













## CHART 4: Age Range, Marital Status, and Gender









## CHART 5: Age Range and Racial Identity








#### CHART 7A: Educational Debt Brought by All Students






## CHART 8A: Educational Debt Brought by Full-time Students













### **CHART 17: Three Most Important Influences on Educational Experience**









CHART 20: Level of Satisfaction with School's Services and Academic Resources






