, the part-time persons offering instruction have risen from 1,498 to 3,364 (up +125%). And translated into full-time equivalency, these persons moved from 429 FTE to 957 FTE (+123%). Furthermore, the proportion of total instruction offered by part-time instructors moved from 15.7% of the total to 26.3% this year. All of this means that today about one out of every four classes offered by a theological school is being taught by a person whose relationship to the instructional work of that institution is part time. When compared with the rest of higher education, this is not particularly surprising. However, given the historic reliance of seminaries on full-time staff for all or virtually all of their teaching, it is obviously a new phenomenon. When one considers the move toward extension, off-campus instruction which is characteristic of many seminaries, this trend toward additional part-time staff is probably inevitable. The implications of this trend for the style and quality of theological education merit further study. Table 23 provides the changing picture of this situation across the years.

Tables O through V also provide these data for administrative, faculty, and library personnel distributed across both sex and race categories. Tables 24, 25, and 26 summarize this information and report it from

the several successive Fact Books published annually. The sharp drop of male administrators reported in 1983 was probably attributable to a clarification that year in the instructions for completing the annual report forms, viz., that persons with divided administrative and teaching roles are to be listed as administrators only if more than one-half of their time is devoted thereto. Conversely, if they teach more than one-half time, the proper location for the listing is in faculty data. The number of women administrators (26.3%) is close to the percentage of women students (27.4%), and well ahead of the percentage of full-time women faculty (17.5%).

Table 25 provides parallel information regarding faculty, and these distributions have been received from member schools since 1971. In that year there were only 73 women teaching full time in theological seminaries. Sixteen years later, by 1987, this had risen to 398 women, and the ratio of women to men had grown from but 3.2% to 14.8%. Similar data are found at the bottom of the table for the adjunct or part-time teaching staff who are women. Here the ratio has always been somewhat higher than among the full-time instructors, moving from 6.9% in 1971 to 19.7% this current year, a not quite three-fold increase. The Table 25 data illustrate the fact that the rapid rate of increase among women employed full time does prevail also with the adjunct group.

Table 26 examines this information over a seven-year span and with more precision since it shows changes for each professional position. There was a five percent decrease in the total number of women in administrative roles, (-18 persons). This decrease was the major part of an overall decrease in administrators in ATS Schools, only the third time in sixteen years that we have seen this phenomenon.

Women faculty also continue to increase in numbers as Table 26 indicates. There has been a steady growth in actual numbers for the past six

years with a 5% increase in 1987. The entire increase for the current year will be found among faculty with 10.9% more women employed than in the previous year. Most significant is the growth of +15.7% in the ranks of full-time faculty, a growth distributed over all the ranks. While the increase is strong evidence of the commitment of seminaries to the representation of women in the faculty, the total percentage of women (17.5%) is still below that of women students (27.4%).

The representation of women in administrative positions is down by 18 persons from last year, but the representation of women (26.3%) is closer to that of women students (27.4%). The percentage among administrators has varied little during the past three years.

There was no increase in library staffing this year. Overall, women account for 55.4% of library staff, a percentage which has grown a little over the past seven years. The specific positions and the data in successive years for each are reported over a seven-year span in Table 26.

Table 27 parallels the preceding one in format, but it provides information regarding the employment of blacks among administration, faculty, and library categories. An initial overall glance at the table will indicate there has been a significant increase in the percentage of blacks employed in faculty (34 or +13.7%). There was no significant change for libraries or administration. It is significant that in the overall totals for the three categories the percentage of blacks in relation to the total number increased in 1987 only for faculty (from 4.2% to 4.7%).

## COMPENSATION

Table NN-VV in the appendices provide full details regarding total compensation for professional staff employed in non-Roman Catholic institutions. Staff in Roman Catholic schools have been eliminated from these averages because of the "contributed services" aspect of compensation and the variety of ways this is treated in the Canadian and United States Catholic member schools. Please note that the amounts listed are total compensation, not just cash salary paid. Total compensation includes cash salary, housing allowance (if any) or rental value of housing provided, institutional payments for fringe benefits (insurance, etc.), and the institutional contribution to pensions. Compensation for administrative staff is for a twelve-month period, while faculty compensation is for nine months (the regular academic year). Extra compensation, such as summer school salaries, is not included in these quotations.

Readers interested in the full details should study the appendices of this and earlier Fact Books with care. It will be evident from such an analysis that there is considerable variety in patterns of compensation. Two total compensation amounts which are very similar way, in fact, have considerable variation in the components. Some institutions choose to pay larger cash salaries and provide little in fringe benefits or only very modest pension support. Other schools, providing much the same total compensation, may have a considerably lower cash salary but offer extensive benefits in insurance, family medical coverage, educational allowances for children, and substantial contributions to pension plans. Therefore, the reader must be very careful when comparing "salaries" to be certain that the entire package of cash and the value of other benefits has been included in the evaluation. Trends in the kinds of compensation packages have not been analyzed, but could be of some interest.

Inflation has been a major factor for the past several years in its impact on compensation patterns. Hence, one must take it into account when evaluating the progress of remuneration. While total compensation has been steadily rising, year after year, the rate of growth has often failed to match the increase in the cost of living index. During the high inflation years professional staff in schools of theology fell further behind each year in maintaining pace with the cost of living rise. After a number of years in which inflation hovered at the "double digit" level (+13.2%, 9.5%, 6.5% for eight, seven, and six years ago, respectively), it has dropped sharply in the last five years (+2.4%, +4.1%, +3.6%, 1.6% and 3.9%). Hence, while compensation growth during the double-digit years always fell substantially below the index, during the last five years there has been significant recovery from these losses. All of the tables included in the text have been designed to show the impact of inflation on the rising salaries. In contrast, the tables found in the appendices do not reflect adjustments for inflation, and they should be used with care.

Administrative Compensation

Table 28 summarizes the data for each administrative position for the past 5 years. This information is taken from Table NN in the appendices of this and earlier editions. Tables OO and PP provide this same information distributed by denomination and by region/highest degree offered categories. Among the accredited schools, all nine positions, with the exception of registrars, received compensation increases in excess of the cost of living growth. Overall accredited administrative staff increases were +2.3% over the inflation index.

Table 28 also includes data for administrative personnel in candidate and associate member institutions, designated collectively as "other." Here three of the positions received real losses, while all of the others exhibit increases in excess of the +3.9% inflationary factor. As a group these administrative personnel received lower increases in compensation than those experienced by the accredited schools (+6.2% and +3%, respectively). When reviewing the financial data for the grouping of "other schools", it is well to keep in mind the heavy turnover in the composition of the non-accredited group as new schools join the ATS as associate members and as others move up to accredited status. This can and frequently does yield annual statistical fluctuations such as will not be found among the accredited schools. The trend over several years is more significant.

#### Faculty Compensation

The same detailed information regarding faculty total compensation is provided in Tables 29-34. Total compensation includes cash salary, housing allowance, value of fringe benefits, and school contribution to pension. 1982-83 was the first time since 1976-77 that faculty compensation had matched the rise in the cost of living. That achievement was repeated again in 1983, 1984, 1985 and 1986 for accredited schools. The same obtained for the candidate and associate "other schools" with the exception of 1984 (-2.4%) and 1986 (-6.9%) in which faculty suffered a decrease in income adjusted for the cost of living. In 1987 both accredited and "other schools" experienced a decrease in adjusted income of -1.3% and -1.5% respectively. We remind the reader again to look at longer term trends in the latter grouping because of the relatively rapid turnover in the composition of the group.

Faculty salaries for accredited schools have almost reached comparability with 1969-70 when ATS first began to gather these data. Faculty salaries had suffered dramatically because of high inflation in the late 1970's and early 1980's. Faculty salaries for "other schools" are still 18.5% short of comparability with 1969. The tables in the text have been designed to illustrate the impact of inflation quite clearly. Tables 29 and 32 report the dollar amounts of compensation for seven successive years. Tables 30 and 33 translate these sums into percentages of dollar change. Tables 31 and 34 apply the effect of inflation to these percentages, providing the net real change in compensation after inflation. The first three tables (Tables 29-31) are for the accredited schools, the latter three tables (Tables 32-34) for candidate and associate institutions. Full details are in the appendices, including faculty compensation data distributed by denomination (Table RR), region, and highest degree offered (Table SS).

#### Library Staff Compensation

Table 35 summarizes the data for library staff compensation across the past 4 years. Full details are available in Tables TT, UU, and VV in the appendices. Accredited school library staff are receiving an additional

+7.1% in compensation during 1987-88, indicating that they have enjoyed salary increases in excess of inflation for the past three years. Library staff in other candidate and associate schools increased by +9.8%, reversing last year's -8% decrease. For associate and candidate schools, the three year gain is 37%. The changing composition of this group with the advance of many to accredited status and the advent of new schools helps to account for the annual fluctuation.

Summary

The preceding tables provide compensation amounts and comparisons only across a few recent years. The Association of Theological Schools began to receive and publish these data in the 1969-70 academic year, a time when the excessive inflationary experiences of the 1970s had not yet begun. Hence a summary table reporting the situation with respect to compensation comparisons across those eighteen years may give the reader a better perspective on the economic condition of professional staff today, as contrasted with the base line year. Table 36 provides this information in summary fashion for administrative, faculty, and library staff in both accredited and other school categories. In that period the consumer price index has risen by 209%, a tremendous rate of growth. Professional employees in theological schools in every category suffered substantial losses during the years of high inflation. Now with salaries generally increasing over the past five years at a rate over the rate of inflation, most categories are closer to a level of comparability to the CPI index for 1969-70. The exception is the salaries of faculty in associate and candidate "other schools" who are well below the eighteen year inflation rate. An exception in the other direction is the salary of library personnel in non-accredited schools who had by far the lowest salary in 1969-70 and whose salaries have commendably advanced beyond the inflation rate.

Table 37 supplements this information, by confining the data to the last seven years. In this period the cumulative inflationary rate has been

+37.5%. The gains of the past seven years exceed this growth. The poorest record during the seven years was recorded for "other school" faculty.

Additional compensation growth in excess of inflation will be necessary to bring most salaries back to their 1969-70 relationship with the consumer price index. Nonetheless, with the exception of faculty in "other schools", salaries are moving closer to the level of comparability with 1969-70. Administrative staff salaries in accredited schools are still 4% short of comparability. In non-accredited schools, they fall 4.8% short of comparability. Faculty, however, in "other schools" (candidate-associate) fell 18.5% short of comparability. Faculty in accredited schools fall only 2% short of comparability. The above average increase in salaries for librarians should be seen in the light of the very low starting salaries eighteen years ago.

## FINANCES -- REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES

Tables AA-JJ provide the overall financial information for the ATS schools of theology for the academic year 1982-83. The reader can find these in the appendices. There are two sets of tables supplied. Each table includes the appropriate dollar amounts, the ratio of educational and general revenue/expenditure which that represents (stated as a percentage), and the calculated per student sum. As noted, the tables with the suffix -1 provide the student data on a "head count" basis. Those with a -2 suffix utilize the "full-time equivalency" (FTE) enrollment. In some groupings, especially where there are large numbers of part-time students, the per student costs will differ quite markedly. This information is provided this year for the sixth successive year, and tables in this and the preceding five Fact Books are parallel and may be used directly to arrive at comparisons, subject to the exception noted below.

The 1983-84 Fact Book explained at length (pp. 52-55) the salutary effects of a change in the instructions for the Annual Report Forms which has served to limit the instances of "double-counting" of student aid income. The reader is referred to those pages for a full explanation. The old procedure inflated the total revenue and yielded paper surpluses which did not exist in reality. The good effects of the change in procedure have been verified in the following years.

### [TABLE 38]

Table 38 summarizes the total financial data reported again this year under the newer instructions. Please observe the footnote to the table. The change in reporting methodology no longer permits any claim of precise comparability with all previous years. With the newer methodology, 1983-87 data are comparable to 1982-83 data, but these four years are no longer precisely comparable to previous years. The newer data, however, are more accurate than the data of earlier years. Table 38 reveals an increase of total revenue for 1986-87 of 6.1%, together with a rise in expenditure of 7.3%. The exceptionally small 1982-83 revenue increase (2.1%) probably reflects the correction for student aid income which had often been double counted as revenue in previous years.

This is the first year since 1974-75 that we have seen a deficit in the overall operations of theological schools. The deficit is relatively small (-0.7%) which is only \$1,701 per school or \$9 per FTE student. Nonetheless, it signals a need to monitor carefully the overall budget. Both revenue (+6.1%) and expenditures (+7.3%) exceeded the CPI (+3.9%) for the previous year. But expenditures rose more rapidly than revenues. Worth noting is the growth in faculty with a declining student body which will affect tuition income. Also worth noting is that the deficit for accredited schools was located entirely in auxiliary enterprises, whereas for associate/candidate schools it was in the educational and general expenditures.

The data indicate a growing deficit in auxiliary enterprise expenditures during the past three years per FTE student. This deficit occurred only for the accredited schools and has grown from \$60 per FTE in 1983-84 to \$104 per FTE in 1985-86. In 1986-87 it declined to -\$78 per FTE student. Auxiliary enterprise as a category includes charges levied for food, housing, bookstore, etc. Management attention must be given to this trend lest it constitute a heavy drain on revenue.

the bottom of the revenue and expenditure categories. The average increase in revenue last year of +6.1% is less than the +7.3% increase in expenditures. Accredited schools, however, increased revenues by +7.7% and expenditures by +8.9%. Non-accredited schools increased revenues by +0.9% and held expenditures to a +3.4% growth.

Note also the student aid rows for both. Student aid as a revenue

category has been eliminated totally. The \$647 per student in student aid within accredited schools during 1981-82 became zero in 1982-83 and thereafter. This does not mean that contributions designated for student aid disappeared. They continue as in the past. However, they are now reported in terms of source: endowment proceeds, gifts, or grants. This makes student aid income parallel to all other income, designated and otherwise. The student aid expenditure line reveals the extent by which some member institutions were unable to comply with the new reporting. \$274 per student (in accredited schools) and \$133 per student (in the other schools) could not be subjected to the netting process used by most institutions.

The reader will also want to examine the revenue/expenditure totals for both the accredited and the non-accredited schools. The surplus/deficit per FTE student for accredited schools was: +\$141 for 1983-84; +\$123 for 1984-85; +\$124 for 1985-86; -\$6 for 1987. For associate/candidate schools the surplus/deficit was: -\$58 for 1983-84; +\$30 for 1984-85; +\$155 for 1985-86; -\$52 for 1987.

Of significance for strategic planning are the percentages of the several line items of revenue/expenditures in relation to the Educational and General totals. For accredited schools in 1986-87, tuition was 22% of revenue; for "other" it was 31%. Endowment for accredited schools accounted for 24% of revenue; for "other" it was 5%. Gifts and grants for accredited schools were 44% of revenue; for other schools, 52%.

Administrative costs for accredited schools were 32% of expenditures; for "other" 31%. Instructional costs were 46% of expenditures; for "others" 49%. Library costs for accredited schools were 9% of educational and general expenditures; for other schools 8%

One final observation and explanation from last year's Fact Book bears repeating. "The discerning reader will detect a substantial increase in educational and general revenue in the 1983-84 Fact Book when compared with earlier editions. One must not be misled by this increase, since it is more apparent than real. Previously the Association segregated student aid outside the educational and general category, both on the revenue and expenditure side. This has been eliminated, but only as an item of revenue. Hence revenue designated as student aid now appears within educational and general. It continues to be excluded from that category of expenditure, an arbitrary decision of the Association related to its procedures for assessing dues. Hence, if one wants to understand the full financial picture of a seminary, total revenues must be compared with total expenditures. One can no longer draw conclusions regarding fiscal health merely by examining educational and general revenue and expenditures."

Full details on all of these matters are available in the appendices, Tables AA-1 through JJ-2. As noted they must be read with care when compared with the same tables in previous Fact Books.

## Gifts and Grants Income

This is the fifth year in which Gift and Grant Income has been collected on the D-1 Forms. This is the fourth year in which the tables WW-1 through WW-7 have been published to provide detailed information on sources of gift income. The number of schools reporting in this category of income has grown from 169 in 1984 to 188 in 1987. The number of schools able to complete the forms appears to have stabilized at about 190. Several schools are unable to complete the D-1 Forms because Gifts and Grants are commingled with a university or college. The distribution of gifts and grants according to the several categories listed in the forms has improved to allow us to note trends. Nonetheless, the reader will note that some of the substantial variations occurring from one year to the next in a given category may well reflect a differing practice on the part of certain schools as to what income is reported for example in the category of the annual fund, or in the category of regional church rather than local church.

The following statistics are based on a comparison of income reported on Table WW-1 for 1986-87 by comparison with 1985-86. This table analyzes the average size of endowment, the annual fund, and income from the national, regional, or local denominational sources. It breaks this down according to the size of the school in the five standard categories of under 50, 51-150, 151-300, 301-500, and over 500. While the data are interesting, many schools will find the data on Tables WW-2 to WW-7 more helpful in that they record the distribution of such income by denominational grouping which are also probably more dependable.

The average size of endowment has grown over the past year by +2.1%. This reflects a strong commitment to increasing endowment even in the face of the declining market values. Schools with an enrollment under 50 experienced a growth of +27.8%; 51-150, +2.4%; 151-300, +2.5%; 301-500, -6.6%; over 500, -5.2%. The number of schools reporting this year was 156.

The average size of the Annual Fund grew by 13.8%. This growth was anything but equally distributed among the size categories of schools. Schools under 50 in enrollment experienced a growth of +6.2%; 51-150, +1.6%; 151-300, -10.6%; 301-500, +19.6%; over 500, +7.3%. The number of schools reporting in this category was 138.

The variations in contributions from the national, regional, and local churches for the past two years are interesting to observe. Contributions from the national denomination for schools with an enrollment under 50 were down -0.8%; 51-150, +8.1%; 151-300, -24%; 301-500, +9%; over 500, +14.6%.

Contributions from regional denominational sources for schools with an enrollment under 50 were up +33%; 51-150, +3.4%; 151-300, +18.2%; 301-500, -29.4%; over 500, -2.8%.

Income from local denominational sources for schools with enrollment under 50 was down -13% from the previous year; 51-150, +2.8%; 151-300, -4.4%; 301-500, -18.4%; over 500, -12.2%.
