

#### **CHART 1: Enrollment by Gender and Degree Program**



















#### CHART 4: Age Range, Marital Status, and Gender








## CHART 5: Age Range and Racial Identity






#### CHART 7A: Educational Debt Brought by All Students






#### CHART 7B: Educational Debt Incurred at Seminary for All Students






### CHART 8A: Educational Debt Brought by Full-time Students






### CHART 8B: Educational Debt Incurred at Seminary by Full-time Students














## CHART 19: Effectiveness of Field Education in Developing Capacities




#### **By Degree**






#### CHART 21: Overall Experience during Theological Program

#### **CHART 23: Position Expected after Graduation for All Students**



#### **CHART 24: Position Expected after Graduation for MDiv Students**








